The KING has been graciously opleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry dis-played in flying operations against the enemy: —

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Pilot Officer Arthur William Burley (147201), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 75 (N.Z.) Air Force Squadron.

One night in August, 1943, this officer piloted an aircraft detailed to attack Turin. During the flight, in an engagement against an enemy fighter, one of the bomber's engines was rendered unserviceable. In spite of this Pilot Officer Burley flew on to the far distant target and bombed it successfully, afterwards piloting the damaged air-craft to base. This officer is an outstanding captain whose skill and tenacity have been noteworthy.

Pilot Officer Gordon Roger HEWLETT (N.Z.415847), Royal New Zealand Air Force, No. 10 Squadron. One night in August, 1943, this officer captained an aircraft detailed for an operation against Nuremburg. During the outward flight one of the engines became unserviceable. Some height was lost but Pilot Officer Hewlett flew on to the target and ultimately bombed it, afterwards piloting the aircraft back to this country. The bomber was rapidly losing height as the English coast was crossed but Pilot Officer Hewlett effected a successful landing at the nearest airfield. This officer, who has completed many sorties, has invariably displayed great determination and devotion to duty devotion to duty.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flying Officer Robert Vincent Sweeny (84580) Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 224 Squadron.

These members of aircraft crew have taken part in several attacks on U-boats and have displayed great skill and fine fighting qualities. On the last of these occasions, Flying Officer Sweeny executed his attack in the face of heavy opposing fire. Despite this, he succeeded in straddling the vessel with his depth charges which blew the bow high out of the water and caused the vessel to sink high out of the water and caused the vessel to sink stern foremost, leaving wreckage and oil amidst a foaming patch on the sea. During the action, Flying Officer Sweeny's aircraft was damaged and I engine became unserviceable. The aircraft lost

height almost to sea level but all movable equip-ment was jettisoned and sufficient height was gained to enable Flying Officer Sweeny to fly the aircraft to base. He displayed outstanding skill and resolution. During the action, Flight Sergeant Graham and Sergeant Graham executed their tasks with great coolness and rendered valuable assistance to their captain in very trying circumstances.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

- 740774 Sergeant Alan Walter WHITMARSH, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 10 Squadron.
 - This airman was the captain of an aircraft detailed to attack Mannheim one night in August, 1943. When nearing the target area, one of the bomber's engines became useless. The aircraft gradually lost height but Sergeant Whitmarsh flew on to the target and bombed it. During the return flight the aircraft continued to lose height but base was reached safely where Sergeant Whitmarsh effected a masterly landing.
