2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 1st November, 1943, to Saturday, the 6th November, 1943, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates different dates.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Rills are to be dated Bills are to be dated.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 20 of the Finance (No. 2) Act, 1940, entitled the Purchase Tax (Alteration of Rates) (No. 2) Order, 1943, directing that as from the 1st November, 1943, the purchase tax on woven figured counterpanes weighing not less than seven ounces per square yard and made wholly of cotton (including cotton waste) shall be reduced from 100 per
