The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the VICTORIA CROSS on the under-mentioned officer in recognition of most conspicuous bravery:—

Flying Officer Lloyd Allan TRIGG, D.F.C. (N.Z.413515), Royal New Zealand Air Force (missing, believed killed), No. 200 Squadron.

Flying Officer Trigg had rendered outstanding service on convoy escort and anti-submarine duties. He had completed 46 operational sorties and had invariably displayed skill and courage of a very high order.

One day in August, 1943, Flying Officer Trigg undertook, as captain and pilot, a patrol in a Liberator although he had not previously made any operational sorties in that type of aircraft. After searching for 8 hours a surfaced U-boat was sighted.

Flying Officer Trigg immediately prepared to attack. During the approach, the aircraft received many hits from the submarine's anti-aircraft guns and burst into flames, which quickly enveloped the tail.

The moment was critical. Flying Officer Trigg could have broken off the engagement and made a forced landing in the sea. But if he continued the attack, the aircraft would present a "no deflection" target to deadly accurate anti-aircraft fire, and every second spent in the air would increase the extent and intensity of the flames and diminish his chances of survival.

There could have been no hesitation or doubt in his mind. He maintained his course in spite of the already precarious condition of his aircraft and executed a masterly attack. Skimming over the U-boat at less than 50 feet with anti-aircraft fire entering his opened bomb doors, Flying Officer Trigg dropped his bombs on and around the U-boat where they exploded with devastating effect. A short distance further on the Liberator dived into the sea with her gallant captain and crew.

The U-boat sank within 20 minutes and some of her crew were picked up later in a rubber dinghy that had broken loose from the Liberator.

The Battle of the Atlantic has yielded many fine stories of air attacks on underwater craft, but Flying Officer Trigg's exploit stands out as an epic of grim determination and high courage. His was the path of duty that leads to glory.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Distinguished Service Order.

Acting Wing Commander Douglas Rivers BAGNALL, D.F.C. (40790), Reserve of Air Force Officers, No. 40 Squadron.

This officer is a most inspiring leader, whose great skill, fearlessness and unswerving devotion to duty have been reflected in the high morale of the squadron, which has obtained many notable successes. One night in September, 1943, Wing Commander Bagnall participated in an attack on the marshalling yards at Battipaglia and his accurate bombing was a feature of his praiseworthy efforts. This officer has rendered magnificent service.

Squadron Leader Derek Harvey DUDER, D.F.C. (70192), Reserve of Air Force Officers, No. 77 Squadron.

Since being awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, this officer has completed many sorties. He has attacked his targets fearlessly and vigorously and thereby has achieved much success. Squadron Leader Duder is an ideal leader, whose example of sustained gallantry and devotion to duty has merited the highest praise.

Squadron Leader Peter Geoffrey POWELL (Can/J. 8817), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 405 (R.C.A.F.) Squadron.

Squadron Leader Powell is a navigator whose unerring skill has contributed in a large way to the success achieved on many sorties, including the recent heavy attacks on Peenemunde and Berlin. In addition to his operational tasks, Squadron Leader Powell has rendered yeoman service in the training of other navigators and his excellent work has been reflected in their numerous successes. This gallant officer has set an inspiring example.

Acting Squadron Leader Donald Kenneth ALLPORT, D.F.C. (119516), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 35 Squadron.

As navigator, this officer has participated in a large number of sorties, many of them demanding a high degree of skill and determination. Nevertheless, Squadron Leader Allport has executed his tasks with exceptional ability and his faultless

work has contributed in a large measure to the successes obtained. His achievements are worthy of the highest praise.

Acting Squadron Leader Edward Lister **IFOULD**, D.F.C. (Aus.402278), Royal Australian Air Force, No. 109 Squadron.

Since being awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross, Squadron Leader Ifould has taken part in a large number of sorties, most of which have been against targets in the Ruhr and in the Rhineland. He is a navigator of high merit, whose brilliant efforts and outstanding devotion to duty have been worthy of the highest praise. Squadron Leader Ifould has also devoted much energy towards the training of other navigators with good results. This officer has rendered outstanding service.

Acting Squadron Leader John **TURNBULL**, D.F.C. (77980), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 109 Squadron.

This officer has completed a very large number of sorties and throughout has displayed navigational skill of the highest standard. He has at all times shown outstanding determination and his record of successes is an excellent tribute to his faultless work. His example has been highly commendable.

Acting Flight Lieutenant William John **SENGER**, D.F.C. (Can/J.17203), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 7 Squadron.

This officer has completed a very large number of sorties, involving attacks on a wide range of enemy targets. He has displayed skill of a high order, while his unflinching determination to inflict loss on the enemy has been a noteworthy feature of his work. Flight Lieutenant Senger is a model of efficiency and his gallant example has proved a rare source of encouragement.

Flight Lieutenant John Howard **TURNBULL**, D.F.C. (Can/J.6211), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 600 Squadron.

Bar to Distinguished Flying Medal.

1186762 Flight Sergeant Cecil Frank James **FOWLER**, D.F.M., Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 600 Squadron.

As pilot and observer respectively, this officer and airman have displayed outstanding skill in operations at night and have destroyed 10 enemy aircraft. They have displayed exceptional keenness and determination, setting an example of the highest order.

Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Flight Lieutenant William Ivan Hartley **MAGUIRE**, D.F.C. (80455), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 154 Squadron.

Flight Lieutenant Maguire is a relentless and skilful pilot. He has at all times displayed great keenness to engage the enemy. He has destroyed 12 enemy aircraft in combat.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader Edgar Charles **BADCOE** (6600r), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 77 Squadron.

Squadron Leader Badcoe has undertaken very many sorties involving attacks on important and well defended targets. He has invariably displayed great keenness and enterprise and his successes have been proved by the many excellent photographs he has obtained. One night in October, 1943, he piloted an aircraft detailed to attack Frankfurt. In spite of much difficulty, which occurred in the early stages of the flight, Squadron Leader Badcoe went on to complete his mission. This officer is an inspiring leader, whose courageous example has won great praise.

Acting Squadron Leader John Sidney **SHORTHOUSE** (36251), Royal Air Force, No. 44 Squadron.

This officer was the captain of an aircraft detailed to attack Mannheim one night in September, 1943. Whilst many miles from the target, one of the bomber's engines caught fire. The propeller was feathered, however, and the flames died away. Although the engine was useless, Squadron Leader Shorthouse flew on to the target and bombed it. He displayed great determination which has been such a noteworthy feature of the many sorties he has undertaken. Squadron Leader Shorthouse is an extremely efficient and gallant flight commander.

Captain Ivor Norman Lawrence **TAYLOR** (205516), South African Air Force, No. 40 Squadron.

In September, 1943, this officer located a large enemy camp, with its lines of armoured cars, some 25 miles from one of our forward airfields. In the face of intense anti-aircraft fire, Captain Taylor flew over the encampment at a height of only 50 feet to complete his reconnaissance. He returned to base and afterwards led a bomber force to the target which was attacked with great success. Captain Taylor displayed outstanding gallantry and devotion to duty and his example was worthy of the highest praise.

Flying Officer John Charles Kennedy **FABIAN** (N.Z.413720), Royal New Zealand Air Force, No. 75 (N.Z.) Squadron.

Flying Officer Fabian is a navigator of outstanding ability and his skilful efforts have contributed materially to the success of many sorties on which he has flown. He has taken part in attacks on a wide variety of targets, including Hamburg, Berlin and several industrial centres in the Ruhr. Flying Officer Fabian has displayed great determination and devotion to duty.

Flying Officer Desmond Baker Fearon **HESLOP** (129549), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 44 Squadron.

As navigator, this officer has participated in very many sorties and throughout his tour has displayed skill and determination of a high standard. His excellent qualities were amply demonstrated during an attack on Peenemunde when his aircraft was severely damaged by enemy action. In spite of great difficulty, Flying Officer Heslop executed his duties admirably and contributed greatly to the safe return of the aircraft. Flying Officer Heslop has devoted much effort towards the training of navigators with good results.

Flying Officer Basil George Deleyal **JACKSON** (Can/J.21204), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 429 (R.C.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer has undertaken several sorties and has set a high example of tenacity and devotion to duty. These qualities were well evident on a recent occasion in an attack on Kassel. Soon after bombing the target, his aircraft was hit by shell-fire. The windscreen was shattered and Flying Officer Jackson was injured about the face. His vision was impaired by particles of glass and blood from his facial injuries which filled his eyes. In spite of considerable pain and difficulty, Flying Officer Jackson flew his aircraft to base. His example was most encouraging.

Flying Officer Hubert Parry **JEFFREYS** (127973), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 102 Squadron.

One night in August, 1943, this officer was the navigator of an aircraft which attacked Munchen-Gladbach. During the operation the bomber was extensively damaged in an encounter with an enemy fighter. In harassing circumstances, Flying Officer Jeffreys displayed great skill and coolness, rendering material assistance to his captain during the homeward flight. This officer has participated in very many sorties and has proved himself to be a most dependable member of aircraft crew.

Flying Officer Raymond Howitt **MARSHALL** (133703), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 44 Squadron.

Flying Officer Marshall has participated in numerous sorties and has displayed praiseworthy keenness and devotion to duty throughout. One night in August, 1943, he was air bomber of an aircraft which attacked Berlin. Soon after the bombs had been released, the aircraft was hit by machine-gun fire from a fighter. Some damage was sustained, while the mid-upper and rear gunners were wounded. Displaying commendable initiative, Flying Officer Marshall promptly manned the mid-upper turret and used its guns most effectively to drive off an enemy aircraft which was rapidly closing in. This officer set a highly encouraging example in perilous circumstances.

Flying Officer Frederick **WRIGHT** (123682), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 218 Squadron.

As wireless operator/air gunner, this officer has completed very many sorties, including 3 attacks on Berlin. He is an extremely efficient and dependable member of aircraft crew, whose example of devotion to duty has been an inspiration to others.

Pilot Officer Robert **ATKINSON** (148110), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 166 Squadron.

This officer has undertaken many sorties and has displayed skill and determination on all occasions.

One night in October, 1943, he captained an aircraft detailed to attack Munich. Whilst over the target area, the bomber was subjected to fierce anti-aircraft fire whilst illuminated by the searchlights. Nevertheless, Pilot Officer Atkinson held to his course and executed a successful bombing run. He is an inspiring captain.

Pilot Officer Albert Harry MOORES (149620), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 57 Squadron.

This officer has completed a large number of sorties, including attacks on such strongly defended targets as Berlin, Hamburg and industrial centres in the Ruhr. He has displayed great skill and determination throughout and his efforts have been worthy of the highest praise. On one occasion his aircraft sustained extensive damage when attacked by a fighter. In spite of this, Pilot Officer Moores skilfully out-maneuvred the attacker and afterwards flew his damaged aircraft to base. His tenacity was highly commendable.

Pilot Officer Michael William NESBITT (155023), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 623 Squadron.

As pilot, this officer has completed many sorties against important enemy targets. Undaunted by the fiercest opposition, he has attacked his targets fearlessly and with great determination. His courageous and confident example is worthy of high praise.

Warrant Officer Reginald Paul RABETT (1317004), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 166 Squadron (since deceased).

Warrant Officer Rabett was the pilot of an aircraft detailed to attack Ludwigshafen one night in October, 1943. On the outward flight, whilst many miles from the target, one of the bomber's engines became useless. Some height was lost but, displaying a fine fighting spirit, Warrant Officer Rabett continued to the target and bombed it. This officer has always endeavoured to press home his attacks with great vigour.

Flying Officer John Thompson HUTCHINSON (141812), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 138 Squadron.

Pilot Officer Borden Carrick DENNISON (Can./J.16008) Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 405 (R.C.A.F.) Squadron.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

1004784 Flight Sergeant William Henry MARSHALL, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 138 Squadron.

In air operations, these officers and airman have displayed skill, courage and fortitude of a high order.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Warrant Officer John Edwin THOMAS (1028690), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 166 Squadron.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

625920 Sergeant Arthur Victor COLLINS, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 166 Squadron.

Warrant Officer Thomas and Sergeant Collins were pilot and mid-upper gunner respectively of an aircraft detailed to attack Hanover one night in October, 1943. Whilst over the target area, the aircraft was attacked by a fighter. The bomber was repeatedly hit by cannon shells and sustained some damage but Warrant Officer Thomas held to his course and bombed the target. Meanwhile, Sergeant Collins directed his efforts towards extinguishing a fire which had started in the fuselage and, after a gallant effort, succeeded in so doing. One of the bomber's engines was useless but Warrant Officer Thomas flew on with great confidence. Whilst crossing the enemy coast the aircraft sustained further damage by fire from the ground defences. When nearing the English coast a second engine became useless. Nevertheless, Warrant Officer Thomas reached an airfield and effected a safe landing. This pilot displayed exceptional skill, great courage and tenacity, while Sergeant Collins set a splendid example of coolness and gallantry in harassing circumstances.

Conspicuous Gallantry Medal (Flying).

Warrant Officer Arthur Joseph Samuel WALKER (1380714), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 10 Squadron.

1040284 Flight Sergeant Stanley MAYER, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 101 Squadron.

This warrant officer and airman were pilot and flight engineer respectively of an aircraft detailed to attack Hanover one night in September, 1943. In the run-up to the target, the bomber was illuminated by the searchlights and subjected to heavy anti-aircraft fire, while immediately afterwards it was attacked by an enemy fighter. The aircraft was repeatedly hit and sustained serious damage. One of its engines was set alight but, with great coolness, Warrant Officer Walker went into a steep dive and thus evaded the fighter, whilst the force of the wind extinguished the flames. Meanwhile, a fire had started amidships. Flight Sergeant Mayer, displaying great gallantry and promptitude, made strenuous efforts to prevent the flames from spreading. He succeeded in getting the outbreak under control before he was overcome by the fumes. He was dragged clear, however, and the fire was afterwards extinguished. The situation was very serious but, undaunted, Warrant Officer Walker went on to release his bombs on the target. Displaying superb airmanship, this gallant and resolute pilot flew his crippled bomber to this country where he effected a safe landing in appalling weather. Throughout the return flight, Flight Sergeant Mayer rendered material assistance, while his exemplary conduct in the face of imminent dangers was beyond praise.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

1337671 Flight Sergeant Stanley Percy CLARK, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 620 Squadron.

1201264 Sergeant Alfred William DOWSETT, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 620 Squadron.

Flight Sergeant Clark and Sergeant Dowsett were pilot and mid-upper gunner respectively of an aircraft detailed to attack Frankfurt one night in October, 1943. Shortly after the bombs had been released on the target, the aircraft was attacked by a fighter whilst illuminated in the searchlights. The bomber was hit by the enemy's machine gun fire, sustaining much damage and the rear gunner was killed. In spite of this Flight Sergeant Clark coolly and skilfully out-maneuvred the attacker. Sergeant Dowsett was thus enabled to engage the enemy aircraft which he shot down with a devastating burst of fire. Although 1 engine was unserviceable, Flight Sergeant Clark flew the damaged bomber to base. These airmen displayed great courage, skill and coolness.

1077128 Flight Sergeant Joseph Anthony FAGAN, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 7 Squadron.

One night in September, 1943, this airman was the rear gunner of an aircraft detailed to attack Hanover. During the bombing run, the aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire which wounded Flight Sergeant Fagan and rendered his turret unserviceable. Shortly afterwards the bomber was attacked by a fighter. In spite of his wounds, Flight Sergeant Fagan refused to leave his turret and played his part determinedly in frustrating the attacker. Displaying great fortitude and devotion to duty, this gallant gunner steadfastly held to his post until his aircraft was clear of the enemy coast. His example was most inspiring.

1381862 Flight Sergeant Arthur Gordon HARRIS, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 102 Squadron.

Sergeant Harris is a highly efficient wireless operator whose determination and devotion to duty has set an excellent example. He has taken part in many sorties and on several occasions his ability to repair essential equipment during flight has proved his skill. On a recent occasion, whilst attacking Munchen Gladbach, his aircraft was hit by gunfire from a fighter. A fire started amongst the ammunition boxes. Sergeant Harris acting promptly, was able to extinguish it and afterwards rendered first aid to a wounded comrade. His coolness was most praiseworthy.

Aus.413002 Flight Sergeant Noel McPHAIL, Royal Australian Air Force, No. 102 Squadron.

One night in October, 1943, this airman piloted an aircraft detailed to attack Kassel. The sortie was successfully accomplished and Flight Sergeant McPhail flew the aircraft safely to base. Whilst making his approach to land, the bomber began to vibrate violently. It was seen that a blade of one of the propellers was missing. Before the

necessary remedial action could be taken the engine fell away. The aircraft momentarily went out of control but, by a superb effort, Flight Sergeant McPhail regained control at 500 feet from the ground and finally landed the aircraft. His skill and coolness undoubtedly saved his aircraft and its crew from disaster. This airman has undertaken several sorties and his good judgment has been well evident on all occasions.

1063992 Flight Sergeant Vryan Rigg Moss, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 102 Squadron.

This airman has completed very many sorties, involving attacks on a wide variety of important targets. He has invariably displayed a keen desire to press home his attacks and his efforts have been highly commendable. On several occasions his aircraft has been damaged but each time he has flown it safely to base. Flight Sergeant Moss is an excellent captain whose fine example has been reflected in the high morale of his crew.

1316549 Flight Sergeant John Rees Sellars POWER, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 102 Squadron.

As air gunner, Flight Sergeant Power has participated in very many sorties over enemy territory. One night in August, 1943, he took part in an attack on Munchen Gladbach. Whilst over the target area, his aircraft was attacked by a fighter. During the combat, Flight Sergeant Power was wounded and his turret rendered unserviceable. Despite this, he insisted on remaining at his post until all danger of interference by enemy fighters had passed. His conduct was characteristic of the determination he has displayed throughout his tour.

778160 Flight Sergeant Derick Lenard Terrance WELENSKY, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 44 Squadron.

1314400 Sergeant Alfred Edwin MLLARD, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 44 Squadron.

One night in September, 1943, these airmen were mid-upper and rear gunners respectively of an aircraft detailed to attack Bochum. During the operation they accomplished an excellent feat, destroying 2 enemy fighters by their joint efforts. In both the combats, 1 of which occurred before reaching the target, they displayed great resolution. By their alertness and good shooting, these gunners contributed materially to the success of the sortie. They have undertaken many operations and proved very dependable members of aircraft crew.

1520930 Sergeant Kenneth JONES, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 218 Squadron.

As mid-upper gunner, Sergeant Jones has participated in many sorties involving attacks on well defended targets in Germany. He has at all times displayed great determination, while his skill and vigilance have contributed to the safe return of his aircraft on more than 1 occasion. His good qualities were amply demonstrated one night in September, 1943, during a sortie against Hanover. During the operation he engaged a Junkers 88 which, following a well directed burst of fire, was observed to fall to the ground in flames. This airman is a skilful and courageous gunner.

1163352 Sergeant Vincent VERNON, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 214 Squadron.

As air gunner, Sergeant Vernon has participated in a large number of sorties and has proved himself to be a reliable and vigilant member of aircraft crew. One night in October, 1943, he took part in an attack on Kassel. Whilst over the target his turret was damaged and he sustained a dislocated and fractured elbow. Almost immediately flames appeared in the fuselage. Although in great pain, Sergeant Vernon secured an extinguisher with which he got the fire under control. This airman, though severely injured, displayed great promptitude and prevented the aircraft from being seriously endangered.
