A PROCLAMATION

APPOINTING SATURDAY THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY, ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FORTY-FOUR, A BANK HOLIDAY THROUGHOUT ENGLAND, WALES AND NORTHERN IRELAND FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE BANK HOLIDAYS ACT, 1871.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas We consider it desirable, in the circumstances of the present emergency, that Saturday the first day of January one thousand nine hundred and forty-four, shall be kept as a close holiday in all banks in England, Wales and Northern Ireland and shall, as regards bills of exchange and promissory notes payable in England, Wales or Northern Ireland, be deemed to be a bank holiday for all the purposes of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section four of the said Act, We do by this Our Royal Proclamation, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, appoint the said first day of January to be observed as a bank holiday throughout England, Wales and Northern Ireland.

And We do declare that this Proclamation does not have the effect of making the said day a holiday under, or for the purposes of, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this seventeenth day of November, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and forty-three and in the seventh year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 8th day of November, 1943 (N/T.SD.600/43), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the growing importance of Radar and Associated equipment in Your Majesty's Fleet have made it necessary to revise the present system of Radar and Plotting training and organisation:

"And whereas with a view to facilitating the provision of ratings qualified in the operation and utilisation

of this equipment, we consider it expedient to establish a Radar Control Branch and a Radar Plot Branch, to form a non-substantive part of the Seaman Branch:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the institution of the following non-substantive ratings with pay as shown:—

"Radar Control Ratings.

- "Radar Control Rating 3rd Class, 3d. per diem.
- "Radar Control Rating 2nd Class, 9d. per diem for Leading Seamen and below.
- "Radar Control Rating 2nd Class, 6d. per diem for Petty Officers and above.
- "Radar Control Rating 1st Class, 1s. 6d. per diem.
- "Radar Control Instructor, 2s. per diem.

"Radar Plot Ratings.

- "Radar Plot Rating 3rd Class, 3d. per diem.
- "Radar Plot Rating 2nd Class, 9d. per diem for Leading Seamen and below.
- "Radar Plot Rating 2nd Class, 6d. per diem for Petty Officers and above.
- "Radar Plot Rating 1st Class, 1s. 6d. per diem.
- "Radar Plot Instructor, 2s. per diem.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of October, 1943 (C.W. 28031/43), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas it is provided by Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of October, 1922, that Ministers of Religious Bodies not in conformity with the Church of England who are rendering whole-time

service in the Royal Navy may be granted commissions as 'Temporary Chaplains' and as such shall be subject to the Regulations applicable to Chaplains on the permanent list of the Royal Navy for purposes of full pay and allowances:

"And whereas Order in Council bearing date the 21st day of February, 1935, approved revised conditions of service for Church of England Chaplains:

"And whereas provision was made by Order in Council bearing date the 3rd day of October, 1935, for the grant of retired pay and withdrawal gratuities to Temporary Chaplains of the Royal Navy:

"And whereas we now consider that Ministers of Religious Bodies not in conformity with the Church of England who serve as Chaplains in the Royal Navy should receive the same terms of service as Church of England Chaplains:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of a permanent list of such Chaplains, being established under the following conditions:—

I. The numbers on the permanent list to be fixed from time to time, in consultation with Your Majesty's Treasury.

II. Except as provided hereunder Chaplains placed on the permanent list to come under the same conditions of service as Chaplains of the Church of England.

III. The following special arrangements to apply to those Temporary Chaplains now serving who entered before the 3rd day of September, 1939:—

(a) Chaplains under the age of 50 to be allowed the option of remaining on their present conditions of service if more to their advantage.

(b) The normal retiring age to be extended as necessary in individual cases to enable the Chaplain to qualify for retired pay on the scale laid down in Part I para. 3 (b) of the Schedule to Order in Council dated 3rd October, 1935, but no service over age 55 to count if invalidated after that age.

(c) Chaplains over the age of 50—to remain under existing conditions except that their widows would be eligible for Widows' Pensions under conditions applicable to Church of England Chaplains.

The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Alfreton, in the County of Derby, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 24th September, 1943, notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 6th day of November next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Alfreton save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

*Alfreton*.—Forthwith and entirely in that portion of the Churchyard in the said Parish, not already closed in pursuance of the Order in Council dated

the 11th August, 1854, as amended by Orders dated the 13th September, 1854, the 18th October, 1854, and the 8th February, 1855.

Provided that in any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 4th day of November, 1943, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Hatton with Haseley in the county of Warwick and in the diocese of Coventry:

"Whereas we are satisfied that Howe Hewlett, of 37 Woodcote Road, Caversham, Reading, Esquire, is the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Howe Hewlett desires to transfer the Advowson of the said Benefice to the Bishop of Coventry for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Neville, Bishop of Coventry (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hatton with Haseley shall be transferred to the said Neville, Bishop of Coventry, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Coventry for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Coventry.
