The following day, during a similiar sortie, Flying Officer Cox destroyed a Junkers 52. Shortly afterwards, he was engaged by 2 fighters. In the combat his aircraft was extensively damaged and his observer was seriously wounded. Later, when his observer was seriously wounded. Later, when his aircraft could no longer be flown, Flying Officer Cox skilfully brought it down on to the sea. After assisting his gravely wounded comrade into the dinghy, Flying Officer Cox clambered aboard. Seeing his comrade was in dire need of assistance and that no progress could be made by paddling the dinghy, this gallant officer jumped overboard and swam to the shore a mile distant towing the dinghy as he went. His determination and forethought set a very fine example.

Flying Officer Raymond Stewart Modera (118474), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 227 Squadron.

Flying Officer Modera has participated in a large number of sorties, involving attacks on shipping, harbour installations and other important targets. He is a resolute pilot, whose determination to ensure accurate bombing has been most commendable. Flying Officer Modera is a fine leader and has proved a source of inspiration.

eutenant Raymond Ponsonby Burl (24135V), South African Air Force. No. 7 (S.A.A.F.) Lieutenant Squadron.

This officer has completed a very large number of sorties, many of them in North Africa. He is a skilful and tenacious pilot, whose example of courage and devotion to duty have been inspiring. In recent operations over Cos, Lieutenant Burl destroyed one and assisted in the destruction of another enemy aircraft.

Warrant Officer Ledwidge is a most determined pilot, whose excellent qualities have been well in evidence throughout the many sorties in which he has taken part. On one occasion, in an attack on a large concentration of shipping off Cos Island, Warrant Officer Ledwidge defied a fierce anti-aircraft barrage to close in on a naval vessel which he raked with bullets and hit with his bomble setting the ship on fire. His aircraft was which he raked with bullets and hit with his bombs, setting the ship on fire. His aircraft was repeatedly hit, however, and one of the petrol tanks set alight. The flames spread rapidly and Warrant Officer Ledwidge was compelled to bring the burning aircraft down on to the sea. He got safely aboard the dinghy and, some 8 hours later, drifted ashore. This gallant pilot set an example of the highest order.

His aircraft was repeatedly hit and the rudder control wires were shot away. Nevertheless, he flew back to base where he effected a masterly landing.
