Whilst many miles from the target the aircraft was bit by bullets from an arcsur forther. was hit by bullets from an enemy fighter. The rear turret was rendered unserviceable and the main hydraulic gear was damaged. The wind-screen near the pilot was shattered causing intense cold in the cabin. In spite of this, this resolute pilot flew on to the target and executed his attack, pilot flew on to the target and executed his attack, afterwards flying the aircraft to base where he effected a masterly landing. His skill, courage and tenacity set an example of the highest order. Pilot Officer Lees has successfully completed very many sorties, including 5 attacks on Berlin.

Flying Officer Thomas TOPHAM (145307), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 102 Squadron. This officer has taken part in a very large number of sorties, involving attacks on a wide range of targets in the Middle East and, more recently, in Germany. His navigational ability has always been evident and has played a good part in the success achieved. He has displayed great zeal for operations, setting an example great zeal for operations, setting an example worthy of emulation.

Wolffly of emination.
Pilot Officer Eric Burling GoodAll (155262), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 10 Squadron.
Pilot Officer Goodall has taken part in a large number of sorties, involving attacks on most of the important and heavily defended targets in Germany. He has displayed great skill and has invariably pressed home his attacks with determination. On I occasion his aircraft was attacked by a fighter but, by skilful maneeuving. Pilot mination. On 1 occasion his aircraft was attacked by a fighter but, by skilful manœuvring, Pilot Officer Goodall enabled his gunners to engage the attacker which was shot down. On another occa-sion his aircraft was attacked by 3 enemy fighters. By good tactics he enabled his gunners to drive off the attackers. He is a fine leader whose example has proved inspiring.

Pilot Officer Hylton Lewis MACKAY (149104), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 102 Squadron. As air gunner, this officer has taken part in a very large number of sorties and has displayed great keenness and devotion to duty throughout. He is a most efficient member of aircraft crew, whose services have been of great value.

ilot Officer Alan Cargill SMART (161078), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 158 Squadron. One night in December, 1943, this officer piloted an aircraft detailed to attack Leipzig. During the operation the aircraft was engaged by a fighter. In the ensuing engagement the bomber was repeatedly hit. One engine was rendered useless and a second one was damaged as were the ailerons and the flaps. Neverthe-less, by skilful tactics, Pilot Officer Smart enabled his gunners to engage and destroy the attacker from close range. Some 30 minutes later another fighter was encountered. Although his aircraft had become difficult to control, Pilot, Officer Smart outmanœuvred the enemy aircraft and his gunners Pilot Officer Alan Cargill SMART (161078), Royal Air outmanœuvred the enemy aircraft and his gunners shot it down. This officer displayed great skill, courage and resolution. He has completed many by fighters; 6 of them were shot down.

Distinguished Flying Medal.
