The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Wing Commander Geoffrey Trevor WYNNE-POWELL (90915), Auxiliary Air Force, No. 90

Powell (90915), Auxiliary Air Force, No. 90 Squadron.

This officer has participated in many sorties, involving attacks on targets in the Ruhr and many other important centres. He has displayed great skill throughout and, although his aircraft has been hit by anti-aircraft fire on several occasions, Wing Commander Wynne-Powell has invariably pressed home his attacks with great determination. By his personal example of courage and resolution this officer has contributed materially to the high standard of morale of the squadron he commands. he commands.

Lieutenant Thornton Vernon (Aus.408954), Royal Australian Air Force, No. 622

(Aus.408954), Royal Austranan All Force, No. 022 Squadron.

This officer is a keen, competent and resolute pilot. He has taken part in a large number of sorties, involving attacks on many well defended targets which he has attacked with determination. On several occasions his great skill has been largely responsible for the safe return of his aircraft when damage has been sustained in engagements with fighters. Flight Lieutenant Clarke has set a fine example of courage and devotion to dutv.

Flight Lieutenant Cyril Horatio Hawkins (111681), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 21

Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 21 Squadron.

In December, 1943, this officer was detailed to attack a target in Northern France. During the operation his aircraft was hit by fire from the ground defences. Flight Lieutenant Hawkins was wounded in the foot and the leg. Although suffering greatly he flew the damaged aircraft to base. He displayed great fortitude and devotion to duty. This officer has completed very many sorties and has invariably displayed praiseworthy determination. determination.

Flight Lieutenant Henry Richard Leven, D.F.M. (115287), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 487 (N.Z.) Squadron.

Since being awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal, Flight Lieutenant Leven has completed yery many sorties involving attacks on airfields.

very many sorties, involving attacks on airfields, railway junctions, military installations and other targets in enemy occupied territory. On a recent occasion, in an operation against targets, in Northern France, his aircraft was badly damaged

when hit by anti-aircraft fire on crossing the enemy coast. Nevertheless, Flight Lieutenant when hit by anti-alteract file on crossing and enemy coast. His effort was typical of the determination he has shown throughout his tour.

This officer has completed many sorties, involving bombing attacks on airfields, other military targets and industrial installations; he has also executed many low level attacks on shipping and has damaged a number of tugs, barges, small merchant ships and minesweepers. He is a gallant leader whose skill and fine fighting qualities have been reflected in the high standard of operational efficiency of the flight he commands.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Henry William Bristow (132734), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 158 Squadron.

This officer has participated in many sorties, including several attacks on Berlin. He is a first class gunner, whose coolness and resolution in the face of the enemy have set a fine example. On one occasion, whilst over Berlin, his aircraft was attacked by 4 fighters. In the ensuing engagement, Flight Lieutenant Bristow displayed great efficiency. Although his turret became unserviceable, he gave skilful evading directions to his pilot who thus was enabled to out-manoeuvre the attackers. His cool work contributed materially to the successful completion of the sortie. In addition to his work in the air, this officer has rendered veoman service in the training of other members of the squadron.

Acting Flight Lieutenant George Henderson Laing

Acting Flight Lieutenant George Henderson Laing (Can/J.22778), Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 57 Squadron.

One night in December, 1943, this officer was the pilot of an aircraft detailed to attack Berlin.

the pilot of an aircraft detailed to attack Berin. Although engine trouble developed during the outward journey, Flight Lieutenant Laing continued to the target and bombed it. He afterwards flew safely to base although 2 of the aircraft's engines were out of action. Flight Lieutenant Laing has participated in many sorties and has always displayed praiseworthy skill, courage and determination. courage and determination.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Dennis Charles Woodruff (156311), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 15 Squadron.

As captain of aircraft Flight Lieutenant Woodruff has participated in a large number of sorties, including attacks on such targets as

Berlin, Hamburg and Turin. On one occasion, whilst over Kassal, his aircraft was attacked by a fighter. Although much damage was sustained, Flight Lieutenart Woodruff skilfully manoeuvred his aircraft to enable his gunner to fire a long burst of fire at the attacker which went down in flames. Flight Lieutenant Woodruff then went on to complete a successful attack on the target on to complete a successful attack on the target. This officer has invariably displayed great courage and determination.

Flying Officer Wilfred Thomas HAXBY (135038), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 57

Squadron.
Flying Officer Haxby has taken part in a large number of sorties, including 6 against the capital of the Reich. He is a navigator of exceptional ability, a quality which was well in evidence in a recent sortie against Berlin when his efforts contributed materially to the success obtained. This officer has rendered valuable service.

Flying Officer Robin Herbert KNIGHTS (47835), Royal Air Force No. 101 Squadron.

Flying Officer Smith was a member of the crew of an aircraft piloted by Flying Officer Knights detailed to attack the German capital. When nearing the target the aircraft was hit by cannon fire from a fighter. Flying Officer Smith sustained severe injuries, being wounded in the back, the chest and the leg while 2 of his comrades tained severe injuries, being wounded in the back, the chest and the leg, while 2 of his comrades were mortally wounded. Although the aircraft had sustained damage, Flying Officer Knights, displaying great determination, continued to the target and bombed it. In the meantime, Flying Officer Smith, who had refrained from reporting his injuries, worked heriocally in an endeavour to free his trapped comrades from their turrets. Not until it was apparent that they were beyond human assistance would he relax his efforts. His courage, fortitude and determination were worthy of the highest praise. Throughout the return flight, Flying Officer Knights had to exert considerable pressure on the control column to maintain a level flight. Nevertheless, he succeeded in reaching base where he effected a safe landing. He displayed skill, courage and resolution of a high order. high order.

lying Officer Michael John Nolan, D.F.M. (122305), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 487 (N.Z.) Squadron.

This officer has taken part in very many sorties since being awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal. He is a navigator of exceptional ability and his record is one of outstanding success. On a recent occasion he was the navigator of the leading aircraft of a section detailed to attack a target in Northern France. When crossing the enemy coast the aircraft was badly damaged when hit by anti-aircraft fire. The pilot held to his course, however, and was guided to the target by Flying Officer Nolan with his usual accuracy. This officer has displayed exceptional keenness and great devotion to duty. great devotion to duty

Flying Officer George James Wallace (129183), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 158

Squadron.

As air bomber, Flying Officer Wallace has taken part in attacks on most of the heavily defended targets in Germany. He is possessed of great courage and determination, qualities which have earned him many successes. worthy of great praise. His fine record is

Can/R69999 Flight Sergeant Ross Barrett Irwin, Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 78 Squadron.
This officer and airman were pilot and flight engineer respectively of an aircraft detailed to attack Magdeburg one night in January, 1944. During the operation the aircraft was attacked by a fighter and customed much demand. The actor a fighter and sustained much damage. The astro-dome was shot away, the mid-upper and rear turrets were put out of action and the hydraulic gear was damaged; the port inner propeller blade was also damaged. The fighter made repeated

attacks but Flight Sergeant Irwin, standing with his head protruding through the aperture which had been previously covered by the astro-dome, gave the necessary directions to his pilot who was thus able to out-manoeuvre and eventually was thus able to out-manoeuvre and eventually evade the attacker. Later, one of the starboard engines had to be feathered. Nevertheless, Flight Lieutenant Shard flew the aircraft back to this country where he landed the bomber safely in spite of badly damaged flaps and burst tyres on two of the landing wheels. This officer and airman displayed great courage, determination and devotion to duty. tion to duty.

Flying Officer Norman Allan Marston (136912), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 78 Squadron.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

72812 Sergeant Douglas William McMillam, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 78 1672812 Squadron.

This officer and airman were air bomber and mid-upper gunner respectively of an aircraft detailed to attack Magdeburg. On the outward flight the aircraft was attacked by a fighter and damage was sustained. In spite of this, the mission was continued and the target was successfully attacked. On the homograph flight subject mission was continued and the target was successfully attacked. On the homeward flight, whilst over the North Sea the petrol supply became exhausted and the aircraft had to be brought down on to the sea. This was skilfully accomplished but the violence of the waves broke the aircraft in two and the dinghy drifted away. Undaunted, Flying Officer Marston and Sergeant McMillam discarded most of their equipment, plunged into the water and swam towards the dinghy. They succeeded in reaching it and, although almost exhausted, scrambled aboard. Although numb with cold and greatly fatigued they struggled valiantly against the violent seas to return to the sinking aircraft but their efforts were in vain. In most distressing circumstances this officer and airman displayed great courage and resolution and their conduct was worthy of the highest praise. the highest praise.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

Can/R.142144 Flight Sergeant Alexander CLIBBERY, Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 427 (R.C.A.F.)

Squadron.

This airman was the pilot of an aircraft detailed to attack Magdeburg one night in January, 1944.

Whilst over the target area his aircraft was illumi-Whilst over the target area his aircraft was illuminated by searchlights and afterwards attacked by a fighter. Although the enemy aircraft was evaded the bomber had sustained much damage. Instruments had been shot away, the inter-communication system rendered unserviceable and the oxygen supply destroyed. Despite this, Flight Sergeant Clibbery completed his bombing run and afterwards flew the damaged aircraft to base. This airman displayed a fine fighting spirit, great determination and devotion to duty. termination and devotion to duty.

1315224 Flight Sergeant Tom Noel Heywood FOGATY, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 115 Squadron.

No. 115 Squadron.

This airman was the pilot of an aircraft which attacked targets in Brunswick one night in January, 1944. Soon after leaving the target area the aircraft was intercepted by a fighter which attacked with much persistence. The bomber was hit in many places by the enemy's bullets. One engine was rendered useless, the front and midupper turrets were put out of action and the aircraft became filled with smoke. Nevertheless, Flight Sergeant Fogaty succeeded in evading the attacker. Although height was gradually lost on the homeward flight, Flight Sergeant Fogaty reached base where he effected a masterly landing. In very trying circumstances, this airman displayed great skill and coolness and set a very inspiring example.

Aus.417298 Flight Sergeant Phillip Kenneth Ross GERICKE, Royal Australian Air Force, No. 15

Squadron.

As rear gunner, Flight Sergeant Gericke has participated in very many sorties against important enemy targets. He is a cool, confident and resolute gunner and his skill has, on more than I occasion, contributed materially to the safe return of his aircraft. On I occasion, in an attack on Kassel, his aircraft was attacked by a

Although his reflector sight was hit by a bullet and rendered useless, Flight Sergeant Gericke coolly withheld his fire until the attacker came into close range then, with a well placed burst of fire, shot the enemy aircraft down. His determination and efficiency have set an excellent example.

1316474 Flight Sergeant Raymond Percival HAYLES, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 15

Squadron.

As wireless operator, this airman has participated in many attacks on targets in Germany, including such well defended targets as industrial centres in the Ruhr. He is a cool and efficient member of aircraft crew, whose unfailing devotion to duty has been highly commendable. On 1 occasion his aircraft suscained much damage in an engagement with a fighter. At times, on the an engagement with a fighter. At times, on the homeward journey the aircraft was almost out of control but Flight Sergeant Hayles coolly worked at his wireless apparatus, obtaining fixes which greatly assisted his pilot to reach base. His efficient first aid to 2 of his comrades who had been wounded in the fight was a timely factor in saving their lives. His exemplary conduct in harassing circumstances was worthy of great praise.

Can/R.181818 Sergeant Richard Edward QUALLE, Royal Canadian Air Force, No. 427 (R.C.A.F.)

Squadron.

This airman was the mid-upper gunner of an aircraft detailed to attack Magdeburg one night in January, 1944. Whilst over the target area the Qualle sustained many cuts by flying splinters when the glass surround of his turret was shattered by bullets which also put r of his guns out of action. Although dazzled by searchlights, Sergeant action. Although dazzled by searchlights, Sergeant Qualle coolly brought his remaining guns to bear on the attacker which was seen to burst into flames. Despite intense cold and the lack of oxygen he refused to leave his turnet throughout the homeward flight. On this, his first operational flight, this airman displayed determination, fortitude and devotion to duty of a high order.

1459209 Sergeant Raymond Loraine Urwin, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 622 Squadron. One night in January, 1944, this airman was the navigator of an aircraft which attacked Berlin. On the homeward flight, the aircraft was hit by cannon shells from a fighter. Sergeant Urwin was wounded in the neck and the shoulder. In spite of his injuries he insisted on fulfilling his duties and although denrived of some of his equipment. and, although deprived of some of his equipment, he navigated the aircraft safely to base. This airman set a fine example of courage, fortitude and devotion to duty.
