duties until the sortie was completed. His example of fortitude and devotion to duty was most commendable.

1232927 Sergeant William Moses John Savell, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 102 Squadron. As flight engineer this airman has participated in very many sorties, involving attacks on most of the enemy's well defended targets in Germany. He has invariably displayed great keenness and determination and has proved himself a worthy member of aircraft crew. One night in January, 1944, he took part in an attack on Berlin. During the operation his aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire. The petrol tanks were pierced and some of the contents were lost. By his good judgment in the use of the petrol available, Sergeant Savell enabled his pilot to reach this country with just sufficient left to effect a landing.

1078560 Sergeant James Whitter, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 76 Squadron, As mid-upper gunner, Sergeant Whitter has taken part in attacks on most of the enemy's well defended targets. On numerous occasions his aircraft has been engaged by fighters, 2 of which he has helped to shoot down. He is a cool and confident gunner whose fine fighting qualities have set an inspiring example.
