

formerly in Arms against the Emperor, have with Leave from the *Turks* settled themselves near *Widin*, not far from the Borders of *Transylvania*, which the Imperial Court does very much dislike, and will endeavour to procure an Order from the Grand Signior to have them remove farther from the *German* Territories, according to what is stipulated by the Treaty of *Carlowitz*.

Frankfort, Novemb. 11. The Baron *Weizer*, Chancellor to the Elector Palatine, has been several times in Conference with the Imperial and *French* Envoys concerning the Dutchess of *Orleans's* Pretensions on the Palatinate. The Elector's Forces, which were lately employed in repairing the Fortifications of *Heidelberg*, *Manheim*, and several other Places, are marched into Winter Quarters. Our Magistrates have ordered Publick Thanks to be returned in all the Churches of this City on the 14th Instant for the Birth of the young Prince, Son to the King of the *Romans*; and the Count de *Wirtheim*, Envoy from the Emperor, designs that day to give a splendid Entertainment to the Magistrates, the Foreign Ministers, and the other Persons of Quality here. They write from *Durlach*, that the Margrave of *Baden-Durlach* has ordered a Review to be taken of all his Forces, to which he designs to make an addition of two Regiments of Foot.

Hamburg, Nov 12. Letters from *Carelshaven* give an Account, that the Men of War and Transport Ships which lately returned to that Port from attending the King of *Sweden* in his Passage to *Livonia*, were ready to sail thither again with farther Succours. They write from *Dresden*, that the Envoys of *Sweden* and *Lunenburg* residing there, have both assured the King of *Poland's* Ministers, That the *Swedes* have no thoughts of committing any Hostilities against the Country of *Saxony*; And that all the Discourse there is, that the King of *Poland* having accepted the Mediation of the Emperor, and several other Princes, for accommodating the Differences between him and the King of *Sweden*, a Negotiation to this end will soon be entered upon, and that either *Dantzick* or *Oliva* will probably be the Place of Treaty. The King of *Poland's* Palace at *Dresden* is fitted up, and he is expected there this Winter. Letters from *Berlin* say, the Elector of *Brandenburg* has reviewed his Guards and the Troops of his Household, and has appointed General *Brant* and several others, to be Commissioners to take an exact Account of the present Condition of all his Forces, and that he intends shortly to take a Journey to *Prussia*. They write from *Hanover*, that the Electors of *Brandenburg*, and the Electress-Dowager of *Hanover*, are expected there in few days from *Holland*.

Hague, Novemb. 16. N.S. The Count de *Briort*, Ambassador from *France*, received an Express from *Fontainebleau* on Saturday the 13th Instant, late at night, with an account of the King of *Spain's* Death, which was confirmed by another Courier who arrived the next mor-

ning, being dispatched by Monsieur *Heemskirk*, Ambassador from the States-General at the *French* Court, and by an Express which Don *Quiros*, the *Spanish* Ambassador, received in the afternoon from *Brussels*. The States-General met on Sunday in the afternoon; and Count *Goes*, the Imperial Envoy, had several Conferences with the Deputies of the States, after which he sent an Express to the Imperial Court. The *Portuguese* Envoy, and some other Foreign Ministers, have also been in Conference with the Deputies of the States upon this Subject. The States of *Holland* and *Westfrisia* will meet to morrow.

Bristol, Novemb. 6. The Dispatch, Captain *Adison* Commander, bound to *Guinea*, and divers other outward-bound Merchant Ships, sailed from hence the 4th Instant. Yesterday sailed the *Ebenezer* and *Esther*, commanded by Captain *Wisting*, and this day the *Adventure*, under the Command of Capt. *Opie*, bound to *Virginia*.
