The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 20 of the Finance (No. 2) Act, 1940, entitled the Purchase Tax (Alteration of Rates) (No. 1) Order, 1944, directing that as from the 17th June, 1944, the purchase tax on soap substitutes made up for sale as substitutes for toilet soap, shall be reduced from 100 per cent. to the basic rate of 33½ per cent.
