Stockholm, Nov. 27. The Musicovice Merchants here having Advice, that the Goods of the Swedish Merchants in Muscowy were seized, and expecting to be treated in like manner, shipp'd off rheir best Essects on board some Merchant Ships in this Port, and sent them away towards Narva, in order to have them secured in the Czar of Muscovy's Camp before that Place; But we have fince received an Account, that these Vessels were met at Sea by some Swedish Frigats, who carried them into Revel, and that there were found on board 220000 Dollars in Money, and Goods to a very confiderable value. Letters from Revel of the toth Instant say, the King of Sxeden was assembling his Forces in order to march to the Relief of Narva, which would make about 40000 Men. That the Muscovires had fent a Detachment of 4000 Men to burn the Magazines at Wesenberg, but were beat off with confiderable loss by 2000 Swedes, who were in that Place under the Command of General Regbinder; And that the Museowires having fent divers Boats with Artillery, Provitions, and Ammunition from Pleskow upon the Peppus Lake towards Narva, the Commander of the Swedish Garrison at Derpt having notice thereof, sent out several Barks with Soldiers, who took 7 of the said Boats, in which they sound divers Pieces of Cannon, a good quantity of Am-

munition, and a great Standard, which was made in Muscowy to be used in the Czar's Army.

Vienna, Nov. 24. The Emperor has not yet received a formal Notification of the King of Spain's Death, and till that comes, the Court defers putting on Mourning for this occasion. Or-ders are given for augmenting the Imperial For-ces; each Regiment of Horse is to be made up 1200, and each Regimenr of Foot 2400 Men; and these Recruits are to be compleated by February next. Here is a Discourse likewise of raising more Troops, and particularly that the Emperor will take into his Service 7 or 8000 Huffars and Croats. The States of the Lower Aufria are to assemble here in few days.
