### DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939. BIRMINGHAM CORPORATION WATER ORDER, 1944.

Whereas the Minister of Health, on the 3rd June, 1944, made an Order empowering the Birmingham Corporation to reduce the 27 million gallons per day compensation water required to be discharged from their Caban Coch reservoir by an amount not exceeding 17 million gallons per day so, however, that the flow of the River Wye immediately below its confluence with the River Elan shall not be reduced thereby below 36 million gallons per day;

And whereas the said Order is due to expire on the 31st July, 1944, and the Minister has directed an Inquiry to be held in order to determine whether it should be renewed beyond that date:
