“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council dated 19th March, 1940, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction the establishment of the Corps of Royal Marine Engineers, with pay and allowances issuable to the personnel of this Corps:

“And whereas we have found it necessary to place Probationary Lieutenants, R.M.E., and Lieutenants, R.M.E., in command of platoons which were formerly commanded by Captains, R.M.E.:

“And whereas we consider that in view of this extra responsibility Probationary Lieutenants, R.M.E., and Lieutenants, R.M.E., should be granted in addition to the normal pay and allowances of their rank, a Specialist Allowance of 2s. 6d. a day:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment accordingly, with effect from 6th January, 1942.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords

Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 16th day of May, 1944 (C.W.32544/43), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by your Order in Council bearing date the 1st October, 1932, to sanction certain changes in the scales of pay and system of promotion of Quartermasters, Royal Marines (Lieutenant and Captain):

“And whereas we consider it desirable that the conditions of service applicable to the Officers of the Royal Naval School of Music, and to the Directors of Music, Royal Marines, should be brought into line with the conditions of service of Quartermasters, Royal Marines:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with effect from 29th May, 1942, insofar as the Officers of the R.N. School of Music are concerned and 1st November, 1942, insofar as the Directors of Music are concerned, the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in these proposals.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ 1. The officer holding the appointment of Musical Director, Royal Naval School of Music, to be eligible for promotion to the rank of Major on completion of fifteen years' commissioned service.

“ 2. The Musical Director, Assistant Musical Directors, Company officer and Quartermaster, Royal Naval School of Music, to be eligible for promotion to Captain after three years' seniority as Lieutenant, such promotion to be without additional emoluments, either effective or non-effective, except that the scale of pay should be assimilated to that of quartermasters similarly promoted to Captain under Order in Council, of 1st October, 1932 (see paragraph 5 below).

“ 3. Lieutenants (Directors of Music), R.M., with previous service as Army Bandmasters (W.O.) or as Warrant Officer, R.M., to be eligible for promotion to Captain, R.M., after three years' service as Lieutenant, R.M., without additional emoluments, either effective or non-effective, except that the scale of pay should be assimilated to that shown in paragraph 5 below.

" 4. Lieutenants (Directors of Music), Royal Marines, entered direct from civil life to continue to be promoted to Captain, R.M., after eight years' commissioned service, but the scale of pay to be assimilated to the common scale shown in paragraph 5 below.

" 5. The scale of full pay of the above-mentioned officers to be as follows:—

Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 17th day of May, 1944 (P.M. 1567/41), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 20th day of December, 1934, Regulations to govern the emoluments of Officers on the Retired and Emergency lists of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, when called out or retained for service in time of War or Emergency, were established:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is advisable to amend the aforesaid Regulations in certain respects:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve the amendments contained in the schedule annexed.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"Schedule.

"For the existing clause (b) of Section III in the Schedule to Order in Council No. 50/C.W. dated 20th December, 1934, substitute the following:

"Retired pay or pension granted on account of disablement arising out of Naval service during the period from the 4th August, 1914, to the 30th September, 1921, under any Order in Council administered by the Minister of Pensions, not to be suspended but only so much, if any, of the 25 per cent. bonus referred to in Section I, clause (b), to be issued as exceeds that portion of the disability retired pay which the Admiralty may decide to have been awarded in respect of service. For this purpose, an Officer who has commuted any part of his retired pay or pension shall be deemed to be still in receipt of the part commuted."

"Add *new* clause to Section III of the above-mentioned Schedule as follows:—

"(j) A retired Officer who sustained a disability attributable to service given after 1st October, 1921, and who is in receipt of, or is eligible to receive, a disability addition to service retired pay in respect of such disability, shall at his option, while re-employed:—

(i) draw the disablement addition to his retired pay only, as provided under Clause (c) above, in which case, the conditions of Section I will apply, or

(ii) draw disability retired pay assessed on the scale in Schedule II of Order in Council dated the 11th day of October, 1923, or, where appropriate, the corresponding scale in any instrument administered by the Minister of Pensions, the service retired pay being suspended, in which case he shall not be eligible for the 25 per cent. bonus on full pay, and shall suffer a deduction from pay or retired pay equivalent to the amount of any retired pay commuted."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of May, 1944, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the Benefice of Etwall in the Diocese of Derby for the patronage of the Benefice of Marston on Dove in the same Diocese:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Etwall is vested in John Marston Spurrier of Marston Hall, Hilton, in the County of Derby, Esquire:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Marston on Dove is vested in the Bishop of Derby for the time being:

"And whereas the said John Marston Spurrier and the Right Reverend John, now Bishop of Derby, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said two Benefices may be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said John Marston Spurrier and of the said John, Bishop of Derby, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Etwall shall be transferred to the said John, Bishop of Derby, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thenceforth be absolutely vested in and shall from time to time be exercised by the said John, Bishop of Derby, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Marston on Dove shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be transferred to the said John Marston Spurrier and shall thenceforth be absolutely vested in and shall from time to time be exercised by the said John Marston Spurrier, and his successors for ever.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Saint Mark, South Norwood, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1.
