Rome, Dec. 21. N. S.

THE Publick Rejoicings for the Pope's Coronation lasted two days, and he has since received the Compliments of the Cardinals, the Foreign Ministers, the several Courts of Justice, and other Persons of Quality, upon this occasion. The French and Venetian Ambassadors, in the Audiences they had of the Pope, insisted upon the Freedom of their Quarters, but he told them, He was resolved to abolish that Privilege; And accordingly he has given strict Orders to the Barrigel or Chief Serjeant, that the Shirris or Serjeants under him do diligently execute their Office in all Places of this City, excepting the Houses of the Queen-Dowager of Poland, and of the Foreign Ministers; Since which three notorious Malefactors have been seized before the Palaces of the Queen-Dowager of Poland, and of the French and Spanish Ambassadors. There is a Discourse, that the French Ambassador will shortly be recalled, and that the Cardinal de Noailles will continue here, to manage the Affairs of the Crown of France. The Pope has lately disposed of several vacant Offices; Signior Benzoni, at the Recommendation of Cardinal Delfino, is made *Camerario d'Onore*; Signior Gozzadini, who was Secretary of the Memorials, is appointed to be Secretary of the Briefs to the Princes; And the Office of Secretary of the Memorials is given to Signior Origo, in whose room Signior Aldovrandi is made Deputy Auditor of the Chamber. The 13th Instant, being the Feast of *Santa Lucia*, a Solemn Mass was performed according to Custom in the Church of *St. John Lateran*, in the presence of the French Ambassador, and all the Cardinals, Prelates, and other Persons of Quality of the French and Spanish Nations; after which the French Ambassador entertained the Company at Dinner.

Madrid, Decemb. 16. The 3d Instant the Queen of Spain began to receive the Compliments of Condoleance for the Death of the late King. The Regents were first admitted to Audience; The Cardinal de Portocarrero spoke for them; They all kissed Her Majesty's Hand, and put on their Hats as Grandees. The Pope's Nuncio, and the other Foreign Ministers who have the Character of Ambassador, were to have had Audience the 4th, but they declined it because they had not the Preference of the Re-

gents; The same day and the 5th, the Grandees, and others of the Nobility, waited upon the Queen, and kissed her Hand; and the days following the Foreign Ministers of the Second Order made their Compliments to the Queen, as did likewise all the Councils, and several Cities of Spain by their Deputies. The Queen designs shortly to quit the Royal Palace, which is to be fitted up against the King's Arrival. She had thoughts of living in the Palace of the Duke d'Uceda, Ambassador from this Crown at Rome, but the same not being found convenient enough, 'tis believed she will make choice of the Palace of the Duke of Monteleone. The Constable of Castile parted from hence the 4th Instant, accompanied by the Count de Haro his eldest Son, the Count de Salvatierra, and Don Michel Otaza; He has Orders to wait on the King of Spain, and to receive his Commands; whether he shall attend him in his Journey hither, or proceed to the Court of France, to Complement the Most Christian King on his part. The 13th, the Duke de Harcourt, Ambassador Extraordinary from France, arrived here, and the same day had a long Conference with the Cardinal de Portocarrero, and afterwards a private Audience of the Queen. The Obsequies of the late King were begun yesterday in the Church of the Nunnery of the *incarnation*, where a noble Mausoleum is erected, the Church being hung round with Black Velvet. This morning the Pope's Nuncio and other Foreign Ministers, and all the Grandees, were present at a Solemn Mass sung in the said Church, and a Funeral Sermon was Preached by Don Joseph of Madrid, a Capucin Frier. The Regents have restored to Don Gabriel Ponce, the Pension of 12000 Ducats assigned to him on the *Cruzada*, which was taken away by the late King's Edicts for suppressing of Pensions; as likewise to the Dutchess of Medina Sidonia her Pension of 6000 Ducats, and to the Marquis de Leganez his Salary of General of the Spanish Artillery. The German Regiment of 700 Horse which was quartered at Toledo, is marched from thence towards Catalonia; And 'tis said, a Detachment of the Spanish Forces in that Province will be sent to Milan. They write from Cadix of the 15th Instant, that several Vessels sailed from thence the first Instant, under the Command of Don Rodrigo Pardo, with Stores and Provisions for the Spanish Men of War in the *West-Indies*.

Transilvania, are marching towards the Country of *Tyrol*; and the Artillery designed for the Service of the Emperor's Forces in *Italy*, will be sent away in the beginning of the next Month. The Count *de Breiner* is declared Commissary-General of the Emperor's Forces. 'Tis said, an Express is sent to *Madrid*, to recall the Counts of *Harrach* and *Aversberg*, Ambassadors from the Emperor. Letters from *Carlowitz* of the 14th Instant advise, that Count *Oetting*, who is returning from his Embassy to the Grand Signior, was still there performing a kind of *Quarantain*; After which he would continue his Journey hither.

Hamburg, January 4. Letters from *Stockholm* say, an Express was come thither over Land from *Livonia*, who brings a Confirmation of the King of *Sweden's* Victory, and adds, that 'tis computed that the *Muscovites* have lost above 4000 Men in their late Expedition in *Livonia*, as well in the Attacks against *Narva*, as in the late Rout of their Army before that Place. Letters from *Dresden* say, the States of that Electorate have agreed to raise 6000 Men for the Service of the King of *Poland*, to Recruit his *Saxon* Forces. The Duke of *Wirtemberg*, who lately arrived here from *Copenhagen*, designs to morrow to continue his Journey to *Holland*. The Duke of *Holstein* is shortly expected at *Gottorp* from *Pomerania*.

Brussels, January 11. The States of *Flanders* have sent Deputies to the Elector of *Barbaria*, to represent several Matters relating to that Province. Directions are given for repairing the Fortifications of *Antwerp*. The Officers of the *Spanish* Forces in these Countries are ordered to repair to their several Quarters. They write from the *French* Conquests, that Soldiers are raising in those Parts, to recruit and augment the *French* Forces.

Paris, January 8. N. S. The King of *Spain* arrived the 30th of the last Month at *Bordeaux*, where he was received with great Demonstrations of Respect; He intended to remain there 2 or 3 days, and then to continue his Journey to *Madrid*. The Constable of *Castile* met him at *Bordeaux*, and is expected here in 3 or 4 days; He is to take upon him the Character of Ambassador Extraordinary, and has with him a very great Equipage. The Regents of *Spain* have writ to the Most Christian King, to acquaint him, That they have given Directions to the Governors of all Places depending on the *Spanish* Monarchy, and to the Commanders of their Forces, to follow and obey his Orders. The Duke *de Harcourt*, the *French* Ambassador at *Madrid*, has a Place given him in the *Spanish* Council. Don *Francisco de Colmenero*, who was sent hither some days ago by the Prince of *Vaudemont*, took his Leave of the King at *Versailles* the 28th past, and is returned to *Milan*. The Baron *de Spanheim*, Envoy from the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, had a private Audience of the King the same day. The Marquis of *Sabvati*, Envoy from *Tuscany*, had Audience likewise of the King, and presented to him the Marquis *de Puccy*, who is going with a Compliment from the Great Duke his Master to the King of *Spain* upon his Accession to the Crown. The Most Christian King went the 5th Instant to *Marly*, and will return to *Versailles* the 10th. Orders are sent to most

of the *French* Cardinals at *Rome* to return to *France*, but the Cardinal *d'Estrees* is to call at several Courts of *Italy*, to negotiate some Affairs. We hear, that the Imperial Forces move towards *Italy*; that they will take their march through the Country of *Tyrol*, and when joined together will make an Army of above 30000 Men, to be commanded by Prince *Eugene* of *Savoy*. A considerable Body of *French* Forces are ordered likewise towards *Milan*, and Passage for them is demanded of the Duke of *Savoy*. The Marquis *de Barbesteux*, Secretary of State, and Chancellor of the Orders of the *Holy-Ghost* and of *St. Lewis*, died at *Versailles* the 5th Instant of a Fever, in the 33rd Year of his Age. Monsieur *Stouppa*, General of the *Suis* Forces in the *French* Service, died the same day.

Paris, January 12. N. S. Monsieur *Chamillard*, Comptroller-General of the Finances, is made Secretary of War in the room of Monsieur *Barbesteux*, and Monsieur *de Torcy*, Minister and Secretary of State, succeeds him in the Place of Chancellor of the Order of the *Holy-Ghost*; Monsieur *Chamillard* retains still the Office of Comptroller-General. A Body of *Spanish* Horse are upon their march from *Catalonia* to *Milan*, who in their Passage through the *French* Dominions, will be maintained at the King's Expence, and Orders are given to allow them double Subsistence. The *Portugal* Envoy had yesterday an Audience of the King at *Versailles*.
