HE Pope held a Secret Confistory last week, in which he thanked the Cardinals for the good Opinion they had of him, which they shewed by Electing him to fill the Papal Chair; He represented to them at the same time, how difficult an Office they had put upon him, and desired their constant Advice and Assistance to enable him to discharge it, in such manner as might be most for the Advantage of the Church; He acquainted them, That the Inventiture of the Kingdom of Naples is demanded of him, as well by the Emperor as by the new King of Spain; But that he had yet given no particular Answer to either, it being a Matter of great weight, which he would refer to a Congregation to examine; And that in the mean time he had approved of what Signior Davia, Nuncio in Spain, did, in protesting against that part of the late King's Will which disposed of the Kingdoms of Naples and Sicily, they being Fiess belonging to the Church of Rome. Two days ago the Pope accordingly called together a Congregation of Twenty two Cardinals, who all have been employed in the Ministry and as Nuncios abroad, to confider of this Affair, but their Resolutions are kept very secret. Last week the Pope visited the Four Churches, where Indulgences were distributed during the Jubilee; and yesterday he ended the Jubilee, by shutting up the Holy Gate of St. Peter's Church; and the like Ceremony was performed at the Church of St. John de Lateran by Cardinal Buillon as Dean, at St. Paul's by Cardinal Pamphilio the Arch-Priest, and at St. Ma-7's by Cardinal Moriggia, who all had the Title of Legates given them upon this The Pope has given 4000 Crowns with Holpital of the Trinity, towards defray, ing the Expences they have been at in entertaining the poor Pilgrims, who came hither on account of the Jubilee. The l'enetian Ambasfador has presented to the Pope the Instrument, by which the Senate of Venice have admitted his Brother and Nephews into the Body of their Nobility, which was kindly received. Warsaw, Decemb. 24. The King of Poland has been several days with the Cardinal Primate at Lowitz, and returned hither this day. Prince San picha, the Great General of Lithuania, is shortly expected here from Comingsberg, and 'tis faid the King is resolved to assist him against the Confederate Nobility of that Dutchy, who shew at prefent very little inclination to adjust Matters with the House of Sapieha, and at a late General Meering declared, That they have forfeited all their Honours and Dignities, and elected the young Prince Wiernowisky to be Great General of Lithuania in the Place of Prince Sapieha, the Sieur Ogin-sky Lieutenant General of that Dutchy, and Governor of Wilna, in the room of the Sieur Sluscka; and the Sieur Kociel Great Treasurer, in the Place of one of Prince Sapieha's Brothers. They write from Prussia, that the General Diet of that Pro-vince was assembled some days ago, and that the Deputies from the Nobility have consented to a confiderable Supply to be given for the Payment of the Army of the Crown, but the Deputies from the several Cities have not yet agreed there-

Stockholm, December 29. The Senate of this Kingdom have received by Express a Letter from the King of Sweden, dated at Narva the first In-stant, by which His Majesty acquaints them, That with the Blessing of God he has obtained an entire Victory over the Czar of Muscowy, having after a very obstinate Fight forced have before Narva, which was very well intrenched, and totally routed his Army; That the greatest part of the Masswites were killed or taken Prisoners, and that among the latter were most of the Czar's General Officers; That the Swedes took all the Enemy's Artillery, Baggage, Ammunition, and other rich Booty; Of which great Action, a more full and particular Account is daily expected

Vienna, January 1. The Emperor's Ambassador at the Court of Rome has demanded the Investiture of Kingdom of Naples, and the Pope answered in General Terms, That he would forthwith call together a Congregation, to consider this weighty Affair. The new Levies are continued in these Parts with very good Success; And'tis said, the Emperor will take into his Service the 7000 Danes now in Saxony; and that these Troops will be put into the Garrisons in Hungary, that so the German Regiments may be drawn from thence for other Services as there shall be occasion. Prince Lewis of Baden is expected here in few days from Gerwany. The Emperor has made the Heer Pfeffers-boffen Lieutenant-General of his Forces. Deputies are come hither from the Diet of the Circle of Suabia, who had Audience of the Emperor two days ago; but they do defer entring upon any Business, till the arrival of Prince Lewis of Baden. The Countess of Berlips, who was First Lady of Honour to the Queen of Spain, is arrived at Toulis, a Town in the Neighbourhood of this Place, and has defired the Emperor's Leave to come to Court, but has not yet obtained it. An Express is fent to Count Ossing, who is at Carlowitz, with Orders forthwith to return hither. The Emperor has made Sir Godfrey Kneller a Knight of the Empire, in consideration of his great Skill in Painting.

Hamburgh, January 3. The last Letters from Livonia bring a List of several General Officers in the Czar's Service taken Prisoners by the Swedes, more than those already mentioned; and add, That the Artillery which the Swedes found in the Czar's Camp, did consist the Swedes found in the Czar's Camp, did consist in 150 Brass Guns, and 40 Morears, and that they took besides 148 Colours, 18 Standards, and 4 pair of Kettle-Drums. The King of Sweden gave the greatest part of the Booty to his Soldiers, and to the Garrison and Inhabitants of Narva, as a Reward for their good Services. Letters from Coningiberg fay, the Elector and Electoress of Brandenburgh, and the Electoral Prince their Son, arrived there the 29th pail; The Day for his Electoral Highness's Coronation was not yet ap-

pointed.
