Distinguished Flying Cross.

- Acting Wing Commander James Michael BIRKIN, A.F.C. (81350), R.A.F.V.R., No. 571 Sqn. Wing Commander Birkin has completed a large number of sorties during which he has attacked many dangerous and difficult targets. He has displayed a high degree of skill, gallantry and devo-tion to duty and has contributed in a large measure to the operational efficiency of the squadron he commands.

light Lieutenant John McKinnon McAllister (108841), R.A.F.V.R., 218 Sqn. This officer has set a fine example of skill, deter-mination and devotion to duty. He has completed a large number of sorties against a wide variety of atrice and much of the success achieved can be attributed to this officer's efficiency and resolution. He is a gallant and inspiring captain.

Flight Lieutenant Denis WELFARE (119194), R.A.F.V.R., 239 Sqn. Flying Officer David Benjamin BELLIS (142922), R.A.F.V.R., 239 Sqn. These officers have completed many sorties as Pilot and Navigator respectively. This officer has an excellent operational record. He is a highly skilled and courageous pilot who has completed many successful sorties over enemy territory. On one occasion this officer piloted an aircraft detailed to attack Leipzig. Shortly before reaching the target the aircraft was struck by anti-aircraft fire and sustained extensive damage. Despite this, Flight Lieutenant Cote went on to attack the target with his usual determination. Just after the bombs had been released an engine became unserviceable but Flight Lieutenant Cote flew his aircraft safely to base. flew his aircraft safely to base.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Lionel Palmer Joseph DUPUIS (Can/J.85013), R.C.A.F., 425 (R.C.A.F.) Sqn.

This officer is a skilful and devoted pilot. He has completed many sorties including attacks on Berlin, Essen and Stuttgart. The determination

he has shown throughout his tour was well illus-trated on his first sortie when detailed to attack Frankfurt. In the early stages of the outward flight some important navigational equipment became useless. Despite this, Flight Lieutenant Dupuis continued to the target and executed a successful attack. This officer is a most inspiring cantain. captain.

- Flying Officer Leonard John GORNALL (52164), R.A.F., 138 Sqn. R.A.F., 138 Sqn. This officer has completed a large number of sorties. He is an extremely keen and enthusiastic flight engineer and has at all times displayed the greatest determination. He has imparted much of his technical knowledge to other members of the squadron with good results.

One night in July, this officer was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack Berlın, a target which he had operated against on 7 previous occasions. In the bombing run his aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire and one engine was put out of action. Much height was lost but course was set for home. On the return flight extremely adverse weather was encountered but Flying Officer Hooper succeeded in reaching base. He displayed skill, courage and resolution of a high standard. standard.

Pilot Officer Edmondson has completed many sorties. On one occasion when attacking Berlin one engine of his aircraft became unserviceable. Undeterred by heavy enemy opposition and gradual loss of height, he pressed home his attack.
with great determination. The successful completion of these operations have been due largely to the skill, initiative and resourcefulness displayed by this officer. played by this officer.

Pilot Officer Ivan Douglas GREGORY (172248), R.A.F.V.R., 141 Sqn. Pilot Officer Derek Henry STEPHENS (172350), R.A.F.V.R., 141 Sqn.

These officers have completed many sorties as lot and navigator respectively. They have dispilot and navigator respectively. They have dis-played great skill and co-operation, qualities which were well illustrated one night in July, 1944, when they destroyed a Junkers 88 from close range. Their devotion to duty has been unfailing.

Pilot Officer John Leslie JAMES (Can/J.85056), R.C.A.F., 433 (R.C.A.F.) Sqn. This officer has completed a large number of

sorties against well defended targets; he has also completed several successful sea mining operations. On one occasion whilst over enemy terri-tory his aircraft sustained serious damage. Although the starboard elevator and rudder were

affected Pilot Officer James flew the damaged air-craft to base and made a safe landing. This officer has displayed notable skill, courage and keenness.

Pilot Officer Jack Eldin MITCHELL (Can/J.86237), R.C.A.F., 433 (R.C.A.F.) Sqn. Pilot Officer Mitchell has completed many sorties over enemy territory including attacks against some of the most heavily defended areas in Germany. On one occasion when attacking Berlin his aircraft was attacked by a Junkers 88 and sustained much damage. One of the petrol tanks was pierced and much of the contents were lost. Nevertheless. Pilot Officer Mitchell pressed lost. Nevertheless, Pilot Officer Mitchell pressed home his attack. En route for home one engine became useless. Pilot Officer Mitchell held resobecame useless. Plot Officer Mitchell held reso-lutely to his course but, when nearing the English coast, the petrol supply became exhausted and he was compelled to give the order to leave the aircraft by parachute. In the face of great difficulty this officer displayed exceptional deter-mination and devotion to duty.

Pilot Officer Sidney Beresford TAYLOR (175582), R.A.F.V.R., 550 Sqn.
Pilot Officer Taylor has proved himself to be a most efficient and inspiring captain. On a recent sortie, despite the fact that his aircraft was severely damaged whilst over the target area this officer showed great skill and determination in attacking his target and flying his damaged air-draft safely back to this country. His skill, gallantry and resource have set a fine example to all. to all.

ilot Officer William THOMSON (170759), R.A.F.V.R., 115 Sqn. In the course of two tours of operational duty this officer has participated in attacks against many heavily defended targets. He is a wireless operator of high merit and has played his part worthily in the successes obtained. On one occasion his air-craft was heavily attacked by forthers. Two means craft was heavily attacked by fighters. Two mem-bers of the crew were wounded. Pilot Officer Thomson was of great assistance to his captain in flying the aircraft safely back to base.

Warrant Officer McAdam is a fearless and devoted captain whose example throughout the many sorties in which he has taken part has instilled great confidence in his crew. On one occasion, when over Stuttgart. his aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire. The aircraft was seriously damaged and the navigator was killed. Though himself wounded, Warrant Officer McAdam assisted the air bomber to plot the homeward course. He displayed commendable courage and resource in trying circumstances. Conspicuous Gallantry Medal (Flying).

N.Z.421549 Flight Sergeant David John MORIARTY, R.N.Z.A.F., 75 (N.Z.) Sqn. One morning in July, 1944, this airman was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack an objec-tive in Northern France. Whilst over the target area his aircraft was hit by an anti-aircraft shell which exploded in the cockpit. Flight Sergeant Moriarty was severely injured about the face being completely blinded in one eye which was badly lacerated by flying glass or shell fragments; he also sustained a nasty scalp wound. After re-ceiving first aid he insisted on remaining at the controls. In spite of his distress he succeeded in flying the aircraft home. This airman displayed courage, fortitude and determination of a high order. order.

671281 Sergeant Jack Henry WEST, K.A.F.V.K., 115, Sqn. One night in July, 1944, these airmen were pilot, flight engineer and navigator respectively of an aircraft detailed to attack Homberg. Shortly after the bombs had been released the aircraft was attacked by a fighter. Almost immediately a second enemy aircraft joined the fight. The bomber sustained much damage and Flight Sergeant Gaston and Sorgeants Barugh and West were wounded. In spite of their injuries these airmen displayed great coolness in the face of the enemy. A fire started near the cockpit but

Sergeant Barugh beat out the flames with his bare hands. Meanwhile, Flight Sergeant Gaston by good manœuvring, succeeded in extricating his aircraft from a perilous situation. Course was set for home and on the return flight Sergeant West guided his pilot with much skill although deprived of the use of much of his navigational equipment. Eventually a safe landing was made at an airfield. These members of aircraft crew displayed a high standard of courage and devotion to duty in the face of a trying ordeal. to duty in the face of a trying ordeal.

This airman has completed numerous sorties as rear gunner, most of which have been against targets in Germany. On a recent occasion his air-craft was attacked by a fighter soon after the target had been bombed. Flight Sergeant Glynn defended his aircraft with great skill and drove off the attacker which turned away with one engine on fire. Shortly afterwards he drove off another enemy aircraft which attempted to close in. His good work contributed materially to the safe return of the bomber. safe return of the bomber.

sale return of the bomber. Can/R.210846 Sergeant Berthan Carl SWANSON, R.C.A.F., 12 Sqn. Sergeant Swanson, as rear gunner, has displayed a fine fighting spirit throughout a notable tour. In June, 1944, when returning home from an attack on Vierzon his aircraft was twice attacked by enemy fighters. By his good shooting and excellent directions to his captain Sergeant Swanson played a good part in driving off the attackers. His coolness and confidence in the face of the enemy have set a worthy example. face of the enemy have set a worthy example.
