The KiNG has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Distinguished Service Order.

Acting Wing Commander George William Curry, D.F.C. (86389), R.A.F.V.R., 627 Sqn.

Since assuming command of his squadron, Wing Commander Curry has taken part in a number of operations against a variety of enemy targets. His great determination and capable leadership have resulted in many successful operations. On several occasions his aircraft has been damaged by anti-aircraft fire. The exceptional energy and initiative which this officer has displayed, together with his outstanding keenness and cheerful personality, have had a most marked effect upon the morale and efficiency of his squadron. He has set a worthy example.

Acting Wing Commander Walter Dring, D.F.C. (104424), R.A.F.V.R.

Since the award of the Distinguished Flying Cross, Wing Commander Dring has completed a very large number of operations against the enemy. By his untiring efforts, leadership and excellent organising ability he has contributed in a large measure to the formations he commands.

Acting Wing Commander Ernest William Tacon, D.F.C., A.F.C. (36196), R.A.F.O., 236 Sqn.

In August, 1944, Wing Commander Tacon led a force of aircraft in an attack on the harbour of Le Verdon. A very heavy barrage of anti-aircraft fire from the enemy ships and ground defences was encountered and after the attack four of our aircraft were severely damaged. Wing defences was encountered and after the attack four of our aircraft were severely damaged. Wing Commander Tacon directed one aircraft to alight on the sea near a naval force in the vicinity and then proceeded to an advanced base in France where he supervised the landing of the remaining three aircraft. He displayed outstanding qualities of resourceful leadership and great devotion to duty. Two destroyers were set on fire and seriously damaged during this action.

Acting Squadron Leader Mervyn Richard Attwater, D.F.C. (61253), R.A.F.V.R., 156 Sqn.

Throughout a difficult and varied operational tour Squadron Leader Attwater has displayed exceptional keenness, courage and devotion to duty. He gave an outstanding example of his resolution and courage when on a recent sortie to a target in Holland. Although his aircraft was engaged and hit several times by accurate anti-aircraft fire, he remained in the vicinity of the target until the last bomber had completed the attack. His fine fighting spirit has set an example to all.

Acting Squadron Leader Harry Baker Locke, D.F.C. (Aus.401980), R.A.A.F., 97 Sqn.
Squadron Leader Locke has completed a large number of sorties and has displayed a high degree of skill and courage. One night in August, 1944, he was detailed for a minelaying mission. The defences were strong and many searchlights were directed on Squadron Leader Locke's aircraft. Undeterred he commenced his run and accurately directed on Squadron Leader Locke's aircraft. Undeterred he commenced his run and accurately placed his mines. This officer has displayed a marked degree of coolness and fortitude and on several occasions he has remained in the vicinity of the target area, in the face of heavy enemy defences, for a long period of time. His consistent good work has been most praiseworthy.

Acting Squadron Leader Stuart Martin Parkeshouse

cting Squadron Leader Stuart Martin Parkeshouse Parkes (114010), R.A.F.V.R., 97 Sqn.

One night in August, 1944, Squadron Leader Parkes was detailed to lay mines in enemy waters. In the face of powerful defences and being illuminated by searchlights, this officer flew his aircraft accurately down the length of the channel and placed his mines in the correct position. During the run his aircraft was hit and severely damaged by fire from the ground defences. Despite this Squadron Leader Parkes remained in the vicinity of the target area for some twenty minutes vicinity of the target area for some twenty minutes and then flew his damaged aircraft safely home. His unswerving determination, courage and skill in the face of powerful defences, largely contributed to the success of the operation. Squadron Leader Parkes has completed very many operations and his devotion to duty has been unfailing.

Acting Flying Officer Hubert John West (172475), R.A.F.V.R., 101 Sqn.
One night in August, 1944, Flying Officer West was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack a target in France. At the commencement of the bombing run the aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire. Flying Officer West was badly injured in the left leg by a large fragment of shrapnel. With outstanding courage and coolness, he refused treatment until the target had been successfully bombed and the aircraft had passed over the enemy coast and the aircraft had passed over the enemy coast on the return flight. This officer later made an excellent landing at an advanced airfield and then lost consciousness. His devotion to duty and splendid example are of a very high order.

## Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Wing Commander David Walter Sealey CLARK, D.F.C. (36213), R.A.F.O. Acting Squadron Leader James Richard Dow, D.F.C. (Can/J.5691), R.C.A.F., 635 Sqn.

One night in August, 1944, these officers were pilot and navigator respectively of an aircraft detailed to attack Stettin. On the bombing run the

aircraft was hit and severely damaged by antiaircraft ire. One engine was rendered unservice-able and the aircraft was difficult to control. Nevertheless by cool thinking and excellent co-operation these officers made a successful attack on the target and brought the aircraft safely back to base. Wing Commander Clark and Squadron Leader Dow have completed very many sorties and have at all times displayed exceptional skill and courage.

### Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader John William Holbrook Harwood, D.F.M. (126025), R.A.F.V.R., 76 Sqn. Now on his second operational tour, this officer has completed attacks against a wide range of targets including Berlin, Essen, Stuttgart, Brest and Frankfurt. On numerous occasions his aircraft has been subjected to attacks by enemy fighters but his skilful and calculated handling of his aircraft, combined with coolness and great presence of mind have enabled him to evade these attacks. As flight commander he has been responsible for the organising and training of crews. Displaying considerable powers of leadership he Displaying considerable powers of leadership he has undertaken this duty with outstanding initiative and skill.

Acting Squadron Leader Denis Raymond Stubbs (87017), R.A.F.V.R., 50 Sqn.

In August, 1944, this officer was pilot of an aircraft detailed to attack oil storage tanks at La Pallice. On the outward flight very adverse weather was encountered but Squadron Leader Stubbs was determined to complete his mission. Undeterred by heavy and accurate fire from the enemy's ground defences he commenced his bombing run and made a successful attack. Throughout this long and arduous flight Squadron Leader Stubbs displayed a high standard of leadership, courage and unswerving devotion to duty. ship, courage and unswerving devotion to duty.

Acting Squadron Leader James Ernest White (66581), R.A.F.V.R., 44 Sqn.
Squadron Leader White has completed much operational flying during which he has attacked a variety of targets in Germany and France. In August, 1944, he piloted an aircraft on a minelaying mission. Despite intense opposition and being illuminated by searchlights he made a determined attack and succeeded in placing his mines mined attack and succeeded in placing his mines accurately. Squadron Leader White has completed many sorties and has displayed the highest standard of skill and devotion to duty.

Flight Lieutenant Lance Amigo Percy Burra-Robinson (89384), R.A.F.V.R., 65 Sqn.
Flight Lieutenant Burra-Robinson has set a fine example of keenness and devotion to duty. He has displayed exceptional fighting qualities and on one occasion in August, 1944, he accounted for three enemy aircraft destroyed of a force of twenty, bringing his personal score of destroyed aircraft to six. His leadership has been of a high order.

Flight Lieutenant William Ritchie Christison (Can/

J.15143), R.C.A.F., 404 Sqn.

This officer has completed a large number of sorties and has at all times displayed exceptional coolness and determination. On a recent sortie he was flight commander in an attack upon enemy shipping in Le Verdon harbour. During the action snipping in Le Verdon harbour. During the action his aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire rendering one engine useless. However, Flight Lieutenant Christison completed the attack and made a successful return flight, landing at an advanced base in France. This officer has led his squadron with great skill and has set a fine example to all.

Flight Lieutenant Basil Gordon Collyns (NZ.391342),

R.N.Z.A.F.,19 Sqn.

This officer, now on his second tour of operational flying, has completed a large number of sorties. As flight commander, he has led his flight sorties. As flight commander, he has led his flight with outstanding skill and courage and has inflicted much damage on the enemy. During August, 1944, the squadron met a large force of enemy aircraft, and Flight Lieutenant Collyns displayed considerable ability and initiative by leading his flight to attack the enemy top cover, thus enabling the remainder of the squadron to engage the lower enemy formation. This officer has destroyed 7 enemy aircraft and damaged many others. others.

Flight Lieutenant Bernard James Dobson (109371), R.A.F.V.R., 44 Sqn. Since joining his squadron, Flight Lieutenant

Dobson has completed many sorties against targets

in Germany and France. Many of these targets have been strongly defended by ground and fighter defences. On one occasion in August, 1944, he was pilot of an aircraft detailed for a minelaying mission. In spite of heavy fire from the enemy's defences this officer completed his allotted task with determination and accuracy. This officer with determination and accuracy. This officer has consistently displayed the utmost skill and determination in pressing home his attacks.

Flight Lieutenant Gordon Gregory (119004), R.A.F.V.R., 236 Sqn.

This officer has completed many sorties on his
operational duty. These include This officer has completed many sorties on his second tour of operational duty. These include numerous attacks on enemy shipping the success of which have been proved by the excellent photographs he has obtained. On a recent sortie against two enemy vessels in the Gironde his port engine failed before the attack. Despite this, Flight Lieutenant Gregory continued the mission on one engine and flew back to an airfield in France where he executed a successful landing. His keenness and courage are most praiseworthy. keenness and courage are most praiseworthy.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Cyril Donald Aidney (157690), R.A.F.V.R., 502 Sqn.

This officer has displayed the highest standard of skill, resolution and devotion to duty. He has participated in many attacks against enemy shipping the successes of which have been due to his untiring efforts and fearlessness. Flight Lieutenant Aidney has shown marked ability as a pilot and is an invaluable officer to his squadron.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Maurice Johnston (N.Z.42409), R.N.Z.A.F., 15 Sqn.

Flight Lieutenant Johnston is an outstanding captain of aircraft who has at all times displayed courage and determination to press home his attacks. On one occasion when detailed to attack Friedrichshaven, his aircraft was attacked by an enemy fighter just before reaching his target. Slight damage was caused to the bomber and, at about the same time, an anti-aircraft shell exploded beneath the aircraft causing further damage. Undeterred, Flight Lieutenant Johnston continued his mission and successfully bombed his objective. This officer has completed very many sorties against such targets as Berlin, Essen, Duisburg and Stuttgart.

Flying Officer George Bunting (131100), R.A.F.V.R., 228 Sqn.

Flying Officer Bunting captained an aircraft in an attack on a U-boat recently. The vessel submerged at the approach of the aircraft but with great skill this officer released two depth charges, causing heavy oil to come to the surface. A little later a periscope was sighted and an accurate attack was made with the remaining depth charges. Later a surface disturbance occurred a mile from Later a surface disturbance occurred a mile from the scene of the attack and large air bubbles followed by oil were observed. This officer has undertaken many sorties and has invariably displayed commendable courage and determination.

Flying Officer Colin William KIPFER (Can/J.86565), R.C.A.F., 106 Sqn.
Flying Officer William Norman REDMAN (147125), R.A.F.V.R., 106 Sqn.
These officers as pilot and air bomber respectively have completed many operational sorties. On a These officers as pilot and air bomber respectively have completed many operational sorties. On a recent minelaying mission, although their aircraft was hit and severely damaged by anti-aircraft fire, Flying Officers Kipfer and Redman displayed exceptional skill and determination in pressing home their attack and bringing the damaged aircraft safely back to this country. Their co-operation and devotion to duty have been of a high order.

Flying Officer Royal Lewis MIDDLEMAS (151691), R.A.F.V.R., 236 Sqn.

During the past four months this officer has achieved a fine operational record. He has made achieved a fine operational record. He has made numerous attacks against enemy shipping and has obtained some excellent and valuable photographs. Flying Officer Middlemas is an extremely keen and reliable operational pilot and has at all times pressed home his attacks with great determination.

Flying Officer William James MYERS (Can/J.18688), R.C.A.F., 441 (R.C.A.F.) Sqn.

This officer has displayed a high standard of skill and efficiency. He has completed very many and efficiency. He has completed very many sorties and has at all times pressed home his attacks with great determination inflicting much damage on the enemy. On one occasion his squadron encountered 12 enemy aircraft. Flying Officer Myers destroyed two before his aircraft sustained damage. Nevertheless, he continued the combat and destroyed a further enemy aircraft, bringing his total to three destroyed. This officer has set a worthy example.

Flying Officer Harold Ernest SAYEAU (Can/J.19922), R.C.A.F. 106 Sqn.

This officer has completed many sorties as captain of aircraft and has at all times displayed outstanding determination and skill. One night in August, 1944, he was detailed for a mine-laying mission. The operation called for the highest standard of accuracy and resolution as the target area was very strongly defended. However, regardless of personal danger the mines were laid with great precision despite intense fire from the ground defences. His devotion to duty has been unfailing.

Acting Flying Officer Ronald Thomas John Homes (173319), R.A.F.V.R., 101 Sqn.

During August, 1944, Flying Officer Homes was pilot of an aircraft detailed to attack Russelsheim. Soon after bombing the target the aircraft was engaged and damaged by an enemy fighter. One of the engines burst into flames, the hydraulic system was wrecked and both turrets were put out of action. The enemy aircraft continued the attack of action. of action. The enemy aircraft continued the attack but by skilful monoeuvres Flying Officer Homes eventually evaded it. Then with exceptional skill and courage, this officer extinguished the flames in his damaged engine and flew his crippled aircraft safely back to this country and effected a successful emergency landing. Throughout his operational career Flying Officer Homes has displayed the highest degree of skill and courage.

cting Flying Officer John Edgar Percival Oxborrow (176017), R.A.F.V.R., 44 Sqn.
One night in August, 1944, Flying Officer Oxborrow piloted an aircraft on a minelaying sortie. In view of the nature of the target extremely skilled and determined flying was required. Despite heavy opposition and the added difficulty of combating searchlight defences, this officer pressed home his attack. On the mining run his aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire and one engine was put out of action. Undeterred he continued was put of action. Ondeteried he commuted the run and placed his mines in the correct position. He then brought his aircraft safely back to base without incurring any further damage. Flying Officer Oxborrow has completed many operations against a wide range of targets and his skill and devotion to duty have set a fine example.

Acting Flying Officer Raoul John Wisker (N.Z.415255), R.N.Z.A.F., 75 (N.Z.) Sqn.

On one occasion in July, 1944, Flying Officer Wisker was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack a flying bomb site near Lizzieux. On the bombing run, the aircraft was repeatedly hit by anti-aircraft fire, one shell bursting immediately beneath the starboard wing causing the aircraft to go into a violent spiral dive. This officer managed to regain control, however, and despite severe damage to the aircraft, he made a second bombing run and executed a successful attack. It was later discovered that his aircraft had sustained 205 holes. Flying Officer Wisker has just completed a most successful tour of operations and throughout has proved himself to be a keen and conscientious pilot.

Officer Malcolm MacNett (Can/J.87594), R.C.A.F., 83 Sqn.

In August, 1944, Pilot Officer MacNeil was bomb aimer of an aircraft detailed for a sortic against a target in France. During the operation the aircraft was intercepted by enemy fighters and in the ensuing engagement sustained severe damage. The front gunner was trapped in his turret and the rear gunner lay severely injured as the aircraft fell out of control. The pilot succeeded in regaining control, however, and Pilot Officer MacNeil, who had displayed great coolness throughout, promptly went to the assistance of the front gunner whom he freed. He then went to the rear turret where he released the other injured comrade and gave him first aid. This done, he manned the rear turret until the English coast was reached. He displayed outstanding colness and determination under most harassing circumstances. Pilot Officer MacNeil has completed a large number of sorties against a wide range of targets.

Warrant Officer Cyril Aubrey Newark (743086), R.A.F.V.R., 75 (N.Z.) Sqn. Warrant Officer Newark has completed a large

number of sorties against a wide range of targets. He has invariably displayed a high degree of courage and determination and his example has been most inspiring. He participated in the first of the 1,000 bomber raids against Cologne in May, 1942, and again in June, 1942, against the Ruhr.

Warrant Officer Walker has participated in very many sorties including anti-shipping attacks and several successful reconnaissance flights. On a several successful reconnaissance flights. recent operation against an enemy convoy off the Dutch coast, despite the fact that his aircraft was severely damaged, this officer pressed home his attack with great skill and determination and brought his damaged aircraft safely back to base. His consistent good work has done much towards the successes achieved.

This officer has taken part in many sorties, several of them being attacks on enemy shipping. On these operations many vessels of varying classes have been successfully attacked despite heavy enemy opposition. Despite this, with exceptional coolness and determination, he successfully directed his captain to the target and by skilful use of his bomb sight made an accurate bombing attack.
