- 2. Except as provided in 3 below, Officers promoted to Lieutenant to be paid on the scale laid down for Officers entered as Cadet, and Officers promoted to Lieutenant (E), Ordnance Lieutenant, and Lieutenant (A) to be paid on the scale laid down for Engineer Officers entered as Cadet, entering the scale in accordance with the seniority as determined at I
- 3. Where it would be in excess of the rate appropriate under 2 above, officers to receive a special rate of pay consisting of the full pay of which they were in receipt as Warrant Officers or Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank, together with the sum of one shilling and tenpence per day. Officers granted such special rates to remain thereon until the increment due under the scale referred to in 2 above would render them eligible for a higher rate.
- 4. Officers placed on half pay to be paid on the scale laid down for Officers entered as Cadet.
- 5. Officers to come under the same rules for retirement as laid down for Officers entered as Cadet, but to be eligible for rates of retired pay laid down in Schedule II.
- 6. Pensions and gratuities for widows and allowances to children and other dependent relatives to be

The minimum rate of retired pay on completion of ten years' service from date of promotion to Warrant Officer, or on promotion to Lieutenant-Commander, or relative rank whichever is the earlier, will be:—

(i) On the invaliding scale, £190 a year. Additions for each complete year of subsequent service as above.

(ii) If compulsorily retired under Orders in Council of 21st April, 1922, or 15th August, 1941, £172 a year.

III. Gratuities to Officers permitted to retire at own request with less than 20 years' reckonable service, provided that a minimum of five years' service has been rendered since promotion to the rank of Acting Lieutenant or Lieutenant, or Lieutenant (E), Ordnance Lieutenant, or Lieutenant (A). After 10 years' reckonable service—£1,000, plus £100 for each additional complete year of reckonable service subject to a maximum gratuity of £1,000. IV. Officers promoted to the rank or relative rank of Commander or above to receive retired pay on the age and service scale, counting service in the rank

V. The term "service" in this Schedule shall mean service reckoning for retired pay or pension as laid down in the Naval Regulations from time to time.
