ARCHITECTS REGISTRATION COUNCIL OF THE UNITED KINGDOM. DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS.

REGULATION MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 13 OF THE ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931, AMENDING THE EXISTING DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS.

After Regulation 12 add the following Regulation:—

"12A. When the Council has passed a resolution under Regulation 12 directing the Registrar to remove the name of a registered person from the Register, the Council shall, unless it by resolution otherwise determines, cause a notice of its resolution and of the findings, or a report of the findings, of the Discipline Committee to be published."

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th January, 1945, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1944, to the amount of £110,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd January, 1945, to Saturday, the 27th January, 1945, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
