## DIPLOMATIC PRIVILEGES (EXTENSION) ACT, 1941.

His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, acting in pursuance of subsection (2) of Section One of the Diplomatic Privileges (Extension) Act, 1941 (4 & 5 Geo. 6, Ch. 7) hereby gives notice of the following amendments of the list, published in the London Gazette of the 14th April, 1944, of persons to whom immunities and privileges are extended under that Section, the said amendments taking effect as from the dates respectively specified after the names of the persons affected.

### BELGIUM.

## DIPLOMATIC PRIVILEGES (EXTENSION) ACTS, 1941 AND 1944.

In pursuance of subsection (2) of Section One of the Diplomatic Privileges (Extension) Act, 1941 (4 & 5 Geo. 6, Ch. 7), and Section Five of the Diplomatic Privileges (Extension) Act, 1944 (7 & 8 Geo. 6, Ch. 44), His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has compiled this amended list of the persons to whom immunities and privileges are extended under those Sections, the said list taking effect from the seventh day of March, nineteen hundred and forty-one, except where otherwise indicated by the dates specified after individual names.
