WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 18th day of January, 1945, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Westminster Abbey Measure, 1929, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Dean and Chapter of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster, of which Corporation Your Majesty is Visitor:

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 16th day of January, 1940, and relating to the Dean and Chapter of the said Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster, which Order was published in the London Gazette on the 19th day of January, 1940, it was provided that for the period of five years from the 29th day of September, 1939, there should continue to be paid the period of five years from the 29th day of September, 1939, there should continue to be paid out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter firstly, to the Fabric Fund, the annual sum of £3,250; secondly, for the yearly stipends of the Dean and the five Canons, the annual sum of £9,600, being £3,000 for the Dean, £1,200 for each of the two Canons to whose canonries Rectories are annexed and £1,400 for each of the other three Canons; and thirdly, for the maintenance of the services of Westminster Abbey and other expenses of the Dean and Chapter the residue of the said annual income:

"And whereas it was further provided by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 30th day of April, 1942, which Order was published in the London Gazette on the 1st day of May, 1942, that from and after the 25th day of December, 1941, in respect of any period during which the deanery or any canonry might be vacant for over three months the sums otherwise applicable out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter for the stipend of the dean or of that canon should be added to the the dean or of that canon should be added to the

Fabric Fund:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be expedient that the provisions of the said Orders of Your Majesty in Council

visions of the said Orders of Your Majesty in Council should continue in force for a further period:

"Now, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the said Westminster Abbey Measure, 1929, and after consultation as thereby prescribed with the Dean and Chapter of Westminster and with the approval of the Right Honourable John Allsebrook, Viscount Simon, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, exercising the authority of Your Majesty as Visitor as aforesaid, such approval being testified by his signature and seal being subscribed and affixed to this Scheme, do humbly recommend and propose that from and after the 29th day of September, 1944, first, there shall continue to be paid to the Fabric Fund out of the

annual income of the Dean and Chapter an annual annual income of the Dean and Chapter an annual sum of £3,250; secondly, there shall be applied out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter (next after the provision of the lastly mentioned annual sum of £3,250) the annual sum of £9,600 for the yearly stipends of the Dean and the five Canons, being £3,000 for the Dean, £1,200 for each of the two Canons to whose canonries Rectories are annexed and £1,400 for each of the other three Canons and and £1,400 for each of the other three Canons, and that these payments shall be taken to include and cover any compensation allowance or expense incurred by reason of the suspension of a Canonry and the reduction of the number of Canons from six to five; and thirdly, that the residue of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter after the specific appropriations hereinbefore directed shall be appropriated applied to the maintenance of the services of West-

applied to the maintenance of the services of Westminster Abbey and other expenses of the Dean and
Chapter; and that each of the foregoing provisions
shall continue in force only for a further period of
five years from the 29th day of September, 1944:
"Provided that where the deanery or any canonry
has been vacant for a period of three consecutive
months, then as respects any period thereafter during
which the vacancy continues, the sums hereinbefore
directed to be applied out of the annual income of
the Dean and Chapter for the stipend of the dean
or of that canon, as the case may be, shall not be directed to be applied out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter for the stipend of the dean or of that canon, as the case may be, shall not be so applied; and as respects that period the annual sums hereinbefore directed to be paid out of the said income to the Fabric Fund shall be increased by an amount equal to the sums which would, but for this proviso, be applicable as respects that period for the said stipend.

"And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose that the Dean and Chapter of Westminster shall annually within three months after the close of the year to which they relate send to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, the capitular accounts in full."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of London.
