

In pursuance of Section 129 of the Factories Act, 1937, and the Second Schedule to that Act, the Minister of Labour and National Service hereby gives notice that he proposes to make Special Regulations under Section 60 of the Act amending the Woodworking Machinery Regulations (S.R. & O. 1922 No. 1196 and S.R. & O. 1927 No. 207) made under Section 79 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901. The proposed amending regulations would extend the scope of the Woodworking Machinery Regulations, in view of the fact that the scope of Section 60 of the Act of 1937 is wider than the scope of Section 79 of the Act of 1901.

Copies of the draft Special Regulations, which may be cited as the draft Woodworking (Amendment of Scope) Special Regulations, 1945, may be purchased directly from H.M.
