On numerous occasions his aircraft has sustained damage from enemy fire but he has consistently pressed home his attacks and completed the sortie. In April, 1945, whilst leading his section on an armed reconnaissance, an enemy fighter force was encountered. In the ensuing combat, Captain Thomas shot down an enemy aircraft before his own was hit and badly damaged. The port aileron was almost shot away; the port main plane was also hit. In March, 1945, this officer piloted an aircraft detailed to attack the pontoon ferry terminals at Guardo Veneta on the river Po In making his attack, Pilot Officer Tibble went in at low level He was met with much light anti-aircraft fire His aircraft was repeatedly hit. Nevertheless, Pilot Officer Tibble pressed home his attack with precision. In this well executed operation, this officer displayed the highest standard of skill and gallantry. He has completed very many sorties and throughout has set a fine example of keenness and devotion to duty

Warrant Officer Lawrence Kenneth Kevan (1399897), RAFVR, 680 Sqn.

Warrant Officer Kevan was a crew member de-Warrant Officer Revan was a crew member de-tailed to participate in a reconnaissance of the Dodecanese in April, 1945. When crossing the coast of Rhodes Island the aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire. The pilot was mortally wounded. The aircraft went out of control. Acting with great promptitude, Warrant Officer Kevan righted great promptitude, Warrant Officer Kevan righted the aircraft. He was unable to move his stricken comrade from the pilot's seat but, in circumstances of difficulty succeeded in retaining a measure of control. Although not in any way as skilled as a regular pilot, Warrant Officer Kevan flew the aircraft several hundred miles over the sea and finally reached an airfield. Believing that his pilot was still alive, Kevan decided to attempt a landing, a task which he had never previously tried. Nevertheless, he brought the aircraft down safely. His example of courage, resource and devotion to duty will long be remembered. votion to duty will long be remembered
