## WAR DAMAGE ACT, 1943.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have determined, under the provisions of Section 70 of the War Damage Act, 1943, that in relation to all undertakings to which the said Section applies, and which carry on the manufacture of bricks, roofing tiles or hollow clay blocks from any hard and durable inorganic substance, other than refractory substances employed specifically on account of their refractory property, the "appropriate Department" for the purposes of the said Section shall be the Minister of Works.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th July, 1945, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1945, to the amount of £130,000,000.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

**PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.**

In pursuance of Section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, the Minister of Fuel and Power hereby gives notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, he has granted to the D'Arcy Exploration Company Limited of Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, London, E.C.2, two prospecting licences in respect of the areas referred to in the Schedule hereto, the boundaries of which are described by reference to the one-inch Ordnance Survey map, supplemented where necessary by reference to the six-inch Ordnance Survey map.

**SCHEDULE.**

(1) An area of approximately 198 square miles situate in the counties of Lancaster and York.

**Northern boundary:**

Commencing at a point at the cross roads in West Tansfield, N. Riding, Yorks, about one furlong north-west of point 146, thence in an easterly direction to point 148, turning north-east to the Gravel Pit, on to Thornborough and crossing the L.N.E.R. Masham Branch line the boundary continues along Back Lane in a general north-easterly direction to the Junction about 400 feet north of point 136, along Lime Lane to the Roman Road known as Leeming Lane which it follows south-eastwards to Ainderby House thence in an east and south-easterly direction by the road passing Ainderby Quernhow, Skipton-on-Swale, and Caulton Miniott, to Thirsk, through Thirsk by way of Station Road, Market Place and Ingramgate to the junction of Long Street and Barbeck.

**Eastern boundary:**

The boundary proceeds along The Street in a south-east and southerly direction to York passing Thormanby, Highfield and Easingwold to the junction with Ings Lane about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile, south-east of Stillington Grange, along Ings Lane through Huby to the junction of Skates Lane and Wigginton Road, along the road to Wigginton over Clifton Moor into York following Clarence Street, and Gillygate to its junction with Bootham where the boundary turns north-west for about a  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile, thence in a southerly direction, west of the railway line to Holgate Road.

**Southern boundary:**

The boundary runs from York in a north-westerly direction to Boroughbridge, along Holgate Road and Poppleton Road, over Moor Monkton, following the road passing the villages of Green Hamerton and Whixley to The Old Gravel Pit south of Boroughbridge Hall, thence to and along the Horse Fair, across the Bridge and following the north bank of the River Ure to the west side of the L.N.E.R. railway bridge: continuing along Boroughbridge Branch line in a south-western direction to its intersection with Thorndikes Lane, on through Staveley and Copgrove thence northwards along the road to Bishop Monkton, through the village, past the school and westwards to Ingerthorpe.

**Western boundary:**

From Ingerthorpe along How Hill Road, Whitcliff Lane, westwards along Hell Wath Lane and northwards by the foot-path leading to Old Mill Race along the south-east and north-eastern sides of Bishopton Lodge, past the Weir, Bishopton Grove, Bishopton Grange, northwards by Back Lane continuing north-westwards by Clotherholme Lane to Clotherholme Tower, Green Lane, Triplins Lane, Mustenfield Lane, New Holmtree Lane, past Slenningford Grange along the road leading to West Tanfield, the point of departure.

(2) An area of approximately 190 square miles situate in the counties of Durham and York.

**Northern boundary:**

The boundary commences at the north-west corner of the South Durham Iron and Steel Works situate between Greatham Street and Cliff House Road, West Hartlepool, and proceeds in an easterly direction along Cliff House Road, crossing Seaton Road and the Esplanade in a straight line to a point at low water mark of ordinary tides.

**South-eastern boundary:**

Low water mark is followed in a south-easterly direction past Carr House Sands to a point north of North Gare Breakwater, across the mouth of the River Tees to South Pier Light north of the South Gare Breakwater, continuing in a south and south-easterly direction at low water mark passing Redcar, Saltburn-by-the-Sea, Runswick Bay to the East Groyne, Sandsend Beach and along the groyne to the coast.

**Southern boundary:**

The boundary follows the coast north-westwards to Sandsend Bridge then turns inland to Sandsend Railway Station, and proceeds along the main road in a general westerly direction passing Lythe Bank, Ellenby Bank Top, along High Street, Newton Mulgrave, over Newton Mulgrave Moor, Roxby Low Moor, over Waupley Bridge, Waupley Moor, Liverton Moor, Girrick Moor, White Cross Swangs, past White Cross, Sand Hill, through Comondale, along Potter's Side Lane and the road crossing L.N.E.R. North Yorkshire & Cleveland Branch line at Petlars Bridge, passing the village of Kildale and Dundale Beck Farm to a point on the east side of the Ayton Branch, L.N.E.R. This branch line is followed in a north-westerly direction to Great Ayton Station, then westwards through Great Ayton by way of Dikes Lane, Eagle Street, High Street and Levenside to Tanton, Newby and to point 142 by Thornton. The direction is then south-west along the road past Maltby and Leven Bridge to Yarm Bank, continuing generally westward to the L.N.E.R. Darlington and Saltburn Branch line at Richmond Road Bridge below Yarm.

**Western boundary:**

Thence along the railway in a northerly and north-easterly direction passing through Thornaby-on-Tees Railway Station to the right bank of the Old River Tees, continuing north-west and crossing the river Tees at a point approximately 800 feet north-east of Blue House Point, thence following the north-east bank of Patrick Lake to Portract Heading across the Lake in a straight line to a point about 400 feet north-east of Villa Farm and to a point at the north-east corner of the Stockton Corporation Sewage Pits. The boundary then proceeds in a westerly direction to point 12, Lustrum Beck, north for about 700 feet and north-west to Albany Road, South Road and High Street Norton as far as Darlington Lane, along Darlington Lane, in a south-westerly direction past Toll Bar Cottage to L.N.E.R. Stockton & Castle Eden Branch line where the boundary turns north-west and follows the railway to a point on the south side of Thorpe Thewles-Greatham Road.

**North-western boundary:**

The boundary runs in a north-easterly direction along the road through Wolviaston and Newton Bewley, then turning north at Greatham High Street to Fence Gate it continues north-east passing the "Travellers Rest" to a point north of West Hartlepool Brick Works, along Windermere Road and crossing the L.N.E.R. Cliff House Branch to the Durham Iron and Steel Works, the point of departure.
