"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the award to such ratings on their discharge or demobilisation of a lump sum payment representing the capitalised value of the certificate allowances with interest at 3 per cent. for the period of their service from the 3rd September, 1939, or date of mobilisation, as the case may be, until the termination of hostilities or date of discharge, whichever is the earlier.

" SCHEDULE.

"1. An officer relieved of his Naval duties to enable him to act as a candidate or prospective candidate for Parliament will cease to be eligible for any full pay, half pay, allowances or Naval emoluments whatsoever from the date of ceasing Naval duty, subject to any extensions of pay to which he may be entitled in respect of passage, home or foreign service leave, or such other special extensions of pay as may be approved by the Admiralty.

"2. If an officer is elected, and decides to return forthwith to Naval service, pay will recommence from and including the date on which notification of his decision reaches the Admiralty. If on the other hand he decides that his parliamentary duties require him to remain unavailable for naval duty, pay will continue to be suspended. Should such an officer subsequently decide to return to Naval service, pay will be restored from and including the date on which notification of his decision reaches the Admiralty. If an officer is not elected, his pay will be restored as from the day following the declaration of the poll.

"3. Periods during which full pay, half pay and allowances are suspended under the foregoing provisions will not count as service for any time promotion, increment of pay, retired pay, or for any service gratuity or war gratuity.

"4. The foregoing rules will be applied, with such modification as the Admiralty may think fit, to officers standing for election to the Legislature of a Dominion or Colony."

Subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a less depth than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
