This airman displayed outstanding courage and initiative during the period 15th to 27th March, when an air strip, which was being used by aircraft engaged in the removal of wounded personnel, was subjected to intense shelling by the enemy. On the 23rd March only two aircraft remained on the strip, which was then being subjected to very accurate fire. The port engine of a Dakota aircraft, which had wounded personnel on board, failed to start. Displaying complete disregard for his own safety Sergeant Brown endeavoured to start the engine by hand. Whilst thus engaged, however, damage was inflicted by an enemy shell and it became necessary to remove the personnel. Sergeant Brown entered the aircraft and, by his calmness and efficiency, enabled all personnel to be removed to safety. Shortly afterwards he observed another aircraft which had landed on the strip. Despite the intense shelling. Sergeant Brown drove a jeep to Shortly afterwards he observed another aircraft which had landed on the strip. Despite the intense shelling, Sergeant Brown drove a jeep to where the aircraft had landed and advised the pilot to take off. The pilot succeeded in doing so. Although Sergeant Brown was in the centre of the area being shelled he drove the jeep back to an aircraft bay, thereby saving it from destruction. Sergeant Brown's outstanding bravery, in the face of accurate enemy shelling, resulted in the saving of an aircraft and a jeep, and ensured the safety of the wounded personnel.
