TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 5th October, 1945, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1945, to the amount of £130,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 8th October, 1945, to Saturday, the 13th October, 1945, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following

day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

REGULATIONS DATED THE 27TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1945, MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER ARTICLE 6 OF THE ORDER IN COUNCIL DATED THE 22ND DAY OF JULY, 1920, WITH RESPECT TO THE PERIOD OF PROBATION TO BE SERVED BY THE CLASSES OF CIVIL SERVANTS TO WHOM THE PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE 6 OF THE ORDER IN COUNCIL DATED THE 10TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1910, APPLIED.

In pursuance of Article 6 of the said Order of the 22nd day of July, 1920, the Treasury hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. After a certificate of qualification has been issued by His Majesty's Civil Service Commissioners in favour of a candidate, he shall enter on a period of probation of one year or such extended period not exceeding two years as may be prescribed by the Head of his Department. During this time his conduct and capacity shall be subjected to such tests as may be determined by the Head of his Department, and he shall not be finally appointed to the Public Service unless and until his probation shall have furnished to the Head of his Department satisfactory proof of his fitness.

2. If it should be considered necessary or desirable on medical grounds and in the case of scientific officers on medical or scientific grounds the period of probation may be further extended at the discretion of the Head of his Department, such extension not to exceed four years in the case of extension on medical grounds or two years in the case of extension on scientific grounds.

3. These Regulations shall be applicable to the classes of Civil Servants to whom the provisions of Article 6 of the said Order in Council of the 10th day of January, 1910, applied and shall come into force forthwith.

4. The Regulations dated the 2nd day of November, 1944, made by the Treasury under Article 6 of the said Order of the 22nd day of July, 1920, and Article 6 of the said Order in Council

of the 10th day of January, 1910, thereby repealed are and remain repealed respectively and these Regulations are hereby substituted for the said Regulations dated the 2nd day of November, 1944, and Article 6 of the said Order in Council of the 10th day of January, 1910.

HASLEMERE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

THE HASLEMERE PLANNING SCHEME.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council on the 18th September, 1945, resolved that, subject to the approval of the Minister of Town and Country Planning, a Varying Scheme in accordance with the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1932, and the Town and Country Planning Regulations, 1933, be prepared in respect of an area of land in the Urban District, described as follows:—

"Land enclosed between the Urban District and County Boundaries and a line following the south-east side of the A 286 Godalming-Haslemere-Chichester Road to its junction with Scotland Lane, thence along the south side of Scotland Lane to its junction with Tennyson's Lane, thence following the south-south-east, north-east and south-east boundary of Haste Hill Common, the south-east portion of Haste Hill where it joins the Petworth Road, and the southern side of the Rodgate-Haslemere-Liphook Road B 2131, from its junction with Haste Hill to the Urban District Boundary."

Under the provisions of the Haslemere Planning Scheme the area is one in which residential development is permissible, but, having regard to their desire to preserve the natural beauty of the area, the Council intend to apply to the Minister for an Order under Section 33 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, so as to secure that any further development permitted by the existing Planning Scheme may henceforth be more effectively controlled, restricted or prohibited.

The Scheme Map on which the said area is shown is open for inspection at the address stated below between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 and

5 p.m. (except Saturdays, when it will be from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.), and any suggestion for the inclusion or exclusion of any land in or from the area of the proposed Varying Scheme may be sent in writing to the Council, within twenty-one days of the 6th October, 1945.

CITY OF PORTSMOUTH.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (GENERAL INTERIM DEVELOPMENT) ORDER, 1945.

2. The carrying out of alterations to existing buildings and of operations required for the maintenance of existing buildings except alterations affecting the exterior of or required in connection with an alteration of the use of any building;

excepting

The carrying out of alterations to or operations required for the maintenance of any building the cost of which does not exceed the sum of Fifty Pounds per annum or twenty-five per cent. of the gross annual value per annum whichever is the greater.

Dourine (*exanthema coitale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.

No case of Fowl Pest (*pestis avium*) has been confirmed in Great Britain since the 11th January, 1937, the date as from which the disease was first notifiable. So far as is known, however, Fowl Pest has not existed in Great Britain since 1933.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.

Advertisements purporting to be issued in pursuance of Statutes or under Orders of Court will not be inserted unless signed or attested by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

Advertisements relating to Bills before Parliament will not be inserted unless signed by a Parliamentary Agent or a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

For each additional 5 lines or under—7s. 6d.

Table or tabular matter will be charged at the rate of £1 10s. per quarter page or part thereof.

(g) In Notices of Dissolution of Partnership, the signatures of the partners will not be charged for.
