### Northern Boundary:

Northern Boundary: Commencing at Hill End, Droitwich, the boundary follows the G.W.R. line in a north-easterly direction to a point where it crosses the road from Wychbold to Sharpway Gate, then turns eastwards along the roads passing Astwood Fm. Moorgate House, Lower Bentley, Bentley House and Foxlydiate, through Redditch to a point on Icknield St. east of Papermill Farm and from there passing Gorcott Hall to Forde Hall about one mile south of Tanworth. Tanworth.

### Eastern Boundary:

Eastern Boundary: This boundary runs in a southerly direction along roads passing College Farm, Ullenhall, Oldberrow, Wawensmoor, Shelfield Park Farm, Aston Cantlow. Binton and Long Marston to the bridge over the G.W.R. at point 173, and then follows the railway to its junction with the Oxford, Worcester and Wolverhampton Branch Line.

### Southern Boundary:

Thence in a westerly direction following the rail-way to Evesham Station and north westerly along the main road through Wyre Piddle to Shrub Hill Station, Worcester.

Western Boundary: The boundary follows the G.W.R. (Oxford, Worcester and Wolverhampton Branch) line to the bridge by the Inn, east of Fernhill Heath and from there along the road passing Martin Hussingtree to Hill End, Droitwich.

Northern Boundary: Commencing at the bridge over the River Severn in Worcester the boundary proceeds eastwards along the road to within  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile of Bredicot, then follows Low Hill, passing the village of Wyre Piddle to Evesham Railway Station, along the G.W.R. line to the Halt near Norton Grounds Farm and turns north-eastwards to the cross roads south of Mickleton. ### Eastern Boundary:

The boundary continues in a southerly direction through Chipping Camden, along Five Mile Drive, passing Bourton Hill House and Hinchwick to the cross roads I mile west of Condicote.

Northern Boundary: Commencing at Mickleton the boundary proceeds in a general easterly direction along the road through the villages of Upper Clopton, Armscote, Halford, Whatcote, Oxhill, Middle and Lower Tysoe, north-east along Edge Hill and to the cross roads about mile cost of Arlescote: I mile east of Arlescote:

Eastern Boundary: From here the boundary is coincident with the road to the outskirts of Banbury, then south-westward through Bloxham and South Newington to Chipping Norton.

Eastern Boundary: Thence along Foss Way in a south and south-westerly direction to point 552 at Northleach.

Southern Boundary: Proceeding westward the boundary road passes the villages of Shipton Solers and Little Witcombe, along the Roman Road past Hucclecote to Barn-wood Mental Hospital and then through Gloucester to the River Severn.

Western Boundary: From the Severn bridge the east bank of the river forms the boundary northward as far as Tewkesbury.

(6) An area of 187 square miles situate in the Counties of Gloucester and Oxford. Northern Boundary:

Commencing at the Foss Way cross roads in Stow-on-the-Wold the boundary road runs generally east-wards, passing Adlestrop Station, Cross Hands Inn and Salford and through Chipping Norton to the cross roads at Chapel House.

Eastern Boundary: Thence in a south-easterly direction along road A 34 branching off at a point about 1 mile south-east of Woodstock the boundary road continues to the railway bridge in Ensham.

Southern Boundary: The G.W.R. (East Gloucester Branch) is followed in a westerly direction to the road bridge about in mile south-east of the village of Curbridge, thence through Curbridge and passing Shilton and West-well to Aldsworth.

Western Boundary: The boundary then proceeds north-westward to Northleach and in a north-easterly direction along. Foss Way to Stow-on-the-Wold.

(7) An area of 188 square miles situate in the Counties of Oxford, Buckingham, Berkshire and Northampton.

Northern Boundary: The Town of Banbury forms the boundary.

Eastern Boundary:

From Banbury south-eastwards along the Oxford Canal to Nell Bridge, then road A 41 through Bices-ter to the fork roads near Wretchwick Farm the boundary passes the villages of Ambrosden, Arncott, and Studley to a point on road A 40 at Headington.

Southern Boundary: The boundary roads are A 40, A 420 and A 4145 from Headington to Ensham. 2

Western Boundary: Thence in a general northerly direction to road A 34 which is followed through Woodstock and Enstone to the cross roads at Chapel House and then road A 36r to Banbury. 

# (8) An area of 194 square miles situate in the County of Gloucester.

# Northern Boundary: Commencing at the cross roads near the centre of Gloucester the boundary proceeds in a south-easterly direction to the south corner of Tredworth Cemetery, in a north-easterly direction to point 85, south-east to the Mental Hospital, almost due north to a point on the Roman Road, along the Roman Road in a south-easterly direction for about 23 miles to the Smithy, thence in a general easterly direction along the road to Northleach passing Little Witcombe, Wistley Hill and Shipton to a point at the cross road on Foss Way near Northleach.

Eastern Boundary: Thence along Foss Way south-westwards through Cirencester to a point at the fork roads close to Jackaments Bottom.

### Southern Boundary:

The boundary continues along Foss Way passing Highfield Farm to the cross roads by Horse Garston, righted Farm to the cross roads by Horse Carston, north of Tetbury, turns north-westwards passing Chavenage Green to the road junction on the Nails-worth-Bath Road, south for  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile to the cross roads by Chalcot farm, Tetbury Road, along this road in a north-westerly direction to a point at the cross roads I mile south of Owlpen.

### Western Boundary:

The road in a northerly direction is followed, passing Owlpen and Nympsfield to the L.M. & S. Rly. (Bristol-Birmingham) Line at Frocester: the boundary coincides with the line to Gloucester.

(9) An area 193 square miles situate in the Counties of Gloucester and Oxford.

Northern Boundary: Commencing at the main cross roads by Northleach the boundary follows the Gloucester-Oxford Road as far as the P.I. Inst. where it branches off and continues along the road to Aldsworth, thence in an easterly direction to Westwell.

### Eastern Boundary:

Eastern Boundary: A southerly direction is taken by the boundary to Holwell and then south-westerly through East-leach Martin and Kempsford to a point on the Roman Road about 1 mile S.E. of Cricklade. The Roman Road is followed for about 2 miles thence turning west to Blunsdon Abbey and southwards passing Moredon and Rodbourne to the junction of the road leading to Swindon, continuing to a point near the Swindon Railway Works.

### Southern Boundary:

The boundary then follows the railway to a point on the Swindon-Malmesbury Road which is fol-lowed as far as the cross roads at Coped Hall, turns south-west along the road to the G.W. Rly. which is followed for about 4 miles to Dauntsey Station.

# Western Boundary:

Continuing in a general northerly direction the road boundary passes the villages of Dauntsey. Somerford, Charlton, to a point on Foss Way near Jackaments Bottom and along Foss Way through Cirencester to Northleach.

(10) An area of 192 square miles situate in the Counties of Oxford, Gloucestershire, Wilshire and Berkshire.

### Northern Boundary:

Northern Boundary: Commencing close to the church at Holwell the boundary proceeds in a general easterly direction along the road passing the villages of Shilton, Brize Norton, and Curbridge to the road bridge over the G.W. railway (East Gloucester Branch), and follows the railway for about 6 miles to the bridge on the Eynsham-Oxford Road.

Eastern Boundary: Following the Eynsham-Oxford Road the boundary branches off at the fork roads just before the Church in Botley, continues in a south-easterly direction along road A.420 to the fork roads at Upwood Park and from there to Wantage Road Station (G.W.R.).

Southern Boundary: The boundary coincides with the railway line in a westerly direction for about 9 miles to the bridge by Ruffinswick Farm, continues north-westward to Highworth, skirting Beckett Park and then along the footpath to Friars Farm. From Highworth the boundary follows roads B.409 and A.419 as far as Seven Bridges.

Western Boundary: From Seven Bridges the boundary proceeds along the road in a general north-easterly direction passing North Farm, the village of Kempsford, crossing road A.417 and the G.W.R. (East Gloucestershire Branch) line to point 278, thence through Eastleigh Martin to Holwell.

(11) An area of 192 square miles situate in the Counties of Berkshire, Oxford and Buckingham.

Northern Boundary: Commencing at the fork roads by Wretchwick Farm about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile S. of Wretchwick the boundary pro-ceeds along Ackeman Street for about  $8\frac{1}{2}$  miles in an easterly direction to the L.N.E. railway bridge.

Eastern Boundary: The boundary follows the railway southwards to Wotton Station and then continues along the road leading through Dorton, Chilton, Long Crendon, Thame, Moreton, Tetsworth and Stoke Talmage to Cutt Mill where road B.480 is followed for about 14 miles north-westwards, then in a southerly direc-tion along the road from Chalgrove to Benson and to the cross-roads south-east of Wallingford Castle.

Southern Boundary: Tswrf Road 4130 is followed in a westerly direction to its junction with the Milton Hill road. The boundary turns south for about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile and then continues along road A.417 to Wantage.

### Western Boundary:

Turning in a general north-westerly direction the boundary proceeds along the Tramway Track and roads A.338 and A.4km<sup>c</sup> through Oxford, Headington, Studley, Upper and Lower Arncott and Ambrosden to Wretchwick Farm.

(12) An area of 183 square miles situate in the Counties of Buckingham and Oxford.

Northern Boundary: <sup>29</sup>Commencing at the L.N.E. railway bridge crossing Akeman Street, 2 miles north of Wotten Station the boundary proceeds in a south-easterly direction along Akeman Street to Aylesbury.

### Eastern Boundary:

Eastern Boundary: Continuing in a southenly direction the G.W. rail-way is follows the to Little Kimble. From there the boundary follows the road, passing Gt. Kimble, White-leaf Cross, Redland End, through Monkton Wood to Darvilkshill, along Grimms Bitch at the side of Park Wood to road 4010 at Brendenham. Thence through West Wycombe and past Besborough Castle to point 513, opposite the hospital, where the boundary turns east to road A.404 which it follows southwards to the River Thames at Marlow.

Southern Boundary: The boundary follows the north bank of the river in a general westerly direction to the bridge at Henley then coincides with road B.480 north-west-wards to the cross-roads at Seymour Green. From here the boundary roads run south and westwards by way of Swyncombe and Cow Common to road A.423 and to Benson.

Western Boundary: Continuing from Benson in a general northerly direction the boundary roads pass the villages of Chalgrove, Stoke Talmage, Tetsworth, Thame, Easington and Dorton to Wotten Station L.N.E. railway, and from here the line is followed to Akeman Street.

(13) An area of 196 square miles situate in the Counties of Gloucester, Somerset and Wiltshire.

### Northern Boundary:

Northern Boundary: Commencing at a point on the Roman Road I field south of Owlpen and I mile west of Kingcote the boundary proceeds in an easterly direction following the road on the south side of Kingscote Park to Calcot Farm then northwards along the Nailsworth Road for  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile to a footpath which is followed to Chaverage Green thence to the cross-roads north of Tetbury where the boundary follows a sporth-easterly direction along London Road to Jackaments Bottom Farm at the Junction with Foss Way.

### Eastern Boundary:

Continuing along the main road to Malmsbury in a southerly direction the boundary road branches off the main road near Five Lanes and passes through the villages of Charlton, Little and Great Somerford, Dauntsey, Bradenstoke-cum-Clark, New Zealand, Catcomb and Charlcutt to the junction of North Street and High Street, Calne.

### Southern Boundary:

Thence in a general westerly direction along the road through Chippenham, Box, Batheaston and to a point at the junction of Bailbrook Lane and Brick Lane in Bailbrook.
