(g) to keep Relief Order Books and to make entries therein in accordance with the provisions of article 22 of the Public Assistance Order, 1930, whenever he considers applications for relief or reconsiders cases in which relief has been granted;

(h) to report to the appropriate Committee of Sub-Committee of the Council all cases in which an application for relief has been refused, or in which on reconsideration relief has been discontinued; and

(i) to carry out such other duties relating to the grant of relief as may be assigned to him by the Council.
