Rome, Sept. 3. N.S.

THE Pope has complained to the Spanish Ambassador, of the Inquisitor General of Spain's being banished from Madrid, without the Nuncio's being made acquainted with it, or any Reason given for the same; To which 'tis said the Ambassador only answered, That the King of Spain thought it necessary for his Service to remove the said Inquisitor General from Court, and let the Pope understand, that 'twas done by the Advice of the Court of France. The Dutchess-Dowager of Ursini, who is to accompany the new Queen of Spain in her Journey to Madrid, set out from hence last week for Turin.

Turin, Sept. 12. The 8th Instant the Marquis de Castell Rodrigo, Ambassador from Spain, made his Publick Entry into this City, and had Audience of the Dutchess of Savoy, and of the Dutchess-Dowager. The 9th, he had Audience of the Prince of Piedmont, and the Princess of Savoy. The 10th, he waited upon the Princess, and delivered to her a rich Present of Jewels. The 11th was performed, the Ceremony of her Marriage with the King of Spain, who was represented by the Prince of Carignan, and in the evening she received the Compliments of the whole Court; She was likewise Complimented on the part of the Duke of Savoy, her Father, by the Count d'Alex Captain of his Guards, who was dispatched hither for that purpose. This day she set out for Nice, where a Squadron of French Gallies, with those of Naples and Sicily, lie ready to attend her to Barcelona.

Venice, Sept. 16. The last Letters from Brescia give an Account, that the French Army is encamped between Veggio and Rudiano, and have two Bridges over the River Oglio. The Imperialists are encamped at Chiari, their Right Wing extending to Palazzuolo, and their Left to Caffresano, and the two Armies are so near, that their advanced Guards are not above 300 Paces asunder. The German Parties make frequent Excursions on the other side the Oglio, and bring back a great number of Prisoners, and much Booty. The Regiment of Dragoons of Vendome, and a Regiment of Hussars, are expected in the Imperial Camp the 19th, and the Regiment of Foot of Rouventlau the 21st; and 'tis said, that when these Reinforcements are arrived, the Imperial Army will be 20000 strong. Great Complaints come daily from the Country of Brescia, of the Disorders committed by the French Soldiers, who plunder and waite whole Towns and Villages, without sparing even the Churches, insomuch that the whole Country is ready to take up Arms and join with the Germans, who gain their Affection by observing a strict Discipline; so that notwithstanding the great number of Troops they have in Chiari and other Places, the Inhabitants thereof continue their Trade and Commerce without any interruption.

Madrid, Sept. 8. The King of Spain began his Journey on the 5th Instant to Barcelona, having committed the Administration of the Government during his Absence to the Cardinal of Portocarrero, with an unlimited Power, which has not only dissatisfied those of the late Regency, who expected to have been joined in this Commission with the Cardinal, but gives a general Dissatisfaction to see such an absolute Authority lodged in him. Count Marquis, Ambassador of France, attends the King in his Journey, as does also the Ambassador of Savoy. Money is so scarce at this Court, that the necessary Sums for this Journey were raised with much difficulty, and all the Persons of Quality who attend the King go at their own Expence. Before his departure, he gave Orders to the Governots of all the Spanish

Sea-Ports, not to permit any English or Dutch Men of War to enter into the same. The French Company trading to Senegal, have undertaken to supply the Spanish Plantations in the West-Indies with Negro's, in which the French King is to be concerned a Fourth Part. They write from Cadix, that Count d'Esraes continues there with his Squadron, which consists at present of 26 Men of War, and 15 Gallies.

Vicma, Sept. 14. The Emperor and Empress, with the whole Court, came hither the 10th Instant from Ebersdorf, to be present at the Yearly Procession for the Deliverance of this City from the Siege of the Turks in the year 1683. which was performed the 11th, and their Imperial Majesties returned the same day to Ebersdorf. There being a great number of French Officers taken Prisoners by the Imperialists in Italy, several Overtures have been made to Prince Eugene for settling a Cartel in order to their Releasement, of which he has given the Emperor an Account, but no Resolution is yet taken thereupon. Cardinal Lamberg, the Emperor's First Commissioner at the Imperial Diet, is shortly expected here from his Bishoprick of Passaw. They write from Hermannstadt in Transylvania, that Count Rabutin, who Commands the Imperial Forces in those Parts, was gone from thence to view the Fortifications of the Frontier Towns, and to give Directions for repairing and adding some new Works to the same.

Dresden, Sept. 16. The Prince of Farstemberg, Governor of Saxony for the King of Poland, arrived this day from Warsaw. The States of this Electorate met yesterday. Quarters are preparing in these Parts for the Saxon Forces, which are shortly expected from Livonia.

Cologne, September 23. The Elector of Cologne refusing to give any farther Answer to the States of this Country assembled at Bonn, concerning his Engagement with France, and his new-raised Forces, the Diet broke up yesterday without entering upon any of the Matters he had proposed for their Consideration, or granting the Supplies he demanded, tho' 'tis said he threatened, if they did not comply, to put the Country under Military Execution. The Deputies from the Chapter have delivered to him a Letter to justify their Proceedings, in which all the Members thereof have been very unanimous. The Elector continues to make new Levies, and puts them into Bonn, Rhyenberg, and Keyferswaert.

Hamburgh, Sept. 23. The Danish Foot, which are to enter into the Service of the States-General, are drawn together near Itzehoe, and will forthwith be put on board the Vessels that are provided at Geluckstad and Wistfisch, to transport them to Holland; The Horse are to pass the Elbe to-morrow, in order to march thither through the Country of Lunburgh. They write from Dantzick, that the Saxon Forces continue their March hither through Prussia. Letters from Lisbon to Genoa & Cas,

day, the King of Sweden was encamped with his Army within a Mile of that Place, and that he had forbid the Exportation of Corn and other Provisions out of Courland.

Brussels, Sept. 27. The Marquis of Bedmar returned hither the 25th Instant, from viewing the Lines and other Fortifications in Flanders. Yesterday Marshal Boufflers came to this Place, and was present in the Meeting of the Council of State, which lasted several hours. He intends to continue here the whole Winter, and has taken a House for that purpose.

Loos, Sept. 27. His Majesty being informed, That the French King has, upon the Death of the late King James, declared the Pretended Prince of Wales King of England, Scotland, and Ireland; His Majesty has thought fit to send Orders to the Earl of Manchester, his Ambassador in France, to return immediately to England, without taking any Leave of that Court. The Duke of Cell, and the Electoral Prince of Hanover, have been entertained here and at Dieren since their arrival with Hunting the Stag, and Shooting. Their Highnesses design to take their Leave of His Majesty to-morrow morning, in order to return home. His Majesty will go the same day to Breda, to review the English Forces that are encamped near that Place, and intends to return hither the beginning of the next week. The Earl of Marlborough came last Saturday from the Hague, and went this morning to the Camp near Breda.

Hague, Septemb. 27. The States of Holland and Westfriseland are Adjourned to the 6th of the next Month; about which time Deputies from the several Colleges of the Admiralty are to come hither, to confer with those of the States. The Sieur Stucken, Envoy from Denmark, had yesterday a Conference with the Deputies of the States-General, to adjust several Matters in relation to the Danish Forces that are put into the Service of this State, and are shortly expected in these Parts. Monsieur Smettau is coming hither with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Prussia.

Paris, Sept. 28. N. S. Letters from the French Camp at *Vrago* in Italy of the 19th Instant say, the two Armies were still in the same Situation, and that the Germans were building Baracks, and raising several Works to secure their Wintering in those Parts. They frequently send out strong Parties to make Excursions between the *Oglia* and the *Adda*; and the French Generals having a Jealousie, that the Imperialists design to possess themselves of *Canonica* on the *Adda*, have given Orders for forming a flying Camp near that Place, under the Command of the Duke de *Sesto*. The French, Spanish, and Savoy Troops have suffered very much since the beginning of this Campaign, inasmuch that we are assured from good hands, that they have lost 18000 Men by the War, Sicknes, and Desertion. Most of those who were wounded at the Action at *Chiari* are since dead; the Air of that Country seems generally not to agree with the French, which, together with the excessive Price of Provisions, has occasioned a great Desertion; and even many Officers, 'tis said to the number of 200, have left the Army. The worst Butchers Meat is sold in the French Camp for 8 Sols a Pound, Chickens a Crown apiece, and other Provisions proportionable. The Germans have surprized a great Convoy that was going with Sick and Wounded Men from the French Army to *Cremona*, (where they have established their chief Hospital) and took a great number of Prisoners, with all their Ba-

gage. The Duke of Savoy will return to *Turin*, and the Prince of *Vaudemont* to *Milan*, about the end of this Month. A considerable number of French Forces are ordered towards the Frontiers of *Italy*, but 'tis believed they will not pass the *Alpes* before the Spring. The Duke d'*Enghien*, eldest Son to the Duke de *Bourbon*, and Grandson to the Prince of *Condé*, is very ill; as is likewise the Marquis of *Villars*, late Envoy from this Crown to *Vienno*, who is now at *Turin*. A new Tax is laid upon Cards, and 'tis believed. *Basset*, and other Games formerly forbid, will now be allowed to improve this Fund.

Westminster, Sept. 18. The Parliament met this day, and was further Prorogued till the 30th of *October* next.
