NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1936.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, the Minister of National Insurance and the Minister of Health, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 102 and 118 of the National Health Insurance Act, 1936, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, to make regulations to be entitled the National Health Insurance (Approved Societies) Amendment Regulations, 1946.

On account of urgency, the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, the Minister of National Insurance and the Minister of Health, under section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made regulations dated December 17, 1945, and entitled the National Health Insurance (Approved Societies) Amendment Regulations (No. 2), 1945, to come into operation forthwith as provisional rules and to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of section 1 of that Act.

LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

River Trent Catchment Board.

Bramcote Brook Internal Drainage District.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming a Scheme submitted to him by the River Trent Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of that Act, making provision for the following matters:—

1. The constitution of a new internal drainage district to be known as the Bramcote Brook Internal Drainage District.

2. The constitution of a Drainage Board for the said Internal Drainage District.

3. Certain matters supplemental to the above provisions;

and that the Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament unless within thirty-one days from the date of this Notice a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial; praying that the Order shall not become law without confirmation by Parliament.
