WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACTS.

The Minister of National Insurance hereby gives notice that on the 30th January, 1946, he made a Scheme under Section 47 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925, as extended by the Workmen's Compensation (Silicosis and Asbestosis) Act, 1930, and the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1943, to provide for payment of compensation by employers of workmen who contract pneumoconiosis as a result of their employment in the operation of coal trimming in any ship, barge or lighter, in any dock or harbour, or at any wharf or quay.

The Scheme, which may be cited as the Shipping Industry ((Pneumoconiosis) Compensation Scheme, 1946, will come into force on the 1st March, 1946, and will apply to all workmen employed in the operation specified, on or after that date.
