For courage, exceptional skill and devotion to duty in carrying out the first deck-landings of Mosquito and Vampire. In doing so he has been the first pilot ever to land on the deck of a carrier, a twin-engined aircraft (Mosquito) and a pure jet-propelled aircraft (Vampire). The success of these great strides in Naval Aviation has been largely due to his exceptional flying skill.

Temporary Acting Lieutenant - Commander Charles Alexander POTTINGER, R N R (Bath)

When a serious fire broke out in Alexandria Harbour on the 19th April, 1945, due to a serious under-water escape of petrol, while the U.S. Tanker Briar Creek was discharging, Commander Pottinger,

Assistant King's Harbour Master, with great efficiency, speed and good seamanship, used tugs to get the Briar Creek, which was a potential source of great danger, safely out of harbour, thus preventing a major disaster
