"And whereas by Order in Council dated 24th March, 1944, sanction was given to the institution of the non-substantive ratings of Safety Equipment Assistant and Safety Equipment Worker:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that the duties of the maintenance and repair of safety equipment and of handling aircraft should be laid on the Seaman Branch in a similar way to Gunnery as part of the fighting equipment of Your Majesty's Ships, and that two new non-substantive branches to be termed Safety Equipment Rating and Aircraft Handler respectively should be introduced to cover the duties, and also a new non-substantive rate of Air Boatswains Mate to be held by an experienced rating who will be able to instruct in all the duties performed by ratings in both non-substantive branches:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the new ratings as shown in the subjoined table with effect from a date determined by us, with the daily rates of non-substantive pay specified:—

And whereas His Majesty was pleased to ratify a convention done at London on the 2nd June, 1934, in revision of the International Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property signed at Paris on the 20th March, 1883:

And whereas His Majesty, by the Patents &c. (Convention countries) (No. 1) Order, 1938 (S.R. & O. 1938, No. 767) was pleased to declare, *inter alia*, that Luxemburg was a Convention country for the purposes of some (but not all) of the provisions of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1938:

And whereas Luxemburg has acceded to the said convention done at London on the 2nd June, 1934, and by reason of such accession, it is expedient that Luxemburg should be declared to be a Convention country for the purposes of all the provisions of the Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Him as aforesaid and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. Luxemburg is a Convention country for the purposes of all the provisions of the Act.

2. The Patents &c. (Convention countries) (No. 1) Order, 1938 (S.R. & O. 1938, No. 767), in so far as it relates to Luxemburg, is hereby revoked.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. Ch. 63), shall apply to this Order as if it were an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order may be cited as the Patents &c. (Luxemburg) Order, 1946.

"And whereas we have prepared this Scheme accordingly after consultation with the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese of *Leicester* who have offered no objection thereto:

"And whereas the said *Guy Vernon*, Bishop of *Leicester*, has approved the Scheme and in testimony of such approval has appended his signature to the Scheme:

"And whereas the Right Honourable *Clement Richard Attlee*, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has signified to us his consent to the preparation and submission of the Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the endowments and property belonging to the See of *Leicester* or held in trust therefor or for the Bishop thereof are described and referred to in the Schedule hereunder written:

"And whereas the Bishop is required by the Episcopal Pensions Measure 1926 to pay to us an annual contribution for the purpose of that Measure of £52 10s. 0d.:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners recommend and propose that upon and from the 1st day of January, 1946, all the endowments securities and other property described and referred to in the said Schedule shall vest in us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners pursuant to the said Measure and that we shall be entitled absolutely to the benefit rents and profit thereof upon and from that date:

"And we further recommend and propose that we shall pay to the Bishop for the time being of the See by equal quarterly instalments in respect of the quarters ended on the 31st day of March, the 30th day of June, the 30th day of September and the 31st day of December in every year the first such instalment to be the full quarter's payment due for the quarter ended on the 31st day of March 1946 an annual stipend comprising the sum of £2,000 and also such sum, not exceeding £500 in any one year, as we shall have been duly satisfied has been expended by him in connection with the travelling required in and for the carrying out of his official duties and obligations as Bishop:

"And we further recommend and propose that the annual contribution payable to us by the Bishop, for purposes of pension, shall notwithstanding the reduction hereby effected in the stipend of the Bishop be £52 10s. 0d. or such amount as may be fixed by the Episcopal Pensions Measure, 1945, as the annual contribution in respect of the bishopric.

" THE SCHEDULE.

" Part I.

"All that Episcopal Residence or Mansion House known as *Bishop's House Leicester* together with the *Chapel Cottages* and other buildings and outbuildings and the gardens pleasure grounds and other the appurtenances thereunto belonging situate at the corner of *London Road* and *Holmfild Road* in the City of *Leicester* as the same premises are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and thereon verged red.

" Part II.

"The annual payment of £3000 charged upon our Common Fund by an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 21st day of December 1937 and duly published in the *London Gazette* on the 24th day of the same month.

" Part III.

"The fund held by us for the repair of the Episcopal Residence of the See of *Leicester* and consisting at 31st October 1945 of a sum of £1,342 5s. 8d. Local Loans 3 per cent. Stock and a sum of £264 13s. 9d. cash.

" Part IV.

"All those the Pastoral Staff, Cope and other episcopal insignia, ecclesiastical ornaments, pictures, books, muniments, electric light fittings, furniture and other goods and chattels belonging to the Bishop

of Leicester in right of his dignity and not in his private capacity and being in the nature of heirlooms of the See of Leicester as the same are described and set forth in an inventory to be deposited by us in the Diocesan Registry of the Diocese of Leicester."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Leicester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Lichfield (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme) for effecting the union of the benefice and ecclesiastical parish of Blore Ray, the benefice and ecclesiastical parish of Okeover and the benefice and ecclesiastical parish of Ilam all situate in the diocese of Lichfield:

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices and Parishes*—The benefice of Blore Ray, the benefice of Okeover and the benefice of Ilam shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of "The United Benefice of Ilam with Blore Ray and Okeover" and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Parish Church*—The Church at Ilam shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"3. *Taking effect of union*—Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Horace John Funge Graves, if he is then incumbent of the benefice of Ilam, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Registers*—Upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the church of Okeover and at the Church of Blore Ray shall be sent by the incumbent of the united benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. *Parsonage House*—Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Ilam shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"6. *Patronage*—After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patron of the benefice of Blore Ray and the patron of the benefice of Ilam alternately, the patron of the benefice of Blore Ray having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union."

Thence along roads through Durweston and proceeding south-west to Shepherds' Corner Farm, south-east to the Travellers' Rest, westward to Delcombe Wood, south-east to Milton Park Farm, and west to Anstey Cross. From here in a general southerly direction the boundary roads pass the villages of Hartfoot Lane, Cheselbourne and Lower and Higher Whitcombe to point 250 about a half mile south of Warmwell, thence southwards through Poxwell and Osmington to the starting point at Shortlake.

- (2) An area of 88 square miles situate in the Counties of Dorset, Hampshire and Wiltshire.

North Western Boundary.

Commencing at Iwerne Minster the boundary roads proceed eastward to point 614, northward to Hill Farm, continuing in a general north-easterly direction passing Ashmore, Win Green, Monks' Down, through Berwick St. John to Alvediston whence the river Ebble is followed to Coombe Bissett.

Eastern Boundary.

From Coombe Bissett the direction is generally south-westerly to Witchampton along the road passing New Farm, Martin Drove End, Woodyates, along Ackling Dyke and the Roman Road to a point about a mile south-west of Gussage All Saints. At this point the boundary turns south-east for about 1½ miles, then south-west through More Crichel to Witchampton.

Southern Boundary.

Running due west to Blandford Forum railway station the boundary road passes through Tarrant Rushton.

Western Boundary.

From Blandford Forum the boundary is coincident with the railway to a point where it is crossed by road A 350 which is followed to the starting point at Iwerne Minster.

- (3) An area of 80 square miles situate in the County of Hampshire (Isle of Wight).

Commencing at a point on the coast at Freshwater Bay the boundary proceeds north to the road from Freshwater which is followed eastward, passing East Afton, Calbourne, Carisbrooke, Downend and Brading to the Battery at Culver Cliff. Thence in a straight line to Sandown Pier, continuing along the coast by way of Shanklin, Ventnor and St. Catherine's Point to Atherfield Point and from here in a straight line across Brightstone and Compton Bays to the starting point in Freshwater Bay.
