TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 8th March, 1946, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 to 1945, to the amount of £140,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 11th March, 1946, to Saturday, the 16th March, 1946, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

TEMPORARY (RECONSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE MINOR AND MANIPULATIVE GRADES OF THE CIVIL SERVICE TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

The Civil Service Commissioners with the approval of the Treasury have made the following Regulations:—

1. (1) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(2) No person may compete in more than three examinations under these Regulations.

2. Every candidate must at the time of his or her examination be an established member of one of the Minor and Manipulative Grades of the Civil Service within the scope of the National Whitley Council, or a member of an unestablished grade corresponding to an established grade the members of which are eligible to compete; except that Clerical Assistants and members of the typing grades will not be eligible to compete. In the case of an officer who is substantively an established member of one of the Minor and Manipulative Grades of the Civil Service within the scope of the National Whitley Council, but who has received acting promotion, it is the substantive grade which determines eligibility under this Regulation.

3. (1) Every candidate must have been born on or after the 2nd August, 1909, and must at the time of his or her examination either (a) have had not less than three years' continuous full-time service on duties proper to an adult class, or (b) have attained the age of 22 and have had not less than one year's continuous full-time service on duties proper to an adult class.

(2) For the purpose of this Regulation time spent in H.M. Forces, the Women's Services or other forms of national service will be reckoned towards the required period of service on duties proper to an adult class if the candidate's Department certifies that during the period in question he or she was regarded as a member of the Department's staff and that but for the war he or she would have been employed on such duties during that period.

4. Candidates under these Regulations shall be divided into three Sections, namely, Section I for candidates who complete or have completed the prescribed period of service after the 2nd August, 1945; Section II for candidates who completed the prescribed period of service on or before the 2nd August, 1945, and who were born on or after 3rd August, 1918; and Section III for candidates who

completed the prescribed period of service on or before the 2nd August, 1945, and who were born on or before 2nd August, 1918.

5. Every candidate must be either

(a) a natural-born British subject

(i) having at least one parent who is or was at the time of death a British subject; or

(ii) of any other parentage, provided that he or she has resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his or her appointment; or

(b) a naturalized British subject who has resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his or her appointment; or

(c) a British subject who, although not fulfilling the requirements of sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) satisfies the Commissioners that he or she is so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his or her favour.

6. (1) Every candidate must satisfy the Commissioners as to his or her health and character.

(2) The Commissioners reserve the right to give such preference to disabled persons or to particular classes of disabled persons as may be necessary in order to give effect to any general policy regarding the employment of such persons which may be adopted by His Majesty's Government provided that the disability is not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of ordinary clerical duties.

7. Every woman candidate must be unmarried or a widow and if appointed will ordinarily be required to resign her appointment on marriage.

8. (1) Every candidate must apply on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given by the Commissioners. The application must be accompanied by a certificate from the authorities of the Department in which the candidate is serving, in the space provided on the application form, that he or she satisfies the conditions laid down in Regulations 2 and 3 and that his or her service has been approved.

(2) Every candidate shall pay an application fee of 5s. od. for each examination to which he or she desires to be admitted. The fee must be paid when the Application Form is sent in.

9. (1) Those candidates who on their Application Form and the resulting enquiries are found to be *prima facie* eligible will undergo a written examination consisting of papers in English, Handwriting and Arithmetic, a General Paper and a test of General Intelligence.

(2) Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as will satisfy the Commissioners.

10. (1) Each candidate shall be examined at such place either in the United Kingdom or abroad and at such time as the Commissioners may determine, provided that no Service candidate shall be obliged to take the examination until not less than six months after the completion of his or her service.

(2) Service candidates must indicate on their Application Forms whether or not they will be prepared, subject to the approval of their Commanding Officer, to take the examination while still serving. If, on being notified of the date fixed for his or her examination, a candidate wishes it to be postponed, he or she should apply as soon as possible to the Commissioners, who will consider whether, having regard to the public interest, they can give their consent. A civilian candidate who for any reason wishes to postpone his or her examination must apply in the same manner.

11. The order of merit of the candidates in each Section shall be determined by the aggregate of the marks they have obtained in the several subjects.

12. The number of vacancies to be filled by candidates in each Section shall be determined by the Commissioners, having regard to the number of applications from candidates in each Section.

13. It is the intention that, of the total number of vacancies in each Section to be filled from the whole series of examinations under these Regulations,

(a) men Service candidates shall receive not less than one half; and

(b) of the remainder women Service candidates shall receive not less than the proportion yielded

by the ratio of their applications to the total number of applications from all candidates except men Service candidates.

Provided that in either case a sufficient number of Service candidates reach the required standard in the examination.

14. For the purposes of these Regulations candidates shall be regarded as Service candidates if they have rendered whole-time service during any period after the 25th day of May, 1939, in

(a) the Armed Forces of the Crown;

(b) the Mercantile Marine or the Merchant Navy; or

(c) any of the Women's Services, that is to say, any of the capacities mentioned in the First Schedule to the Disabled Persons (Employment) Act, 1944.

15. The list of successful candidates at each examination shall be determined by the Commissioners having regard to the intention expressed in Regulation 13 and to the number and ability of the competitors.

16. Of the candidates next in order of merit to those declared successful in any examination a certain number at the discretion of the Commissioners may be classified as reserve candidates and considered for appointment in conjunction with the results of a later examination.

17. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (that is, the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, or the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland, as the case may be) has been notified to the Commissioners.

18. Every successful candidate will be required to pay a further fee of 10s. before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

19. It will rest with the Commissioners to determine the Department to which each successful candidate shall be assigned. In making the assignment the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service and will have regard, so far as vacancies permit, to the previous Departmental experience of the candidates and the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them. Subject to these conditions the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

20. These Regulations will come into force immediately and will apply to examinations among members of the Minor and Manipulative Grades of the Civil Service for appointment to the Clerical Classes until the resumption of such examinations under normal conditions.
