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To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

We Your Majesty's most Loyal Subjects, the High Sheriff, Justices of the Peace, Grand Jury, with other Gentlemen and Freeholders of the County of Cumberland, Assembled at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said County, think our selves in Allegiance and Duty bound to Assent Your Majesty's Just Title to the Imperial Crown of this Kingdom; at this time especially, when the French King has thought fit to Own and Acknowledge another Pretended King of Great Britain: And we being deeply sensible of so great an Affront done to Your Majesty, do heartily Assure Your Majesty, That we are Unanimously resolved to Defend Your Majesty's Person, and to Support Your Majesty's Lawful Rights, and the Ancient Liberties of this Kingdom, (together with the Reformed Religion in the Established Church of England, of whose Faith Your Majesty is the Great and Prosperous Defender) to the last Hazard of our Lives, and all that is Dear to us. Witness our hands the Eighth Day of October, in the Thirteenth Year of Your Majesty's happy Reign.

The Three following Addresses were presented by John Brewer Esq; One of the Representatives in Parliament, of the Town and Port of New-Romney, and Recorder of Deale.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

The Humble Address of Your Majesty's Loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Jurats, and Commonalty, of the Town and Port of New Romney, (one of the Cinque-Ports) in the County of Kent.

Amongst the many Blessings we enjoy under Your Majesty's Wise Administration and Government, we have a just and deep Sense of your Great Wisdom and Goodness, in Recommending from the Throne, and giving Your Royal Sanction to that Bill for the Succession of the Crown in the Protestant Line, for the Preservation of the Peace and Happiness of this Kingdom, and Security of the Protestant Religion by Law Established.

And we Your Majesty's most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, crave leave upon this Occasion to assure Your Majesty, That we Unanimously resolve to Improve our utmost Endeavours for the Preservation of Your Royal and Sacred Person, in Your Lawful and Rightful Title, against all Infringers whatsoever, and particularly against the Pretended Prince of Wales, Unjustly Set-up by the French King, to disturb Your Majesty's Happy Government, and Destroy our Religion, Rights, and Liberties, which have been Your Majesty's Constant Care to Preserve and Maintain, even to the great Hazard of Your Sacred Person; which God long Preserve.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

The Humble Address of the Bayliff, Jurats, and Commonalty, of the Town and Corporation of Lydd in the County of Kent, in a General Assembly of the said Corporation.

When we reflect (Great Sir) on the many Hazards and Fatigues Your Majesty hath undergone for the Preservation of us, our Religion, Liberties, and Properties, 'tis impossible we can sufficiently signalize our Gratitude; and that we never intended in any Respect to recede from what we assured Your Majesty in our former Association; yet the Unparalleled Injustice and Affront done to Your Most Sacred Majesty by the French King, in Setting-up the Pretended Prince of Wales to be King of Your Majesty's most Rightful Dominions, contrary to all Fidelity and most Solemn Treaties, calls a-fresh to us to give Your Majesty new Assurances of our Loyalty: And we do therefore, in most humble manner, most heartily and sincerely assure Your Majesty, That it is not the Terror of the French Power, or any his Adherents, shall affrighten us from our bounden Duty, and sincere Allegiance to Your Majesty; but that we will, on all Occasions, to our utmost in every Respect, Assist, Support, and Defend Your Majesty's Person, Crown and Dignity, against all Opposers, Usurpers, and Infringers whatsoever. In Testimony whereof, we have caused the Common Seal of our said Corporation to be hereunto set this Eighth Day of October, in the Thirteenth Year of Your Majesty's Reign.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

We Your Majesty's most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Jurats, and Commonalty, of the Town and Borough of Deale; having a just and Dutiful Sense of the Blessings we enjoy under Your Majesty's happy Government, (which God long preserve) we cannot without the

greatest Abhorrence and Reformation take Notice of the Indignity intended by the French King, to be put upon Your Majesty and this Kingdom, by Setting-up the Pretended Prince of Wales (as his Instrument) to disturb Your Majesty's Lawful and Rightful Title to these Kingdoms, and destroy our Religion, Rights and Liberties, which hath ever been Your Majesty's Care to preserve; and in Defence thereof, (as in Duty bound) we Unanimously resolve to adventure our Lives, and all that is Dear to us, and particularly Your Majesty's Sacred Person, Crown and Dignity, in the Protestant Line, according to the Laws of this Realm, against all French or other Pretences whatsoever.

Dread Sovereign,

We Your Majesty's most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, Burgeses, and other the Gentlemen and Inhabitants of Your Majesty's ancient Borough of Kirkby Kendall in Your County of Westmerland; do with all humility crave leave gratefully to acknowledge the Preservation of our Established Religion, Laws and Liberties; so be (next under the Providence of Almighty God) entirely owing to Your Majesty's most Sacred Person; and do therefore hope, Your Majesty will be pleased to accept this Zealous Tender of our utmost Services in Defence of Your Royal Person and Government against all Opposers, and in particular against that Pretended Prince, who hath lately been in an Unprecedented Manner Set-up by the French King; assuring Your Majesty, That we will at all times be ready, with our Lives and Fortunes, to shew our selves Your Majesty's most Dutiful Subjects, in such Method as Your Majesty and Your Parliament shall think proper.

As also an Humble Address to His Majesty from George St. Lo Esq; and the rest of the Officers of His Majesty's Navy, and Yard of Plymouth.

Constantinople, Sept. 6. N. S. The Rebellion of the Arabs in Asia is now quite Suppressed; as is likewise that of the Tartars of Budziac; and the Tartar Han's Brother who was Author of the last, was brought Prisoner to Adrianople the 10th of the last Month, and condemn'd to perpetual Imprisonment in the Island of Rhodes. The Muscovite Ambassador had Audience of the Grand Signior the 9th, and will return home in a short time, with the Ratification of the Treaty of Peace he has Negotiated between the Czar his Master, and the Ottoman Port. Divers Armenians subject to the Grand Signior, having of late embraced the Popish Religion, the Grand Signior is so offended thereat, that he has ordered three of the Armenian Princes to be sent to the Gallies, who are said to have favoured the same; notwithstanding the French Ambassador made what Intercession he could for them; and Orders are given for taking up all Popish Missionaries, as Disturbers of the Publick Peace; The Patriarch of Armenia lying under the same suspicion, was seized the 9th past at Adrianople, and put in Chains; and 'tis said the Grand Signior intends to depose the Patriarch of Syria upon the same account. The Captain Bassa Mezzomorto died lately near the Island of Pario, where he lay at Anchor with the Turkish Fleet, and is succeeded in that Employment by Admiral Hassetagh. Ali Aga who was Kinja to the Grand-Vizier, was lately Disgraced, notwithstanding the Endeavours of the Mufti to support him in opposition to the Vizier, which has widened the Breach between those two Ministers; and Hassan Aga, a Creature of the Grand Vizier, succeeds in the Employment of Kinja with general satisfaction.

Riga, October 9. The Swedes began to bombard the Dunamunder Fort the 24th of the last month, and it's believed, the Saxon Garrison having no prospect of Relief, will soon be obliged to surrender.
