## The NORTH CHESHIRE &amp; DISTRICT GAS COMPANY.

Variation of Declared Calorific Value of Gas Supplied.

THE North Cheshire & District Gas Company whose principal office is situate at Raglan Street, Hyde, Cheshire, pursuant to the provisions of the Hyde Gas (Charges) Order, 1922, as varied and modified by the Gas Undertakings (Alteration of Calorific Value) Order, 1943, hereby give notice of their intention to vary as from the 6th day of April, 1946, the declared calorific value of all gas supplied by them in that part of their limits of supply specified hereunder from 480 British Thermal Units per cubic foot to 500 British Thermal Units per cubic foot.

Particulars of the part of the limits of supply above referred to.

The part of the limits of supply of the North Cheshire & District Gas Company affected by this notice comprises part of the Borough of Dukinfield, such part being bounded on its north, east and south sides by the existing municipal boundary of the said Borough of Dukinfield.

The northerly side commences at the junction of River Side and Park Road, and the southerly side terminates at the junction of Cheetham Hill Road and Birch Lane.

On the west side the line bounding the said part of the said Borough affected by this notice commences at the municipal boundary adjacent to the junction of River Side and Park Road aforesaid and then continues in a westerly direction along the north side of Park Road to the junction of that road and Crescent Road; thence in a southerly direction along the west side of Crescent Road to the junction of Chapel Street and Russell Street; thence along the west side of Russell Street to Pickford Lane. The boundary line on the west side then continues along the south side of Pickford Lane to the junction of Armadale Road and Town Lane from which junction it continues in a southerly direction along the west side of Armadale Road to Victoria Farm; thence in a direct line to a valve of the Company situate in the footpath opposite the premises Number 64, Dewsnap Lane. From this valve the said boundary line then continues along the north side of Dewsnap Lane to the junction of Dewsnap Lane and Birch Lane; thence in a southerly direction along the east side of Birch Lane to the point where such lane adjoins Cheetham Hill Road.
