PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

In pursuance of Section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, the Minister of Fuel and Power hereby gives notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, he has granted to the Anglo-American Oil Co. Ltd. of 6, Queen Anne's Gate, London, S.W.1, seven prospecting licences in respect of the areas referred to in the Schedule hereto, the boundaries of which are described by reference to the one-inch Ordnance Survey Map.

SCHEDULE.

- (1) An area of 186 square miles situate in the Counties of Wiltshire and Dorset.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at Chapmanslade the boundary proceeds in a north-easterly direction along road B3098 passing Westbury to its junction with road A360, about one mile west of Market Lavington.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence in a general southerly direction along road A360 to point 333 by Tilshead, continuing south-west over Breach Hill and through Chitterne to Codford St. Mary and road A36 which is followed eastward to its junction with road A303. The boundary then follows the road southwards through Chilmark and Tisbury to Ansty whence road A30 is followed to Whitesand Cross.

Southern Boundary.

From Whitesand Cross road A30 is followed in a western direction to Shaftesbury and from there road B3081 north-westwards to Gillingham.

Western Boundary.

From Gillingham the boundary proceeds in a general northerly direction coincident with road B3092 to the cross roads at Maiden Bradley, continuing through Horningsham to road A362, north-west to Lane End and then north-east to the starting point at Chapmanslade.

- (2) An area of 189 square miles situate in the County of Wiltshire.

Western Boundary.

Commencing at the junction of roads B3098 and A360 this boundary coincides with the eastern boundary of (1).

Southern Boundary.

From Whitesand Cross the boundary follows the road eastwards through Berwick St. John to Alvediston where the River Ebble forms the boundary as far as the bridge at Coombe Bissett and road A354 to the centre of Salisbury.

Eastern Boundary.

From Salisbury the direction is almost due north by road A345 to Rushall.

Northern Boundary.

This boundary proceeds in a westerly direction along roads A342 and B3098 passing Urchfont and Market Lavington to the point of departure.

- (3) An area of 181 square miles situate in the Counties of Wiltshire and Hampshire.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at Rushall the boundary runs in a general easterly direction along road A345 to Pewsey, road B3087 to Burbage and road A338 to Nags Head P.H.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence southwards by roads passing Tidcombe, Chute, Appleshaw, Thruxton, Grateley, Over Wallop and along road B3084 to Manor Fm., about 1 mile north of East Tytherley.

Southern Boundary.

The road boundary continues in a general westerly direction passing West Tytherley, West Dean, Manor Fm., and Whitehouse Fm. to the Southern Railway bridge about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile N.E. of Aldenbury. The boundary then coincides with the railway to Salisbury.

Western Boundary.

From Salisbury road A345 is followed in a northerly direction to the commencing point at Rushall.

- (4) An area of 186 square miles situate in the Counties of Wiltshire and Hampshire.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the Y roads by Tidcombe the road is followed in a north-easterly direction to Long Barrow for about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile; thence in a general south-

easterly direction passing Upton to Hurstbourne Tarrant and along road B3048 to Hurstbourne Station, Southern Railway. The boundary coincides with the railway as far as road B3051.

Eastern Boundary.

This boundary proceeds southward by way of road B3051 to the Southern Railway at The Scrubs, thence along the railway to Winchester.

Southern Boundary.

Continuing westward the Roman Road is followed through King's Somborne to its junction with road B3084.

Western Boundary.

Thence by road B3084 to Over Wallop, and northward along roads passing Grateley, Thruxton and Chute to the commencing point at Tidcombe.

- (5) An area of 194 square miles situate in the County of Hampshire.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the Southern Railway bridge over road B3051 about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north of Overton the boundary coincides with the railway eastwards to road B3400 which is followed to the cross roads at Worting, whence the railway line forms the boundary as far as Basingstoke and from there road A339 to Greywell.

Eastern Boundary.

Proceeding in a general south to south-westerly direction the boundary roads pass Long Sutton and Golden Pot, to Alton; then along road A32 to its junction with road A272.

Southern Boundary.

Thence along road A272 to the bridge over the Southern Railway in Winchester.

Western Boundary.

Turning northward the boundary is coincident with the railway to The Scrubs and with road B3051 to the point of departure north of Overton.

- (6) An area of 162 square miles situate in the Counties of Dorset, Wiltshire and Hampshire.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at Coombe Bissett road A354 is followed to Salisbury. From here the boundary coincides with the Southern Railway eastwards to a point about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile N.E. of Alderbury, thence along the road passing Whitehouse Fm., West Dean and West Tytherley to Manor Fm., north-eastward for about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles and eastward to Bossington House, south of Houghton.

Eastern Boundary.

The boundary proceeds in a southerly direction passing Pittlesworth Fm., and Mottisfont Abbey to Stonemars, whence the Southern Railway line is followed to the Southampton road south of Redbridge.

Southern Boundary.

From Redbridge in a general westerly direction the boundary is coincident with road A36 to Ower, road A31 to Wittensford, road B3078 to Fordingbridge, and the road passing Alderholt, Cranborne and Wimborne St. Giles to the road junction $\frac{1}{2}$ mile S.W. of Amen Corner, proceeding north-westward to the Roman Road by Gussage St. Michael.

Western Boundary.

This boundary runs in a north-easterly direction along the Roman Road, Ackling Duke and road A354 to Coombe Bissett.

- (7) An area of 148 square miles situate in the County of Hampshire.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the fork roads by Bossington House about one mile south of Houghton the boundary road passes the Mill Inn to Kings Somborne, thence along the Roman Road through Winchester, continuing along road A272 to its junction with road A32 by West Meon Hut.

Eastern Boundary.

This boundary proceeds in a general south-westerly direction along road A32 to Corhampton and road B3035 to its junction with road A334 about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile E. of Botley.

Southern Boundary.

From Botley the boundary continues eastward along road A334 and through Southampton to the Southern Railway line south of Redbridge.

Western Boundary.

The railway is followed in a northerly direction as far as Stoneyrmarsh, then the road passing Mottisfont Abbey and Pittlesworth Fm. to the commencing point.
