Alexander Smith FLETT, Esq., Second Officer, m.v. "Hopetarn" (Clive Shipping Company Limited).

The m.v. "Hopetarn" sailing alone, was torpedoed and extensively damaged. Two of her boats were successfully launched.

The Second Officer was taken on board the submarine and was subsequently interned for over two years in Japan. Mr. Flett displayed outstanding courage and devotion to duty in not disclosing to the enemy the presence of his senior officers in the lifeboat and thereby sacrificed his freedom.
