## RATES OF INTEREST ON LOCAL LOANS.

### NOTICE.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 7th June, 1946, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, the National Loans Act, 1939, and the Miscellaneous Financial Provisions Act, 1946, to the amount of £150,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 11th June, 1946, to Saturday, the 15th June, 1946, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

##### LAUNDRY WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Laundry Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for the revocation of Order W. (50) and W. #### WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1945.

##### RETAIL BOOKSELLING, NEWSAGENCY, STATIONERY, TOBACCO AND CONFECTIONERY TRADES COMMISSION OF INQUIRY.

Notice by the Commission of Inquiry appointed by the Minister of Labour and National Service to inquire into and report on the question whether a Wages Council should be established for certain workers and their employers.

The Minister of Labour and National Service, being of the opinion that the existing machinery for the effective regulation of the remuneration of the workers specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto is likely to cease to be adequate for that purpose and that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of the remuneration of the workers specified in Part II of the said Schedule and that a reasonable standard of remuneration amongst the workers aforesaid will not be maintained, has appointed the Retail Bookselling, Newsagency, Stationery, Tobacco and Confectionery Trades Commission of Inquiry in accordance with the Second Schedule to the Wages Councils Act, 1945, and has, under Section 3 of that Act, referred to the Commission for inquiry and report the question whether a Wages Council shall be established with respect to any of the workers specified in the Schedule to this notice and their employers;

In considering whether any machinery is or is likely to remain adequate for regulating the remuneration and conditions of employment for any workers the Commission is required by Section 4 of the Act to consider not only what matters are capable of being dealt with by that machinery, but also to what extent those matters are covered by agreements or awards arrived at or given thereunder, and to what extent the practice is or is likely to be, in accordance with those agreements or awards;

Under Section 4 of the Act it is the duty of the Commission to inquire into and report to the Minister on the said question, and to consider any other question or matter which in its opinion is relevant thereto, and in particular to consider whether there are any other workers (being workers who, in its opinion, are engaged in work which is complementary, subsidiary or closely allied to the work performed by the workers specified in the Schedule hereto or any of them) whose position should be dealt with together with that of the workers, or some of the workers specified in the Schedule hereto;

The Commission has formed the opinion that workers, other than craftsmen and productive workers, employed in undertakings in Scotland of the kind described in Part I of the Schedule to this Notice (which relates to England and Wales) are engaged in work which is closely allied to the work performed by the workers specified in that Part of that Schedule.

Accordingly the Commission hereby gives notice, pursuant to Section 9 of the Act, that it will consider representations with respect to any of the foregoing matters made to it in writing at the offices of the Commission at 1, Bryanston Square, London, W.1, on or before the 13th day of July, 1946.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

## TEMPORARY (RECONSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS FOR FILLING VACANCIES FOR PROBATIONARY ASSISTANT ENGINEERS (MALE) IN THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OF THE POST OFFICE.

1. In order to be eligible, a candidate must have been born on or after the 2nd March, 1915, and have attained the age of 20 by the 1st January of the year in which he competes.

Provided that the following allowances shall be made to certain classes of candidates who were born before the 2nd March, 1915:

(a) any candidate who served in the Royal Navy, the Army or the Royal Air Force before the 3rd September, 1939, will be eligible if born on or after a date which precedes the 2nd March, 1915, by a period equal to the length of such service;

(b) Assistant Traffic Superintendents in the Post Office who are otherwise eligible, or who after three years' approved service on traffic work receive a nomination by the Engineer-in-Chief, may be granted an extension of age in respect of the period of their employment on traffic work in the Post Office, up to a maximum of five years.

2. Every candidate must be either

(a) a natural-born British subject

(i) having at least one parent who is or was at the time of death a British subject; or

(ii) of any other parentage, provided that he has resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment; or

(b) a naturalized British subject who has resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment; or

(c) a British subject who, although not fulfilling the requirements of sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b), satisfies the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

3. Every candidate must have passed an examination qualifying for an Honours degree in Engineering or possess qualifications equivalent in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners; provided that

(a) in the case of a candidate who graduated in or after 1942 a War degree or Pass degree in Engineering will be accepted, if the University or other appropriate authority certifies that under normal conditions the candidate would have been expected to obtain an Honours degree;

(b) exceptionally a candidate may be admitted who possesses corresponding qualifications in

Physics or Chemistry or who is a Post Office Servant nominated on special grounds by the Postmaster General;

(c) a provisional application will be accepted from an intending candidate who expects to complete a course for an Honours degree or equivalent qualification in Engineering or Physics or Chemistry not later than 1st September, 1947, but such a candidate will not be eligible to compete and will not be required to pay an application fee until he notifies the Commissioners that he has obtained his Honours Degree or equivalent qualification.

4. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

The Commissioners reserve the right to give such preference to disabled persons or particular classes of disabled persons as may be necessary in order to give effect to any general policy regarding the employment of such persons which may be adopted by His Majesty's Government, provided that the disability is not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post.

5. No person who is undergoing a course of study with the aid of a grant from public funds shall be eligible to compete under these Regulations before the completion of the course, unless he has previously obtained permission to do so from the authority which administers the grant.

6. Every candidate must apply on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given by the Commissioners.

7. The Commissioners may summon to a preliminary informal interview and to an interview before a Selection Board the candidates who on their Application Forms and the resulting enquiries are found to be *prima facie* eligible, or may, at their discretion, summon only those who appear to possess the highest qualifications for appointment. The Selection Board will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment (subject to the terms of Regulation 8) the candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications. The Selection Board may also recommend that a certain number of candidates shall be classified as reserve candidates and considered by the Commissioners for appointment in conjunction with the results of a later Board. The decision of the Commissioners will be final. The Selection Board will take into consideration a candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by a candidate as having direct knowledge of his work, the candidate's scientific and technical ability as shown at the informal interview and his personal qualities as shown at both interviews, and on their estimation of the above evidence they will frame their decision.

8. It is the intention that of the total number of vacancies to be filled from the whole series of Selection Boards, Service candidates shall receive not less than two-fifths; provided that a sufficient number of Service candidates reach the required standard.

9. For the purposes of these Regulations candidates shall be regarded as Service candidates if they have rendered whole-time service during any period after the 25th May, 1939, in

(a) the Armed Forces of the Crown; or

(b) the Mercantile Marine or the Merchant Navy.

10. A list of successful candidates at each Selection Board shall be determined by the Commissioners having regard to the intention expressed in Regulation 8 and to the number and ability of the competitors.

11. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (that is, the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, or the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland, as the case may be) has been notified to the Commissioners.

12. Candidates shall pay a fee of 15s. on application. Every successful candidate will be required to pay a further fee of £2 5s. before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

13. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them on their application form, will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, in the Forces or otherwise.

14. These Regulations will come into force immediately and will apply to competitions for the situation of Probationary Assistant Engineer in the Engineering Department of the Post Office until the resumption of competitions for that situation under normal conditions.

The Civil Service Commissioners, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, announce the following amendment to the Temporary (Reconstruction) Regulations for filling vacancies in the Special Departmental Class, comprising the situations of

(a) ASSISTANT INSPECTOR OF TAXES IN THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

(b) DEPARTMENTAL CLASS OFFICER IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL SERVICE.

Regulation 11. Delete and substitute the following:—

"11.—(1) Candidates who reach the qualifying standard in the written examination will be summoned to appear before an Interviewing Board which will award each candidate a mark for his or her intelligence, personal qualities and record, provided that the Commissioners may hold the interviews at or about the same time as the written examination and may provisionally admit all the candidates to the interview reserving the right to disqualify any who fail to reach the qualifying standard in the written examination.

(2) The Interviewing Board may award different marks to the same candidate for different situations.

#### THE LONDON PASSENGER TRANSPORT BOARD.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Board intend to apply to the Minister of Transport to sanction a code of Byelaws as follows:—

BYELAWS AND REGULATIONS made under sections 108 and 109 of the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and section 7 of the Regulation of Railways Act, 1889, by the London Passenger Transport Board with the approval of the Minister of Transport for regulating the travelling upon and using and working of and for maintaining order in and upon their railways.

1. In these Byelaws and Regulations unless the context otherwise requires the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:—

"the Board" means the London Passenger Transport Board.

"railway" means and includes all and each of the railways, railway stations and approaches thereto and all and each of the works and premises belonging to or leased to the Board and used by the Board in connection with the said railways and with respect to which the Board have power to make regulations by Byelaws and also all and each of the railway works by the Board's special Acts authorised to be constructed from time to time.

"lift" except where inconsistent with the context includes any escalator or moving platform on the railway.

"vehicle" means and includes any carriage, compartment of a carriage or vehicle on the railway.

"authorised person" means any officer employee or agent of the Board on duty upon or in connection with the railway.

2. Any person offending against any of the following Byelaws numbered 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 19, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25 and 26 respectively shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding FORTY SHILLINGS for a first offence, and not exceeding FIVE POUNDS for any subsequent offence; and any person offending against either of the following Byelaws numbered 18 and 20 respectively shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding FIVE POUNDS. Any person offending against any of the following Byelaws numbered 3, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 15, 16, 19, 21, 24, 25 and 26 and failing to desist or quit, as the case may be, when requested so to do by an authorised person may be removed from the Railway or any part thereof by an authorised person without prejudice where any penalty is prescribed as aforesaid for the infraction of any such Byelaw to such penalty.

3. No person shall for the purpose of travelling pass any ticket barrier or enter any lift or vehicle unless and until he or she or someone on his or her behalf shall have obtained from the Board, or from an authorised person a ticket entitling him or her to travel on the Railway.

4. When the fare to an intermediate station exceeds the fare to a more distant station, no person shall, for the purpose of travelling to such intermediate station, take or use or attempt to use a ticket for the more distant station with intent to avoid payment of the additional fare to such intermediate station. The liability to or infliction of any penalty incurred by the infraction of this Byelaw shall not prejudice any right of the Board to treat such ticket as forfeited and to recover the full fare for the distance actually travelled by the offender.

5. No person shall alter, deface, mutilate or destroy, any ticket issued for the conveyance of any passenger, animal, or article on the Railway, with intent to enable the Board to be defrauded or prejudiced; or knowingly and wilfully use or attempt to use any ticket which shall have been in any respect materially altered, defaced or mutilated with intent to defraud or prejudice the Board.

6. No person shall sell or buy or attempt to sell or buy any ticket or transfer or receive any partly used ticket to or from any other person with intent that any person shall use the same for the purpose of travelling or conveyance upon the Railway, and no person shall knowingly and wilfully use or attempt to use any ticket which has been sold, bought, transferred or received in contravention of this Byelaw. Provided that the sale or attempted sale by or the purchase or attempted purchase from an authorised person or other person acting for or on behalf of the Board is excepted from the provisions of this Byelaw.

7. The Board may establish queues upon any part of any station upon the railway and at such station every person desirous of travelling shall, upon notice or request by the Board or an authorised person take up a position in the rear of one of such queues and approach the ticket office, lift or vehicle in an orderly and regular manner, and obey the reasonable instructions of any authorised person regulating such queues.

8. No person of the male sex above the age of twelve years shall travel or attempt to travel or remain in any vehicle marked or notified as being reserved or appropriated for the exclusive use of persons of the female sex.

9. No person shall enter or attempt to enter any lift or vehicle through any door thereof, until all persons who are leaving or are on the way to leave such lift or vehicle through such door shall have passed out of such door.

10. When a lift or vehicle contains the full number of passengers which it is constructed to carry, no additional person shall enter or remain therein if requested by an authorised person not to do so.

11. No person except an authorised person shall mount or attempt to mount on any vehicle except on such part or parts as are provided for the carriage of passengers.

12. No person, except an authorised person, shall open or attempt to open any gate or door of any lift-shaft, or any lift, or unfasten or tamper with any fastening or fitting on any such gate or door, or enter or leave, or attempt to enter or leave, any lift whilst it is in motion or otherwise than at the side appointed for passengers to enter or leave

the same, or ascend or descend, or attempt to ascend or descend, by means of any escalator except by the stairway thereof provided for ascending or descending passengers, as the case may be, or sit upon the stairway of any escalator, or tamper with any switch, lever, or other device operating or controlling any lift escalator or other mechanical appliance upon the Railway except (in cases of emergency) any switch or appliance upon or near which is displayed a notice that it is intended to be operated in cases of emergency.

13. No person, except an authorised person, shall open the door, or stand or attempt to stand on the step or foot-board of any vehicle whilst it is in motion or (except in case of accident or other emergency) between stations; or enter or leave or attempt to enter or leave any such vehicle whilst it is in motion or (except as aforesaid) between stations or otherwise than at the side of the vehicle adjoining the platform or place appointed for passengers to enter or leave the vehicle or (in the case of any vehicle equipped with automatic closing doors) attempt to enter or leave the vehicle after the doors have commenced to close and where in any such vehicle one door is indicated by notice for entrance thereto and another door for exit therefrom no person shall (except in case of accident or other emergency) enter or leave or attempt to enter or leave such vehicle except by the door indicated for entrance or exit respectively.

14. Except by permission in writing of an authorised person, no person suffering from any notifiable infectious disease as defined in the Public Health (London) Act, 1936, shall enter or remain and no person having the custody, charge, or care of any such person shall cause or permit such person to enter or remain in or upon any lift or vehicle or elsewhere upon the Railway, and the Board may refuse to receive or carry any such person, or to permit any such person to enter, remain, or be in or upon any lift or vehicle or elsewhere upon the Railway or to travel on the Railway. Any person suffering as aforesaid and any person having the custody, charge, or care of any such person may be removed from any such lift or vehicle or from the Railway, by, or under the direction of an authorised person.

15. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in or upon the Railway or any lift or vehicle and no person who is in an unfit or improper condition to travel by passenger train or whose dress or clothing is in a condition liable to soil or injure the linings or cushions of any carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, shall enter or remain in any lift or vehicle. Provided that no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on any lift or vehicle under the provisions of this Byelaw on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, when he so enters or remains in or on the lift or vehicle with the permission of an authorised person.

16. No person shall at any time while in or upon any lift or vehicle or elsewhere upon the Railway use any threatening, abusive, obscene, or offensive language to the annoyance or hindrance of any other person, or behave in a riotous, disorderly or offensive manner to the annoyance or hindrance of any other person, or write, draw, or affix any abusive, obscene, or offensive word, representation, or character, or wilfully soil or defile any lift or vehicle or other part of the Railway or molest or wilfully interfere with the comfort or convenience of any passenger or person on the Railway.

17. No person shall take or cause to be taken into, or cause or allow to remain in any lift or vehicle, if requested not to do so by an authorised person, any animal, article or thing which by reason of its nature, is in the opinion of such authorised person likely to cause or in fact does cause annoyance or damage to any passenger or damage to any property, and no person in charge of any animal shall permit such animal to stand, sit or walk on any escalator whilst such escalator is in motion in breach of a warning exhibited upon such escalator. If any person in charge of such animal, article, or thing fails, when requested by an authorised person, immediately to remove the same from the lift, escalator or vehicle, then the same may be removed therefrom by or under the direction of such authorised person, without prejudice to any penalty incurred by the infraction of this Byelaw.

18. No person shall take into, or take in or upon, or cause to be taken into or placed in or upon any lift or vehicle, or elsewhere upon the

Railway any loaded weapon of any kind, or any cinematograph film whatsoever, or any inflammable, explosive, or corrosive gas, spirit, liquid, substance or matter, or any article or thing which is or may become dangerous to any passenger or property. Provided that nothing in this Byelaw shall apply to (a) small quantities of spirit or liquid carried for the personal use of such person and not for the purpose of trade or business, provided that all due precautions are taken for the prevention of accident, or injury therefrom, (b) the carriage of explosives on that part of the Railway of the Board known as the Metropolitan Line which lies between Finchley Road Junction with the London Midland and Scottish Railway and Harrow South Junction with the London and North Eastern Railway in accordance with the Byelaws made by the Board and sanctioned by the Minister of Transport under and in pursuance of the Explosives Act, 1875, on the 22nd day of July, 1942. If any person offending against this Byelaw fails to remove from any lift or vehicle, or other part of the Railway immediately upon request by any servant or agent of the Board, any article or thing to which this Byelaw relates, the same may be removed therefrom by or under the direction of an authorised person without prejudice to any penalty incurred by the infraction of this Byelaw.

No person shall loiter or remain in or upon any lift or vehicle or elsewhere upon the Railway after having been requested by an authorised person to depart unless such person is lawfully entitled so to remain.

23. No person shall throw or wilfully drop on or from any lift or vehicle any article or thing whatsoever capable of injuring, damaging or endangering any person or property.

No driver, conductor, or person in charge of any omnibus, motor car, cab, carriage, wagon, bicycle, or other conveyance or of any animal in or upon the Railway shall leave or place any such conveyance or animal in or upon the Railway (otherwise than on a car park or other place expressly authorised by the Board)

(i) Unattended: or

(ii) For a period longer than necessary for such person to transact any lawful business upon the Railway: or

(iii) In any manner or place so as to cause an obstruction or hindrance to the Board or to persons using the Railway: or

(iv) Otherwise than in accordance with any reasonable direction of an authorised person.
