CHARGES CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE.

ADJUSTMENT OF FARES ON THE RAILWAYS AND ROAD SERVICES OF THE LONDON PASSENGER TRANSPORT BOARD.

The above Committee, appointed by the Minister of Transport, to advise him upon any reference to them as to the method to be adopted in adjusting the rates, fares and charges of all or any of the controlled Railway Companies and London Passenger Transport Board, having been requested by the Minister:—

(2) To hold a public inquiry and to hear thereat the representations of the Board and of any local authority or body representing the interests of passengers in the London Passenger Transport Area which may give notice of desire to be heard in such manner and within such time as the Committee may prescribe.

THE SCHEDULE.

PENICILLINUM.

(Penicil.)

Penicillin.

CAUTION.—In any part of the British Empire in which Penicillin is controlled by law, care must be taken that the provisions of such law are duly complied with. (See British Pharmacopoeia, 1932, page 12.)

Penicillin is the anti-infective acid, produced when *Penicillium notatum* or related organisms are grown under appropriate conditions on or in a suitable culture medium, converted into the sodium or calcium salt. Non-specific impurities are removed as completely as possible, and the purified penicillin salt is dried under conditions designed to ensure the sterility and stability of the final product.

Description.—When pure, Penicillin (Sodium Salt) is a white powder which may occur as granules or scales: it contains 1,666 Units in 1 milligram. Penicillin (Sodium Salt) and Penicillin (Calcium Salt) which have not been completely purified are pale yellow to light brown amorphous hygroscopic powders, containing not less than 300 Units per milligram.

Solubility.—Very soluble in water. Insoluble in fixed oils, and in liquid paraffin.

Sterility.—A solution in Sterilised Water, after the addition of a quantity of sterile penicillinase or other suitable inactivating agent adequate to ensure complete inactivation of the penicillin present, complies with the tests for sterility.

Undue Toxicity.—1,000 Units, dissolved in a volume of Sterilised Water or of Physiological Solution of Sodium Chloride not exceeding 0.5 millilitres, injected intravenously into each of five normal mice, each weighing approximately 20 grammes, does not cause the death of any of them within twenty-four hours: if one of the five mice dies the test is repeated and the sample complies with the test for freedom from undue toxicity if none of that second group of five mice dies within twenty-four hours.

Pyrogens.—Inject intravenously into each of three normal healthy rabbits, each weighing not less than 1.5 kilograms, a quantity containing not less than 2,000 Units per kilogram of the rabbit's weight, dissolved in not more than 5 millilitres of Sterilised Water or Physiological Solution of Sodium Chloride. Record the body temperature of the rabbits, either continuously from one hour before until three hours after the injection, or at least once during the hour before, and three times during the three hours after, the injection, one recording being made between seventy-five and ninety minutes after the injection; the average maximum rise in temperature of the three rabbits is not greater than 0.6°.

Assay.—Determine the potency by the biological assay of penicillin and express it in Units per milligram.

Storage.—Penicillin (Sodium Salt) and Penicillin (Calcium Salt) are dispensed in sealed containers, the materials of which do not affect the potency of penicillin; they are kept at as low a temperature as possible, not exceeding 10°.

Penicillin salts, especially the sodium salt, are hygroscopic and must be protected from the action of moist air.

Labelling.—The label on the container states (1) whether it is Penicillin (Sodium Salt) or Penicillin (Calcium Salt); (2) the total number of Units in the container; (3) the minimum number of Units per milligram of the Penicillin.

DOSES.

The dose is determined by the physician in accordance with the needs of the patient.

APPENDIX XV.

X. BIOLOGICAL ASSAY OF PENICILLIN.

CAUTION.—In any part of the British Empire in which Penicillin is controlled by law, care must be taken that the provisions of such law are duly complied with. (See British Pharmacopoeia, 1932, page 12.)

The potency of a sample of penicillin is determined by comparing the dose of it which inhibits the growth of a sensitive strain of staphylococcus with the dose of a standard preparation of penicillin which produces the same inhibition.

1. Standard Preparation of Penicillin.

The Standard Preparation for Great Britain and Northern Ireland is that defined in the Regulations made under the Therapeutic Substances Act, 1925. It is a quantity of dried penicillin (sodium salt) kept in the National Institute for Medical Research, Hampstead, London. The Standard Preparation for other parts of the British Empire is the same except for those countries in which a similar standard preparation, kept in a different institute, has been defined by law; in these countries the standard preparation, so defined, is used.

Since the amount of the Standard Preparation, which will be supplied on request, is limited each worker should prepare, for use as a laboratory standard preparation, a quantity of a suitable sample of penicillin and determine its potency in relation to the Standard Preparation.

2. The Unit of Penicillin.

The Unit for Great Britain and Northern Ireland is that defined in the Regulations made under the Therapeutic Substances Act, 1925. The Unit is the activity contained in such an amount of the Standard Preparation as may be indicated from time to time by the Medical Research Council as the quantity exactly equivalent to the unit accepted for international use. The Unit for other parts of the British Empire is the same, except for those countries in which a similar unit has been defined by law; in these countries the unit, so defined, is used.

3. Suggested Details of Methods.

A. The Cylinder-Plate Method.

In this method a suitable solid agar medium of simple composition, usually containing phosphate buffer, is used.

The principle of the method is based upon a comparison of the inhibition of the growth of bacteria produced by known quantities, or concentrations, of the Standard Preparation of Penicillin with that produced by measured quantities of the sample being tested.

Petri dishes, or rectangular trays, are filled to a depth of 3 to 5 millimetres with agar culture medium, which is previously or subsequently inoculated, in as uniform a manner as possible, with a suitable culture of *staphylococcus*.

The inoculated plates are placed in the incubator at 37° for about one hour in order to dry them, or to allow the agar medium conveying the inoculum to the plates to set and dry.

Small sterile cylinders, approximately 10 millimetres high and having an internal diameter of approximately 5 millimetres, made of glass, porcelain or aluminium and previously sterilised, are carefully placed on the surface of the inoculated medium. Four, six or eight cylinders may be placed on each Petri dish; a larger number can be used on the rectangular trays. In place of cylinders holes may be bored at suitably spaced intervals in the agar plates.

Solutions of the standard preparation of known concentration, as for example 0.5 to 2.0 Units per millilitre, or 0.25 to 2.5 Units per millilitre, and solutions of the sample being tested presumed to be of the same order of concentration, are prepared in phosphate buffer solution, pH 7. The solutions of the standard and of the sample being tested are filled into the cylinders which are preferably arranged on the plate in such a way that a direct comparison of zones of approximately equal inhibition can be made.

The plates are incubated at 37° for sixteen to twenty-four hours, and the diameter of the inhibition zones produced by the varying concentrations of the standard and of the sample being tested are measured with the greatest possible accuracy, and from the results the potency of the latter is calculated.

B. The Broth Dilution Method.

In this method a suitable liquid culture medium, containing peptone and muscle extract, is used.

The principle of the method is based on the comparison of the inhibition of the growth of staphylococci

due to known quantities, or concentrations, of the Standard Preparation of Penicillin with that produced by measured quantities of the sample being tested.

The culture medium used in the comparative tests must differentiate sharply between mixtures containing penicillin in amounts varying by not more than ten per cent. Media prepared by the enzyme digestion of horse muscle, and others consisting of solutions of suitable bacteriological peptones, muscle extractives and sodium chloride, have proved satisfactory.

Two series of tubes are prepared, each tube in each series containing either exactly 20 millilitres of medium or a measured quantity which can be adjusted to 20 millilitres by the addition of the solutions of penicillin being tested.

A solution of the Standard Preparation of Penicillin containing 5 units per millilitre and a solution of the sample being tested, expected to contain approximately 5 units per millilitre, are prepared in sterile phosphate buffer solution, pH 7. These primary solutions are then diluted in the liquid culture medium employed in the test so that 1 millilitre of these further dilutions contains an exactly known quantity of the Standard, such as 0.5 units per millilitre, and an approximately known, and equivalent, quantity of the sample being tested. Increasing quantities of these broth dilutions of the Standard Preparation, and of the sample being tested, are then added to the two series of tubes of culture media referred to above. When the potency of the sample being tested has been approximately determined, a suitable range of dilutions of the Standard Preparation and of the sample being tested for a more precise determination of potency is from 0.8 millilitres to 1.5 millilitres.

To each of the tubes in each series an inoculum of a suitable strain of *staphylococcus* is added, the quantity being small and as uniform in amount as practicable. The tubes are then shaken and, after incubation at 37° for 15 to 18 hours, they are examined, and, in each series, the tube which does not show any growth and the one adjacent to it showing small but definite evidence of growth are noted.

This examination may be made by eye, the evidence of minimal growth being provided by the presence of a slight deposit which rises when the tube is shaken; or the extent of the growth occurring in the two series may be estimated and recorded by means of a suitable photoelectric instrument.

From a comparison of the tubes in each series, particularly those exhibiting the first signs of visible growth, the potency of the sample under test is calculated; if the degrees of growth are not exactly concordant, readings may be interpolated and the potency calculated.

CREMOR PENICILLINI.

(Crem. Penicil.)

Cream of Penicillin.

Synonym.—Penicillin Cream.

CAUTION.—*In any part of the British Empire in which Cream of Penicillin is controlled by law, care must be taken that the provisions of such law are duly complied with. (See British Pharmacopoeia, 1932, page 12.)*

Penicillin (Sodium Salt) or Penicillin (Calcium Salt)—50,000 units.

Emulsifying Wax—7.0 grammes.

Hard Paraffin—5.0 grammes.

Liquid Paraffin—41.0 grammes.

Chlorocresol—0.1 gramme.

Distilled Water, previously boiled and cooled—47.0 millilitres.

Dissolve the Chlorocresol with the aid of gentle heat in the Distilled Water which has been previously boiled and cooled. Cool the solution to about 60°. Melt together the Emulsifying Wax, the Hard Paraffin and the Liquid Paraffin with the aid of gentle heat. Transfer to a suitable container and cool to about 60°. Dissolve the Penicillin (Sodium Salt) or Penicillin (Calcium Salt) in the Chlorocresol solution and add it to the warm basis in the container, close the container, shake vigorously for a few minutes and then cool rapidly.

Storage.—Cream of Penicillin should be freshly prepared as it loses potency on storage.

Emulsifying Wax is a mixture of higher fatty alcohols and the sodium alkyl sulphates obtained from them. It is obtainable in commerce under the Trade Mark "Lanette" Wax SX.

In preparing Cream of Penicillin the proportions of Hard Paraffin and Liquid Paraffin may be varied, and yellow Soft Paraffin may be substituted, in order to produce a Cream having suitable properties.

CREMOR PENICILLINI STERILISATUS.

(Crem. Penicil. Sterilisat.)

Sterilised Cream of Penicillin.

Synonym.—Sterilised Penicillin Cream.

CAUTION.—*In any part of the British Empire in which Sterilised Cream of Penicillin is controlled by law, care must be taken that the provisions of such law are duly complied with. (See British Pharmacopoeia, 1932, page 12.)*

Penicillin (Sodium Salt) or Penicillin (Calcium Salt)—50,000 units.

Emulsifying Wax—7.0 grammes.

Hard Paraffin—5.0 grammes.

Liquid Paraffin—41.0 grammes.

Sterilised Water—47.0 millilitres.

Melt together the Emulsifying Wax, the Hard Paraffin and the Liquid Paraffin with the aid of gentle heat. Transfer to a suitable container and add 37 millilitres of the Sterilised Water warmed to about 60°. Close the container and shake to emulsify. Place in an autoclave and heat to 115° for thirty minutes. Cool to about 60° and then add with aseptic precautions the Penicillin (Sodium Salt) or Penicillin (Calcium Salt) dissolved in 10 ml. of the Sterilised Water. Close the container, shake vigorously and cool rapidly.

Storage.—Sterilised Cream of Penicillin loses potency on storage and should be freshly prepared. The finally sealed containers are not opened until the preparation is required for use. It is dispensed in containers providing sufficient cream for one application only.

Emulsifying Wax is a mixture of higher fatty alcohols and the sodium alkyl sulphates obtained from them. It is obtainable in commerce under the Trade Mark, "Lanette" Wax S.X.

In preparing Sterilised Cream of Penicillin the proportions of Hard Paraffin and Liquid Paraffin may be varied, and Yellow Soft Paraffin may be substituted, in order to produce a Cream having suitable properties.

INJECTIO PENICILLINI.

(Inj. Penicil.)

Injection of Penicillin.

CAUTION.—*In any part of the British Empire in which Injection of Penicillin is controlled by law, care must be taken that the provisions of such law are duly complied with. (See British Pharmacopoeia, 1932, page 12.)*

Injection of Penicillin is a sterile solution of Penicillin (Sodium Salt) or Penicillin (Calcium Salt) in Physiological Solution of Sodium Chloride. It is prepared by dissolving the contents of a sealed container in the requisite amount of Physiological Solution of Sodium Chloride using aseptic technique. When several doses of Injection of Penicillin are dispensed in a single container the solution contains 0.1 per cent. of Chlorocresol.

Storage.—Injection of Penicillin should be used within seven days after preparation and should be kept during this period at a temperature not exceeding 4°.

When Injection of Penicillin is prescribed, no strength being stated, an Injection containing 20,000 Units per millilitre shall be dispensed or supplied.

In the preparation of Injection of Penicillin, Penicillin (Sodium Salt) or Penicillin (Calcium Salt) containing not less than 900 Units per milligram is used.

INJECTIO PENICILLINI OLEOSA.

(Inj. Penicil. Oleos.)

Oily Injection of Penicillin.

CAUTION.—*In any part of the British Empire in which Oily Injection of Penicillin is controlled by law, care must be taken that the provisions of such law are duly complied with. (See British Pharmacopoeia, 1932, page 12.)*

Penicillin (Calcium Salt)—12,500,000 Units.

White Beeswax—4.5 grammes.

Arachis Oil, sufficient to produce—100 millilitres.

Melt the White Beeswax in the Arachis Oil. Sterilise by heating at 150° for one hour; at the same time filter through coarse filter paper. Cool. Place the Penicillin (Calcium Salt) in a sterilised mortar,

and, using aseptic technique, triturate with a small quantity of the basis until smooth; then incorporate gradually the remainder of the basis. Distribute into sterilised containers and finally seal.

Storage.—Oily Injection of Penicillin should be stored in a cool place.

Labelling.—The label on the container states (1) the name of the injection; (2) the strength stated as the number of Units in a suitable dose-volume; (3) "For intramuscular use only."

Oily Injection of Penicillin should be warmed to blood heat for several minutes and well shaken, before injection.

In the preparation of Oily Injection of Penicillin, Penicillin (Calcium Salt) containing not less than 900 Units per milligram is used.

OCULENTUM PENICILLINI.

(Oculent. Penicil.)

Penicillin Ointment for the Eye.

CAUTION.—In any part of the British Empire in which Penicillin Ointment for the Eye is controlled by law, care must be taken that the provisions of such law are duly complied with. (See British Pharmacopoeia, 1932, page 12.)

Penicillin (Calcium Salt)—100,000 units.

Yellow Soft Paraffin—90 grammes.

Wool Fat—10 grammes.

Melt together the Yellow Soft Paraffin and the Wool Fat, filter while hot through coarse filter paper placed in a heated funnel, and sterilise the mixture by heating at 150° for one hour. Cool. Place the Penicillin (Calcium Salt) in a sterilised mortar and triturate with a small quantity of the basis until smooth; then incorporate gradually the remainder of the basis. Distribute into small sterile collapsible tubes and close.

Storage.—Penicillin Ointment for the Eye should be stored in a cool place.

TROCHISCUS PENICILLINI.

(Troch. Penicil.)

Lozenge of Penicillin.

Caution.—In any part of the British Empire in which lozenge of Penicillin is controlled by law, care must be taken that the provisions of such law are duly complied with. (See British Pharmacopoeia, 1932, page 12.)

Lozenge of Penicillin contains 500 units of Penicillin (Calcium Salt). It is prepared by the compression of a mixture of Penicillin (Calcium Salt) and previously prepared dry granules of sucrose or lactose, or a mixture of the two, and suitable binding agents. Each lozenge weighs about 1 gramme.

Storage.—Lozenges of Penicillin are packed in suitable air-tight containers and should be stored in a cool place.

UNGUENTUM PENICILLINI.

(Ung. Penicil.)

Ointment of Penicillin.

CAUTION.—In any part of the British Empire in which Ointment of Penicillin is controlled by law, care must be taken that the provisions of such law are duly complied with. (See British Pharmacopoeia, 1932, page 12.)

Penicillin (Calcium Salt)—50,000 units.

Ointment of Wool Alcohols—100 grammes.

Heat the Ointment of Wool Alcohols at 110° for one hour. Cool to room temperature. Triturate the Penicillin (Calcium Salt) with a portion of the Ointment of Wool Alcohols until smooth; gradually add the remainder, mixing thoroughly by trituration.

Storage.—Ointment of Penicillin should be kept in a well-closed container, protected from moisture, and stored in a cool place.
