

sation who have given information to the Council of the nature of the land in respect of which they are entitled to claim compensation and of their interest therein, and

(ii) that the lands will vest in the Council at the expiration of the period specified in such declaration.

Any objection to the Order must be made in writing stating the grounds of the objection, and addressed to the Minister of Town and Country Planning, 32, St. James's Square, London, S.W.1, before the sixth day of July 1946.

The Minister is not, in all cases, required to arrange for objections to be heard by a person appointed by him for that purpose. It is important, therefore, that an objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.

Any owner or occupier of any land to which the Order relates may send to the Council at the address below, a request in writing to serve him with a notice that the order has been confirmed, and naming a place where a copy of the Order and of the map and of any descriptive matter annexed thereto, may be seen. Such request should contain a statement of the name, postal address and the interest in the land of the owner or occupier and particulars sufficient to enable the local planning or highway authority to identify the extent and boundaries of the land.
