Notices of Dissolution of Partnerahip will not be inserted unless signed by the Partners named therein, or by their legal representatives; and the signature or representative charactor of the signatory must be verified by Statutory Decharation made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnenship not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statatory Decharation made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.

Advertisements parporting to be issued in parsuance of Statutes or under Orders of Court will not be inserted unless signed or attested by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

Advortisoments rolating to Bills before Parliament will not be inserted unless signed by a Parliamentary Agent or a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.
