## ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931.

Regulations made by the Architects Registration Council of the United Kingdom under Section 13 of the above-mentioned Act have been submitted for the approval of the Privy Council and are published herewith.

Representations by persons to whom the Regulations are applicable may be made in writing to the Privy Council Office on or before the 9th day of August, 1946.

## ARCHITECTS REGISTRATION COUNCIL OF THE UNITED KINGDOM.

### REGULATIONS MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 13 OF THE ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931, AMENDING THE EXISTING REGULATIONS.

*Delete Regulation 2 and substitute therefor the following:—*

"2. The Ordinary Meetings of the Council shall be held in the months of March, June, October, and December in every year on such dates and at such places and hours as may be fixed by the Council. The Annual Meeting of the Council shall be held in the month of March in every year and shall follow the Ordinary Meeting of the Council held in the same month."

*Delete Regulation 8 (1) and substitute therefor the following:—*

"8. (1) At the Annual Meeting of the Council held in the month of March in every year the members present shall elect a Chairman and a Vice-Chairman. At the Annual Meeting of the Council held in the month of March in every year the Council shall appoint the Board of Architectural Education and the Admission Committee in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 (1) of the principal Act and the Discipline Committee in accordance with Section 7 (2) of the principal Act."

*Delete Regulation 11 and substitute therefor the following:—*

"11. The Finance and General Purposes Committee shall consist of not less than fifteen and not more than twenty members. The said Committee shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting of the Council held in the month of March every year."

*Delete Regulation 44 (3) (d) and substitute therefor the following:—*

"44. (3). (d) An invitation to the addressee to sign and transmit to the Clerk at the office of the Council so as to be received by him not later than the ensuing 1st day of January (upon a form of nomination to be enclosed with the notice) nominations (to a number not exceeding the appropriate number) of registered persons for election as members of the Council for the year commencing at the close of the Ordinary Meeting to be held in the ensuing month of March together with a consent under the hand of every such nominee expressing his willingness (if elected) to serve as such member for the said period."

*Delete Regulation 44 (8) and substitute therefor the following:—*

"44. (8) At the Ordinary meeting of the Council held in the ensuing month of March the Chairman presiding thereat shall declare to be elected the candidates (not exceeding the appropriate number) for whom the highest number of votes have been ascertained (in the manner above provided) to have been given."

*Delete Regulation 44 (10) and substitute therefor the following:—*

"44. (10) The candidates elected shall be entitled to retain office as members of the Council until the close of the Ordinary meeting thereof to be held in the month of March in the year succeeding the year of the election."

*Delete Regulation 43 and substitute therefor:—*

"43. (a) The members to be elected under subparagraph (vii) of paragraph 1 of the First Schedule to the principal Act shall be registered persons elected in manner hereinafter provided, by unattached architects.

(b) Save as hereinafter provided, no person shall be eligible as a candidate for election unless he is nominated by not less than 12 unattached architects."

*Delete Regulation 44 (2) and substitute therefor the following:—*

"44. (2) The Clerk shall also ascertain which of the members of the Council elected under subparagraph (vii) of the First Schedule to the principal Act and holding office on the said 31st day of October are willing (if nominated and elected) to continue in office for a further year. Notwithstanding the provision with regard to nominations in paragraph (b) of Regulation 43, each of such persons may be nominated by one unattached architect only."

*After Regulation 44 (3) (d) add the following:—*

"(e) A statement that nominations must be received from not less than 12 unattached architects in respect of each candidate, except in the case of persons already serving on the Council as representatives of the unattached architects."

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 2nd August, 1946, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, the National Loans Act, 1939, and the Miscellaneous Financial Provisions Act, 1946, to the amount of £150,000,000.

(being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
