WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty, King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 26 duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of June 1946, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Norwich.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Percy Mark, now Bishop of Norwich, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £1,500 should be provided by way of advance from us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be repaid out of the emoluments of the Bishopric of Norwich:

"And whereas there is a balance of £600 outstanding in respect of a loan previously made by Queen Anne's Bounty under the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King George V in Council dated the 25th day of July 1934, and published in the London Gazette on the 27th day of July 1934, which balance it is expedient to incorporate in the advance by us hereinafter recommended:

"And whereas the whole sum of £2,100 does not exceed two years income of the See:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Norwich (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow and that we be authorised to advance and pay to him a sum of £2,100 and that the whole or any part or parts of the said sum of £2,100 so to be advanced shall be applied by us firstly in repaying the amount due to Queen Anne's Bounty in discharge of the principal outstanding in respect of the loan made by them hereinbefore referred to and secondly at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid, and that such sum of £2,100 shall be repaid with interest thereon as hereinafter mentioned, in the manner following, that is to say, during the period of thirty-two years from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, the said Bishop or his successors shall at the end of each year pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, one-thirtieth part of the said principal sum of £2,100 and shall also at the end of each year pay interest at the rate of 3 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid or alternatively it shall be permissible for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to provide for the repayment of the said sum of £2,100, and interest thereon or on outstanding balances as aforesaid by way of a yearly deduction during the said period of thirty-two years from the annual sum payable by us to the said Bishop of Norwich and his successors."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of July 1946 in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual rights of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cures (hereinafter called 'the said two benefices') of Morpeth and Ulgham both in the county of Northumberland and in the diocese of Newcastle.

"Whereas we are satisfied that George Gilbert Aime Murray, O.M., of Yatscombe, Boar's Hill, in the county of Oxford, Regius Professor of Greek, is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said two benefices in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said George Gilbert Aime Murray desires to transfer the advowson of the said two benefices to the Bishop of Newcastle for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Noel, Bishop of Newcastle, (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said two benefices shall be transferred to the said Noel, Bishop of Newcastle and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Newcastle for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.
