SUMMARY

WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1945.

BRUSH AND BROOM WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Brush and Broom Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) the revocation of Order M. (57) dated 5th May, 1945, and for the fixing of specified statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the minimum rates of wages at present in operation and (2) for the amendment of Order M. (52) dated 30th May, 1939, which deals with holidays with pay.

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within fourteen days from 20th August, 1946. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise grounds of their objections.
