PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 24th day of October, 1946, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of, and presentation to, the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Denaby Main in the county of York and in the diocese of Sheffield.

"Whereas we are satisfied that Frederick James Osbaldeston Montagu, of Breamore House, Breamore, in the county of Hants, Esquire; John Leslie, D.S.O., M.C., of 'Appletree' Cottage, Brancaster, King's Lynn, in the county of Norfolk, a Major (Retired) in Your Majesty's Army; Harold Peake, of Lound Hall, Tuxford, Newark, in the county of Nottingham, Air Commodore in Your Majesty's Royal Air Force; John Hillham Dunk, of Bryn Dom, Conisbrough, in the county of York, Esquire; and Leonard Cliff Hodges, of Grove House, Bromsberrow, Ledbury, in the county of Hereford, Esquire, as trustees of a certain Declaration of Trust dated the 14th day of May, 1900, are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant;

"And whereas the said Frederick James Osbaldeston Montagu, John Leslie, Harold Peake, John Hillham Dunk and Leonard Cliff Hodges, desire to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Sheffield for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order,

the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Sheffield for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.
