The Differences between the House of Sapieba and the Consederated Nobility of Lithuania, which have been the occasion of great Diforders in that Country, are at length brought to an Accommodation by the Commissioners appointed for that purpose, and the Articles were tigned the 18th Instant; By which, Prince Sapieba and his Family are restored to the full Enjoyment of all their Estates and Dignities. There is to be a General Amnesty and Oblivion of all Injuries done by either Party during these Troubles, only the Sieur Biozoo, who was chiestly concerned in the Murder of the young Prince Sapieba, is left to the ordinary course of Justine; And some Differences between the Houses of Sapieba and Radaziosi, about private Family Concerns, are reserved to Arbitration. The young Prince Sapieha, Son to the Great General of Lithuania, Swedish Forces near Dorpad on the Frontiers of Livonia, of an Engagement he had with above 60000 Mascovites, which happened in the manner tollowing. The 7th Intiant, the Major General being informed, that a numerous Army of Nussevites were marching towards Dorpad, he drew from their Quarters the Swedish Forces under his Command, who were searce got together when on the 9th, by break of day, they were attacked by the Enemy; The Fight was beguned 200 Swedes and 1500 Muscovites; the latter were soon put into disorder and bear back to their Army, which advancing in order of Battel, came up with the Body of Swedes, commanded by General Schlippenback, and surrounded them; The Swedes posted themselves in such manner, that they maintained their Ground against the Enemy on all sides, and thus they sought from 7 in the morning till 5 in the evening, when the Swedes with their Swords in their hands made their way through the Enemy, leaving 4 or 5 Field-pièces behind them; The Enemy followed the Swedes about a quarter of a League, but whenever they charged them, were so warmly received, that they quickly refired again. General Schlippenbach encamped about a League from the Place where they sought, and the next day taking a Review of his Troops, tound not above 500 blen milling, who were either killed or taken Prisoners; A Colonel, a Lieutenant Colonel, and two Captains, are among the number of the silin.
