A PROCLAMATION.

DETERMINING DESIGNS FOR CUPRO-NICKEL COINS
OF THE REALM.

G.R.I.

Whereas under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by Proclamation to determine the design for any coin:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable that the designs for cupro-nickel coins of the denominations mentioned in the Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1946, should be the same as those determined for the like silver denominations by Our Proclamation of the 18th March, 1937:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

The designs for the said cupro-nickel coins shall be as follows:—

(1) **HALF-CROWN**.—Every half-crown shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS VI D:G:BR: OMN:REX", and for the reverse the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a Shield having on each side the initial letter of Our Name in duplicate and interlaced surmounted by the Royal Crown, with the inscription "FID: DEF:IND:IMP" together with the words "HALF CROWN", and the date 1947, or of a succeeding year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(2) **FLORIN**.—Every florin shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the half-crown, and for the reverse a Rose, Thistle, and Shamrock surmounted by a Crown; and the letters "G" and "R" below; with the inscription "FID: DEF:IND:IMP" together with the words "TWO SHILLINGS" and the date 1947, or of a succeeding year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(3) **SHILLING**.—Every shilling shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the half-crown, and for the reverse either

(a) Our Royal Crest of England, or

(b) Our Royal Crest of Scotland,

with the inscription "FID: DEF:IND:IMP" together with the words "ONE SHILLING" and the date 1947, or of a succeeding year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(4) **SIXPENCE**.—Every sixpence shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the half-crown, and for the reverse the letters "GRI" surmounted by a Crown, with the inscription "FID: DEF:IND:IMP", together with the word "SIXPENCE" and the date 1947, or of a succeeding year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(5) **THREEPENCE**.—Every cupro-nickel threepence shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the half-crown and for the reverse the Shield of St. George superimposed upon a

Tudor Rose, with the inscription "FID: DEF: IND:IMP", together with the words "THREE-PENCE" and the date 1947, or of a succeeding year. The Coin shall have a plain edge.

This Proclamation shall come into force on this day.

A PROCLAMATION

Appointing Wednesday, the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, a Bank Holiday throughout England, Wales and Northern Ireland for the purposes of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas We consider it desirable that Wednesday, the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, shall be kept as a close holiday in all banks in England, Wales and Northern Ireland and shall, as regards bills of Exchange and promissory notes payable in England, Wales or Northern Ireland, be deemed to be a bank holiday for all the purposes of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section four of the said Act, We do by this Our Royal Proclamation, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, appoint the said first day of January to be observed as a bank holiday throughout England, Wales and Northern Ireland.

And we do declare that this Proclamation does not have the effect of making the said day a holiday under, or for the purposes of, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-ninth day of November in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six and in the Tenth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 2nd day of November, 1946 (C.W.75772/45), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person

being or having been an officer, seaman or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas a vacancy for the appointment of Keeper and Steward of the Royal Cabins in Your Majesty's Yachts has been caused by the retirement of Mr. Albert Skipworth, whose promotion and appointment to that post were approved by Your Majesty's Order in Council of 16th March, 1933:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the promotion of such candidates as may be selected from time to time to fill this post under the conditions laid down in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

"(a) The officer to serve under the conditions applicable to Warrant Officers.

"(b) In the event of the selection of a candidate for the appointment who is above the age for retirement of Warrant Officers, as may be in force from time to time, the candidate to be promoted to Warrant rank and placed on the Retired List on the following day. No bonus on full pay to be payable.

"(c) Payment of any pension awarded in respect of previous service as a rating to cease on appointment to the post.

"(d) Retired Pay on finally vacating the appointment to be on the scale and under the conditions laid down for permanent Warrant Officers, the whole of service in Warrant rank on the Active or Retired Lists during which bonus on pay is not drawn counting in full, and all service in man's rating from age 18 counting as one half, subject to the completion of not less than 15 years total officer service (including any rating's service reckonable as half); if less than 15 years such service have been completed on final retirement, the officer to be eligible for pension based on his total service on the rating's scale, service in this appointment counting for rank addition as service in Warrant rank. Retired pay to be payable on invaliding in accordance with the regulations applicable to permanent Warrant Officers.

"(e) The Officer's widow to be eligible for pension as for the widow of a Warrant Officer under the usual regulations."

HIS MAJESTY, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

AND the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas John Farr of Worksop Manor in the said county of Nottingham, Company Managing Director, and Arthur Jobling of Broadeaves, Newstead Abbey Park, Linby in the said county of Nottingham, Bank Manager are the Executors of the said Will who but for the hereinbefore recited devise would be the persons entitled to the said alternate right of patronage heretofore exercisable by the said late Lady Eveline Maude Robinson and they are desirous that anything which by way of further assurance or otherwise may be required effectually to carry out the devise may be done and application has been made to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners that a Scheme under the said Acts may be prepared for the said purpose and submitted to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the said John Farr and Arthur Jobling and the Right Reverend Frank Russell, Bishop of Southwell as Bishop of the diocese wherein the said benefice is situate and also in token of his willingness to accept the said devise, are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the share heretofore exercisable by the said late Lady Eveline Maude Robinson of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Frank Russell, Bishop of Southwell and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Southwell for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of October, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Laneast, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Clether both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Cornwall and in the Diocese of Truro:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Joseph Wellington, Bishop of Truro, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Laneast and Saint Clether duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Truro and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Truro signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices are now full, the Reverend Thomas Sidney Grosier being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Laneast and the Reverend Henry Johnson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Clether.

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Joseph Wellington, Bishop of Truro (testified by his signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Laneast and the said Benefice of Saint Clether shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Laneast with Saint Clether' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Trigg Major but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

" 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of Saint Clether only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Laneast and the then Incumbent of Saint Clether shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Laneast only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Saint Clether and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Saint Clether if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Laneast shall have been instituted to Laneast subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Laneast before that date and shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Laneast following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Saint Clether and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Clether shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Laneast shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of that one of the said two Benefices, the Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the other of the said two Benefices having the right upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

" And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

" And whereas an objection has been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to this objection have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Truro has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by Mr. W. R. Sandercock and Mrs. J. J. Yeo, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 12th day of February, 1941:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee having taken the said appeal into consideration, and the Appellants having intimated the withdrawal of the said appeal, Their Lordships reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be affirmed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by Order of the 29th day of October, 1946, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Truro.

968272 Flight Sergeant (now Warrant Officer) William George STATHAM, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 109 Squadron.

Flight Sergeant Statham was captured near Becherel in November, 1941, after baling out of his aircraft and was imprisoned in Stalags VIIIB and VIIIA. On one occasion he changed identities with a soldier and was sent to a detachment at Rettbach, from whence he escaped on 2nd June, 1942, but was recaptured the following evening. In September, 1942, he and a companion escaped from their work at Clewitz. When arrested at Kattowitz, however, they succeeded in convincing the police that they were Greek civilians and were allowed to proceed, only to be arrested near Cracow. During the next 2½ years Flight Sergeant Statham escaped on five occasions, his periods of liberty varying from a few hours to 6 days; twice he reached the Czech border. When the Germans were evacuating prisoners during the Allied advance, Flight Sergeant Statham escaped from the marching column and met American forces 12 days later.

TEMPORARY (RECONSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT KEEPERS IN THE PUBLIC RECORD OFFICE.

1. Competitions under these Regulations are open both to men and women.

2. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 on the 1st January of the year in which the competition is held, and must normally have been born on or after the 2nd August, 1914, but older candidates will be considered if they are exceptionally well qualified.

3. Every candidate must be either

(a) a natural-born British subject

(i) having at least one parent who is or was at the time of death a British subject; or

(ii) of any other parentage, provided that he or she has resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his or her appointment; or

(b) a naturalized British subject who has resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his or her appointment; or

(c) A British subject who, although not fulfilling the requirements of sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b), satisfies the Commissioners that he or she is so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his or her favour.

4. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The Civil Service Commissioners shall take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which it is desired to fill on any one occasion.

6. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Deputy Keeper of the Public Records, Public Record Office. The authorities of that Department will examine the candidates' credentials and will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment to the Civil Service Commissioners who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

7. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education and possess in particular such knowledge of Latin and French as to fit them for the post. Candidates should possess an University honours degree or other equivalent qualification in Classics, Law or History. The Commissioners may submit any or all of the candidates to a qualifying examination to test their education or any part of it.

8. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

9. Candidates who are recommended by the Public Record Office and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners shall be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who shall recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision shall be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the Public Record Office, who shall be represented on the Selection Board. The Selection Board shall take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at this interview; and on their estimation of the above evidence frame their decisions.

10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their Application Forms, will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, or otherwise.
