TEMPORARY (RECONSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS FOR FILLING VACANCIES IN THE GRADE OF INSPECTOR OF FACTORIES IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL SERVICE.

- 1. Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.
- 2. In order to be eligible, a candidate must have been born on or after the 2nd August, 1910, and have attained the age of 23 by the 1st January of the year in which he or she competes.

3. Every candidate must be either

(a) a natural-born British subject
(i) having at least one parent who is or was at the time of death a British subject; or

at the time of death a British subject; or

(ii) of any other parentage, provided that he
or she has resided in His Majesty's dominions
and/or been employed elsewhere in the service
of the Crown for at least five years out of the
last eight years preceding the date of his or
her appointment; or

(b) a naturalized British subject who has
saided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been

resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown

- for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his or her appointment; or (c) a British subject who, although not fulfilling the requirements of sub-paragraph (d) or sub-paragraph (b), satisfies the Commissioners that he or she is so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his or her favour.
- 4. (1) Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have such experience and have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in the opinion of the Commissioners fits them for the post. In general, candidates should either have post.
